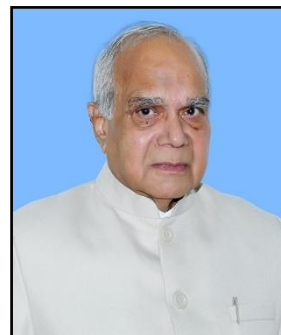



Organized in Faculties, Institutes, Centres, Constituent Colleges and several other academic and research units, GNDU conducts high-end academic and research activities in several areas, also including courses relevant in today's fast changing scenario in the realm of knowledge and societal needs. The university's research activity has maintained its impressive national and international profile. This is reflected in international university rankings, success in attracting international research funding, and many awards and honours recognizing the contributions of our academic staff. It is a matter of pride that the H-index has increased to 127 in 2022 from 64 in 2017.

Guru Nanak Dev University is taking swift steps to meet the challenges of higher education in modern times. Following unfaltering commitment to excellence, the university has marched on the route of advancement yielding rich academic dividends. Despite the challenges, it has been recognized as one of the leading institutions in India with the establishment of the first ever "MYAS-GNDU Centre for Sports Sciences" outside the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports. The departments of Sports Medicine and Life Sciences have been acknowledged as "Centre of Potential for Excellence in a Particular Area", and more than twenty departments of the university have received varied grants under CAS, SAP, DST-FIST, and PURSE. Also, the Swachh Campus Ranking of Higher Education Institutions ranks GNDU as the 2nd cleanest Government Residential Universities. Guru Nanak Dev University has bagged 44th rank in NIRF ranking-2022. It has been awarded "One District one Green Champion" by Mahatma Gandhi National Council of Rural Education (MGNCRE), Department of Higher Education, Ministry of Education, Government of India. Not only has GNDU bagged 7th position amongst the State Funded Universities at the national level according to a survey conducted by The Week-Hansa Research Survey, it has also ranked among top 10% universities of the World by Centre for World University Ranking (CWUR).

Throughout the year, the improved ranking of the institution at varied levels, implementation of student & employee beneficiary schemes, eco-friendly innovations, taking special measures to promote interdisciplinary studies, and disseminating advanced knowledge and scientific approach through MOOC courses etc. show that GNDU has evolved as an institution and stands strong as an emblem of higher education. More than 80% students have been placed successfully by 92 companies during 2020-22 and have also been placed at highest package of 44 Lacs per annum by Amazon and many other MNC's.

Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar was established in 1969 to commemorate the birth quincenarian of Sri Guru Nanak Dev Ji. Ever since its inception, the endeavor of the University has been to meet the objectives enshrined in GNDU Act, 1969, which laid emphasis on making provisions for imparting education and promoting research in the humanities, learned professions, sciences (especially of applied nature), technology and above all teachings of Sri Guru Nanak Dev Ji along with promotion of the Punjabi language and studies. In the following years, the University witnessed holistic and comprehensive development by expanding into newer and upcoming fields. It is heartening to note that the synergistic of all the stake holders of the University: academicians, employees, students etc. has contributed to the realization of the goals and expectation set forth in the Guru Nanak Dev University Act-1969. As a result of all these efforts, the UGC conferred upon this University the status of "University with potential for excellence" and recognized by NAAC (National Assessment and Accreditation Council) as A++ grade (highest level) and Category-1 University. The University has ranked among top ten "High Performing State Public Universities" across India by Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India. The University has also bagged 14th rank under India's best general government universities category as per "India Today Ranking-2022".

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PREFACE

Guru Nanak Dev University is a temple of knowledge (where visionary faculty and intellectuals offer their scholarly wisdom to the students). The main focus of the University is to promote excellence in education, research, sports, arts and culture in its pursuit to create most balanced human beings of the society.

During the current tenure, the Guru Nanak Dev University has attained many landmark achievements. The University's growth has been astonishing in terms of its research & academic infrastructure, departments, new courses, syllabi & programmes.

Under the able guidance of Vice Chancellor, Prof. Dr. Jaspal Singh Sandhu the University organized a large number of offline and online international and national conferences, seminars, symposiums and other academic functions successfully to enrich the academic world. The examinations of the students of all the subjects were conducted well in time with timely declaration of the results. The admission process was conducted online, with an increased number of student intake for most of the courses as compared to previous year.

Guru Nanak Dev University celebrated its 52nd Foundation Day with great enthusiasm at various venues in the University campus. Academicians, scholars, students and eminent personalities participated in these celebrations and had *Guru Ka Langar* together, arranged by the University. Folklore exhibitions, Painting exhibitions and book exhibitions were organized in front of Bhai Gurdas Library and in the Gallery-History & Dreams at the University campus. Dr. Karamjeet Singh, Vice Chancellor, Jagat Guru Nanak Dev University, Patiala and Prof. Raghuvendra Tanwar, Professor Emeritus (Modern History) Kurukshetra University & Director, Haryana Academy of History and Culture delivered academic lectures in the Guru Granth Sahib Auditorium of the University to mark this day.

Hon'ble Governor of Punjab and Chancellor of the University, Sh. Banwarilal Purohit participated and delivered convocation address online at the occasion of 47th Annual Convocation of the the University. On this occasion, S. Gurjit Singh Aujla, Member Parliament and Vice Chancellor Prof. Jaspal Singh Sandhu honored two eminent personalities, an Indian interventional cardiologist, medical administrator, writer, Dr. Tarlochan Singh Kler, Chairman Pushpawati Singhania Hospital & Research Institute and Former Director of Cardiac Sciences at Fortis Escorts Heart Institute and an Indian contemporary painter & graphic artist Ms. Arpana Caur were honoured with honoris causa degree of Doctor of Science- In the Faculty of Medical Sciences and Doctor of Philosophy - In the Faculty of Visual Arts & Performing Arts respectively. These two personalities were honored in recognition of their contribution in their respective fields. On this occasion 225 Ph.D, 7 M.Phil, 99 Post-Graduate and 64 Under-Graduate degrees were awarded to students from various faculties.



S. Kuldeep Singh Dhaliwal Hon'ble Cabinet Minister, Govt. of Punjab Inaugurated the Agri Innovation and Extension Centre at the University. This centre has been established as part of Centre for Agricultural Research and Innovation (CARI) under Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA-2.0).

The University upgraded its Bhai Gurdas Library with an automated and digitalized library system. This year, Vice Chancellor Prof. (Dr) Jaspal Singh Sandhu inaugurated the automation of Bhai Gurdas Library which included newly established Digital Lounge, RFID System and Seminar Hall. The library has been redesigned and restructured in terms of physical and structural changes to cater to the needs of the 21st century learners who are more into exploring the e-content like videos and audios.

A delegation led by Mr. Alexander Ellis, British High Commissioner to India visited the University. The High Commissioner addressed the students and faculty members of the University and sought ideas for the future UK and India collaboration. Like this, various academicians, Intellectuals, administrators and dignitaries of national and international repute visited the University.

During this tenure, in the various meetings of the Senate and Syndicate, various important and innovative decisions were taken in which allowing of Ph.D. by Publication besides Ph.D. by Monograph. This would enhance the Research achievements of the university by allowing students to publish their research while pursuing the Ph.Ds. Already the H-Index of the university has increased from 64 in 2017 to 113 in 2021 and now 125 in 2022 which is amongst the highest in the region. The increase in H-Index would help the university to garner more grant for research activities.

Guru Nanak Dev University has been encouraging students to take admission in different courses. International student cell has been playing a catalytic role offering admission to foreign students in various departments and trying to address the routine matters of foreign students. The international student cell has established a close liaison with ICCR and the study in India program and is facilitating the admission process. At present 54 students are studying at Guru Nanak Dev University campus in various departments. These students are from Bangladesh, Nigeria, Nepal, South Sudan, Afghanistan, South Africa, Tanzania, Sierra Leone, Tajikistan etc. countries. The courses which are in demand include Civil Engineering, Pharmaceutical Sciences, Microbiology, History, Computer Science, Computer Engineering, Molecular Biology; Biochemistry, University Business School (UBS), University School of Financial Studies (USFS) and Biotechnology. This year the University has received 1277 applications through ICCR for admission to different courses. The international student cell is trying to offer an international best ambience to these students to effectively integrate with our society.

This year, Chief Minister of Punjab (then), S. Charanjit Singh Channi inaugurated establishment of Five Chairs Dr. BR Ambedkar Chair, Sant Kabir Chair, Bhai Jiwan Singh / Bhai Jaita Ji Chair, Makhan Shah Lubana Chair & Bhagwan Valmiki Chair at the University.



Chief Minister of Punjab (Then) Captain Amarinder Singh inaugurated four projects - The Golden Jubilee Centre for Entrepreneurship & Innovation of about 3.5 crores; School of Education under PMMMNMTT Scheme of 6.10 crores; Department of Mass Communication of 2.45 crores and Department of Hotel Management & Tourism of 3.30 crores. He also laid the foundation stones of Shooting Range about 1.58 crores and New Sports Hostel for Boys & Girls of 12.42 crores. A special programme on launch of Sant Prem Singh Murale Wale Chair was organized in the Dasmesh Auditorium of the University by the CM. This tenure, Prof. Jaspal Singh Sandhu, Vice Chancellor inaugurated the first lift installed at a cost of Rs 33 lakh in the five-storey building of the Administrative Block of the University.

Guru Nanak Dev University signed various MoUs with prestigious institutions during this tenure. The University signed an Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Tir Memorial Trust to establish the Sardar Gurnam Singh Tir Centre on the premises of Bhai Gurdas library; with Goethe-Institut/Max Mueller Bhavan, a non-profit German cultural association operational worldwide to promote the German language, to increase the academic opportunities for students; with the IC-IMPACTS (the India-Canada Centre for Innovative Multidisciplinary Partnerships to Accelerate Community Transformation and Sustainability) Canada to recognising the mutual benefits to be gained through a cooperative programme promoting scholarly activities and international understanding; with Logistics Sector Skill Council (LSSC) established by Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship (MSDE) through National Skill Development Corporation of India (NSDC) to accelerate the creation of efficient Human Resources with knowledge, skill and aptitude; with the National Defence Academy, Pune for cadets who get boarded out midway of their three-year training at the National Defence Academy (NDA) can now continue studies without losing an academic year; with ICAR-Indian Institute of Maize Research for exchanging scientific information freely, forging cooperative research, hosting students and faculty, and sharing agricultural technology to promote the development and use of drought- and pest-resistant crops; with FUEL (Friends Union For Energizing Lives), a leading Non-Profit Organization working in collaboration with HDFC Bank for conducting job enhancement programmes for Engineering and Management students to impart learning about the latest and emerging technologies being used by the Industry as a part of academic curriculum taught to its students.

Among high ranking & ratings, this year Guru Nanak Dev University improved its position in the National Institute Ranking Frame (NIRF) - 2021 Rankings which were released by the Hon'ble Minister of Human Resource Development. As per the new ranking, the University emerged as a top higher education institution in Punjab and its neighboring states in the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) 2021. It up-scaled its ranking to 13th position in 2021 compared to 14th position in 2020 among the multi-speciality state universities of India. No other multi-Speciality State University of norther region, except University of Kashmir, has figured in first 55 positions in the country. Overall, it has stood at



53rd position among all the universities of the country. Among all the higher education institutions of India, the university has improved its overall ranking from 88 in 2020 to 85 in 2021. Contesting for the first time in the engineering discipline, it was ranked at 8th position among the multi-speciality universities of the country. State-of-the-art infrastructure, dedicated teaching-learning practices, curriculum enrichment, high employability, quality publications in highly cited national and international research journals were the key concerns to popularise GNDU's engineering education not only in India but across the world. High quality research in engineering and other disciplines improved the H-index of the university in 2021 from 64 to 115 with top 10 percent highly cited papers in Scopus.

This tenure, the University was placed at 19th Rank by AD (Alper-Doger) Scientific Index-2022 amongst 2146 Universities surveyed by them at National level. The University was indexed at 155th position out of 6569 Universities of Asia. At World level, the University was ranked at 824th position out of 14339 World Universities surveyed by Google Scholar. Ninety-One Scientists of the University was indexed in AD-Scientific Index-2022 from various fields which include Medical & Health Sciences, Natural Sciences, Engineering & Technology, Agriculture, Business Management, Economics, Education, Social Sciences etc. The index further covered sixteen Scientists of the University in the list of top 100,000 Scientists.

The University was adjudged for 'District Green Champion Award' 2021-22 in the list released by Mahatma Gandhi National Council of Rural Education (MGNCRE) for its exemplary work that has made a difference to the campus and its neighborhood. This included institutions from across India which have actively participated to keep their campuses clean and sanitized (Due to Covid). The University got this 'District Green Champion' Award by MGNCRE, Union Ministry of Education, under Swachhta Action Plan 2021-22. Mahatma Gandhi National Council of Rural Education (MGNCRE), Department of Higher Education, Ministry of Education, Government of India congratulated the Vice-Chancellor Prof. Jaspal Singh Sandhu for maintaining campus greenery, cleanliness, maintenance, toilet adequacy, tree planting and community outreach in promoting Swachh Culture in the Guru Nanak Dev University.

During this tenure, the University jumped three steps in its national position in the "India Today Ranking-2021". Overall, the University was ranked 17th among all public, central and state universities in the country. It upscaled its position from 20th rank in 2020 to 17th rank in 2021. However, it retained its position at 11th place among the state universities of India in 2020. It was adjudged at top positioned state government university in North India. No other higher education institute was bagged any rank among the 20 top positions in the states of Jammu and Kashmir, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Rajasthan or Chandigarh imparting quality education in arts, science and technology disciplines. The university improved its score in the parameters such as reputation & governance, academic & research



excellence, infrastructure & living experience, personality and leadership development, and career progression and placement.

The University was selected as one of the most innovative university among the World's Universities with Real Impact (WURI) for 2021 Rankings. Contesting for innovative programmes in the 'social responsibility, ethics, and integrity' category, it was awarded the 41st rank in Ethical Values. Overall, the university is placed at 101-200 among the World's Universities with Real Impact. The key innovative initiatives submitted for WURI included society oriented research centres under RUSA 02 programme; water treatment and harvesting, biogas, vermicomposting, and green campus initiatives; adopting colleges in remote and rural areas; adoption of villages for development; establishing students' clubs and science club; etc. University's participatory dialogue with society in order to promote sustainable development; supporting role in higher education in the urban and rural communities; pursuance for environmental excellence; practicing resource conservation to promote and improve the health of the community: performing community services through skill generation and up-scaling of the local manpower; conducting research addressing; and providing guidelines for the development and sustainability of society were some of the highlights mentioned to WURI.

The Youth Welfare Department organized various youth activities for students studying in different affiliated colleges, constituent colleges and the University Campuses at Amritsar, Jalandhar and Gurdaspur. Guru Nanak Dev University Zonal Youth Festivals were organized for the students of affiliated colleges/campuses of Amritsar, Gurdaspur, Pathankot, Tarn-Taran, Jalandhar, Kapurthala, NawanShahr districts and the Associate Institutes. Organized and participated in Inter-University North Zone and National Youth Leadership Training Camp sponsored by A.I.U. In sports, in this tenure, the University attained many positions in various Inter-Varsity and other games at National and International level. The University organized various Inter-Department, Inter-College and Inter-University championships in this year.

Directorate of Placement & Career Enhancement organized various campus recruitment programs and placement drives for placements in various institutions / organisations – both Govt. and Private having national / international reputation. Students of professional courses were helped to do their industrial training in multinational companies in India and abroad. Major Recruiters of the University are TCS, Capgemini, Amdocs, Accenture, KPMG, Nagarro, PwC, L & T Technology, Wipro, Amazon, Newgen, Zscaler, HDFC Bank, Bandhan Bank, Aakash Institute, HDFC Life, ICICI Securities, Gujarat Gas, Byju's, Walmart, ITC Food, Nestle, SBI Mutual Funds, Indiamart, Fidelity International and many more. Ministry of Labour & Employment, Govt. of India has sanctioned a Model Career Centre at GNDU, Amritsar in the Directorate of Placement & Career Enhancement to take care the need of skill development, career guidance and placement of students of this region. This department conducted 43 seminars and webinars by the industry experts for the



students of this university. These sessions were focused on skill development and career guidance of the students. The students also came to know latest trends of the industry. The students were personally guided on personality development, soft skills and resume building skills. Personality Development Seminars, Webinars, Workshops and Guest Lectures were organized to improve the performance of students in job market. Various MNCs visited the University during this tenure and selected 1063 students of the University.

Guru Nanak Dev University, with its commitment to achieve higher levels of excellence, has its roadmap ready for continuing as one of the best universities in the country. All these achievements has been possible with the innovative guidance of Vice Chancellor Prof. Jaspal Singh Sandhu, faculty members, students, researchers and administrative staff of our university.



ABOUT SRI AMRITSAR

Sri Amritsar was founded by Sri Guru Ramdass ji, the fourth guru of the Sikhs in about 1574 A.D. Before the city was founded, the area was covered with thick forests and had several lakes. To start the city the Guru invited 52 traders from different sectors belonging to nearby places like Patti and Kasur to settle here. These families started the first 32 shops in the city which still stand in the street called Batisi Hatta (32 shops). The Guru himself shifted to live among them in the city which came to be called Ramdasapur and has been eulogised in the Guru Granth Sahib.

Sri Amritsar, known for rich cultural heritage of four centuries, is living symbol of historical and religious traditions of Sikhs tangibly expressed through the divinely blessed shrines. Historically speaking, the fourth Guru, Guru Ram Das Ji built the *Sarovar* and laid the foundation of Amritsar, which became a sacred place for the pilgrimage of the community. The fifth Guru, Guru Arjan Dev Ji built Sri Harimandir Sahib in the centre of the *Sarovar* and the foundation was laid by *Sai Mian Mir*. Maharaja Ranjit Singh captured the city in 1805 and his first important act was to gild the whole structure of Sri Harimandir Sahib with gold. The city has been the center of activities for various historical events and freedom struggle in the last four centuries.

This city in north western India and the administrative headquarters of Amritsar district in the state of Punjab. The city lies about 25 km east of the border with Pakistan and is a major commercial, cultural, and transportation centre. It is also the centre of Sikhism and the site of the Sikh's principal place of worship for these too.

The early name of the city was Chak Guru. Before its establishment, the area under the city was a part of the vast area covered under Indus valley Civilization during the early period of history. A city of historic walls and impressive gateways, Amritsar gained importance under the reign of Maharaja Ranjit Singh, one of the most resplendent figures in Sikh history. The city lies on the Grand Trunk road, Asia's one of the oldest and longest major roads connecting Eastern & Western parts of Indian sub-continent, built by King Sher Shah Suri in year 1539.

The city of Amritsar a dazzling showcase of composite culture and secular heritage .It has a proud past a glorious present and a promising future .This most important city of Majha has rightly been called the mukut-mani (Jewel of the crown)of the Punjab. Amritsar is like a diamond with many facets. The essential spirit of the city is found not only in its gurudwaras & temples, mosques & churches, takias & khankahs but also in its theatres & galleries, parks & gardens, archives & libraries, art & architecture, museums & memorials, havelis & forts, fairs & festivals, vibrant folk dances & scintillating taans, narrow lanes & winding alleys, parlours & boutiques, clubs & pubs, traditional bustling markets & lip-smacking cuisine eatable like traditional Papad -Wadian, Soya-wadian and Aampapar. In addition, the city is



famous for its woollens, carpets and blankets, kites, juttis, cut-glass work, traditional jewelry and embroidered stuff.

In Amritsar, Sri Harimandir Sahib is not only a central religious place of the Sikhs, but also a symbol of human brotherhood and equality. Everybody, irrespective of cast, creed or race can seek spiritual solace and religious fulfilment without any hindrance. It also represents the distinct identity, glory and heritage of the Sikhs. To pen-down the philosophy, ideology, the inner and outer beauty, as well as the historical legacy of Sri Harimandir Sahib is a momentous task. It is a matter of experience rather than a description. In Sri Harimandir Sahib Parikarma, Akal Takht literally means Eternal Throne. The Akal Takht is situated on the other end of the causeway connected to Sri Harmandir Sahib. It's foundation was laid by Guru Hargobind Sahib. The building of the Akal Takht opposite the Sri Harmandir Sahib has a special meaning. While the Sri Harimandir stands for spiritual guidance the Akal Takht symbolizes the dispensing of justice and temporal activity. The Akal Takht is the oldest of the Five Takhts. Amritsar is a center of the raag-based rendering of Shabad (Bani of Sri Guru Granth Sahib). The shops of musical instruments are available around Town Hall, Jallianwala Bag and surrounded of Sri Darbar Sahib area. The city boasts of maximum production of Musical instruments.

After partition, Amritsar has become the gateway of India by land route from Central Asia, Afghanistan, Pakistan and other countries on the western side. With its glorious heritage, Amritsar is proudly holding its status of an internationally known city not only historically but also in context of social welfare, philanthropic activity and higher learning. Guru Nanak Dev University located here alongwith other institutes with other institutes carries a pleasant mélange of all that is worth.

Amritsar's international airport, Sri Guru Ramdass Ji International Airport, has more than 400 domestic and international flights during the week with daily connections to Chandigarh, Goa, Delhi, Mumbai, Pune, Bangalore, Hyderabad, Sri Hazoor Sahib, Patna Srinagar and Jammu etc. Amritsar is connected by rail to almost every major city in India. Amritsar railway station is the main terminus. The Samjhauta Express and Bus runs from Delhi through Amritsar to Lahore in Pakistan. Sri Darbar Sahib - Sri Harmandir Sahib, Ram Tirath, Jallianwala Bag, Durgiana Temple, Wagha Border, Partition Museum, War Museum, Gobindgarh Fort, Summer place of Maharaja Ranjit Singh, Pul Mouran, Khalsa College, Heritage Street, *ChaaliKhooh*, Heritage Village, Preet Nagar, Mata Mandir, Rani ka Bagh and other religious places and so many traditional and continental eating outlets make Amritsar a popular tourist destination in world.



ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY

With the glorious history of past fifty two years, Guru Nanak Dev University was established at Amritsar on November 24, 1969 to mark the Birth Quincentenary of Sri Guru Nanak Dev Ji, the apostle of universal brotherhood, truthfulness, non-violence, compassion, tolerance, harmony, humanity, strict observance of moral & ethical values in daily life, who is also revered as the founder of Sikhism. It won't be an exaggeration to state that His teachings and preaching & His own personal life are perfect examples to be emulated by the entire mankind even after about five and half a centuries and will remain so eternally.

Ever since its foundation the endeavour of the university has always been to meet the objectives enshrined in the Guru Nanak Dev University Act 1969, which emphasized that the new University would make provision for imparting education and promoting research in the humanities, learned professions, sciences, especially of applied nature and technology. Studies and research on the life and teachings of Guru Nanak Dev ji, in addition to working towards the promotion of Punjabi language and spreading education among educationally backward classes and communities are the other commitments.

In consonance with these expectations, the university in its eventful history of 52 years has taken long strides in spreading the message of Guru Nanak Dev ji and promoting education in such fields as Science, Arts, Management, Information Technology, Industrial Technology, Environment, Planning, Architecture, Hospitality, Agriculture, Mass Media. To fulfill its commitment, the tuition fee charged from the students of the departments of Guru Nanak Studies and the School of Punjabi Studies has been waived.

Guru Nanak Dev University is a pioneer State University with A++ status given to it by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC). It has been conferred with 'University with Potential for Excellence' and 'Category-I' status by the UGC, New Delhi.

The University has attained its all-time high National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) Ranking 2022 and has entered into elite club of top 50 Universities at national level. It is the only State Funded Public University of Northern Region (Jammu, Kashmir, Punjab, Haryana, Rajasthan and Himachal Pradesh) to figure among top 44 positions in India. Compared to previous year's NIRF ranking, GNDU has up-scaled its ranking by 9 positions in 2022. Overall, GNDU has bagged 14th position as State Funded Public Universities amongst all Universities in this category in India. It is ranked higher than the Jamia Hamdard University, University of Bombay, Tata Institute of Social Sciences, Bangalore University, University of Kashmir and Tezpur University amongst many others. It is the only Public University of Punjab to attain NIRF ranking in the band of 1 to 150. High quality academics and highly cited research of the faculty accounted as the prime factors besides prudent financial management behind the up-scaling of NIRF ranking to the current position. He said that the sincere efforts of the faculty of the University has earned name and



fame to the University in India and abroad. The quality research has improved the H-index of the University from 64 four years ago to 125 today. The University has performed exceedingly well in all the parameters set by NIRF for its ranking. The Vice Chancellor, while appreciating the efforts of faculty and staff, has expressed that the university will further improve its academics, research and outreach activities along with development of state-of-the-art infrastructure to achieve new heights in NIRF ranking in the times to come.

With the motto of the university as engraved on its emblem Guru's wisdom illumines all, the university has been leaving no stone unturned to meet the aspirations and expectations of the society. Spread over area of 500 acres towards the west of the city, Guru Nanak Dev University presents a picture of modern architecture. Traditional red brick geometrical blocks represent its regard for time-honoured values and commitment to scientific advancement. The University today boasts of 44 teaching departments at the Campus and 153 affiliated colleges, 17 Constituent & University Colleges and 47 Associate Institutes, many of which are located in the rural areas. The university has always strived hard to make the benefits of Higher Education accessible to the rural masses.

More than twenty thousand students, an overwhelming majority of them being women, are enrolled in various Departments at University Campus and Constituent Colleges. On-line admission, On-line counseling, On-line reevaluation, introduction of Credit Based Continuous Evaluation Grading System etc. are a few hallmarks of the university. All the results have been computerized and OMR (Optical Magnetic Recognition) system is being used to bring in more efficiency and transparency. This is the first University in the region to have computerized its examination and registration system. The students now have an all-time access to their results through SMS service.

Academically also, the university has carved a niche for itself in the field of Higher Education in the country. Our University is recognized as one of the leading institutions in North India in the domain of Science and Technology. Many coveted projects from the apex bodies like the DST, CSIR, BARC and other organizations worth crores of rupees have been awarded to our faculty members. One of the four Nodal Calibration Centres established by Bhabha Atomic Research Centre is set up at our campus. The Centre of Emerging Life Sciences equipped with the state-of-the-art scientific instruments worth crores of rupees, well-maintained Botanical Garden, Department of Sports Medicine & Physiotherapy are a few of the jewels in the crown of the university. To more strengthen the university infrastructure and to prepare students for employments, computer lab with the help of TCS is also established. Further, the UGC has granted the University the Centre with Potential for Excellence in Life Sciences and Centre for Advanced Study in Chemistry.

The university has been national Champion for 10 times & the winner of the North-Zone-Inter-Varsity Cultural Championship for 13 times. The winning of the coveted Maulana Abul Kalam Azad Trophy, the highest sports award for a university in the country,



for a record number of 23 times, speaks volumes about its supremacy in the field of sports. An Astro Turf for hockey, a swimming pool of international standards, a velodrome, a Gymnasium hall, shooting range & many other state-of-the art sports facilities are the prized possessions of the university. The Lifelong Learning Department of the university is successfully catering to the female folk of the region to make them self-dependent by offering various skill development programmes. University is committed to sustainable development as envisaged by Vice Chancellor with 100% reuse of treated wastewater, extensive tree plantation, electric buses for students and staff, rooftop solar harvesting are a few of initiatives. University is planning to install digital water monitoring at the Sewage Treatment Plant so as to optimize the water reuse.

University is making sincere efforts in meeting sustainable development goals by developing a toolkit of essential climate solutions. It has adopted several measures like - Ambient air quality monitoring (PM 2.5) during stubble burning in Punjab and Northern India in collaboration with Research Institute of Humanity & Nature, Kyoto, Japan; Real Time lightening detection for cloud to ground and in cloud strokes using GPS tracking in collaboration with Ministry of Earth Sciences - GOI; Decarbonisation, Carbon Capture & Sequestration by generating carbon sinks through massive plantation drives; To reduce Carbon Emissions, Broadband Infrastructure expanded and Electric Vehicles are in use; To reduce Carbon Footprint, Rooftop solar power panelling installed; Water Smart Institution with rain water harvesting, waste water treatment and recycling, zero waste water discharge; Solid waste management with vermin-composting, zero solid waste; To reduce energy consumption, digitalization has been accelerated; Sanitation drives have been accelerated under Swachh Bharat Abhiyaan; Driving Climate Smart Agriculture with sustainable technologies; Conservation of rare, endangered, threatened and herbal medicinal plant species in Green House, Conservatories, Fern House, Moss House, Shade House etc. in the Mata Kaulan Botanical Garden; Flower and Plants Show-cum-Seminar in the name of renowned Punjabi Poet Bhai Vir Singh is organized and Save the Planet Initiatives with Technology based energy solutions and innovations for Net Zero.

The Track record of employment of our students by big business Houses and Multi-National Companies has been very satisfactory. Our students of engineering, management and commerce field are employed by companies in India and abroad. They are all contributing to the creditworthiness of the University by their hard work and diligence. In the last year alone, almost all our Engineering and Management students were recruited by various companies through campus placements. It goes without saying that all these achievements would not have been achieved, but for the heart and soul put in by the students, faculty members, and administration of the university. 52nd FOUNDATION DAY

Guru Nanak Dev University celebrated 52nd Foundation Day with great enthusiasm at various venues in the University campus. Academicians, scholars, students and eminent personalities participated in these celebrations and had *Guru Ka Langar* together arranged by the University. Folklore exhibitions, Painting exhibitions and book exhibitions were organized in front of Bhai Gurdas Library and in the Gallery-History & Dreams at the University campus on November 24, 2021.

Dr. Karamjeet Singh, Vice Chancellor, Jagat Guru Nanak Dev University, Patiala and Prof. Raghuvendra Tanwar, Professor Emeritus (Modern History) Kurukshetra University & Director, Haryana Academy of History and Culture delivered academic lectures in the Guru Granth Sahib Auditorium of the University. While welcoming, Prof. Hardip Singh, Dean Academic Affairs presented the report of the development of the University since its inception. Prof. Anish Dua, Dean Student's Welfare conducted the proceedings. Prof. K.S. Kahlon, Registrar presented vote of thanks. Prof. Jaspal Singh Sandhu, Vice Chancellor honored guest speakers with mementos on behalf of the University. On this occasion a large number of dignitaries, employees and students were present.

Dr. Karamjit Singh in his academic lecture said that the philosophical aspects of Guru Nanak Bani and *Sakhis* could lead the world academics because these aspects have lots of possibilities to inculcate the challenges regarding academics. He said that dialogue tradition given by Guru Nanak Dev ji is pioneer of pattern of interfaith understanding. He was in continuous dialogue with people of other faiths. The *Siddh Gosht* is an example of such a dialogue that is enshrined in the Guru Granth Sahib.

While recitation of sakhi of Multan, he said that Guru Nanak Dev ji explained that the pot full of milk signified that there were many religious teachers in Multan and the sufis feared that adding one more would result in the displacement of another. But Guru ji wanted to tell them that he had no intention of displacing anyone; he only wanted to add the fragrance of his teachings. Just as jasmine brought fragrance to milk, he said that similarly Guru ji's teachings add to the teachings of the sufi saints. He said that the message was that there was always the scope for living in a multi-religious society and one needed to be open-minded to accept things.

He said that Guru Nanak Dev ji travelled to various religious places of diverse faiths with his Bhai Mardana. He said that the teachings of Guru Nanak Dev ji are relevant to whole humanity irrespective of caste, creed and religion. He said that today the need of hour is to interpret knowledge in the right direction for the benefit of all and not to mix knowledge with ego as both never exists together. He said that our education institutes while following the



path shown by Guru Nanak Dev ji should concentrate on wisdom, emotion and skills and show the right path to students to achieve their targets.

While delivering academic lecture on '*Jammu & Kashmir – 1947-1953 Key Issues & Contemporary Understanding*', Prof. Raghuvenra Tanwar said that The Princely state of Jammu & Kashmir was the largest among all such states in 1947, being located on the edge of the Indian sub-continent, it had borders with three countries. The state's populace was largely Muslim (above 77 per cent in 1947) but the ruling family was Hindu. Kashmir had for ages been a part of the composite Indian frame. A shared language, a shared history, shared customs, shared food, dress and art, music and culture. It was the Kingdom of the great Lalitaditya, the region where ancient Indian languages and scriptures flourished, the home of *Saivism* and the cradle of Hinduism and perhaps Buddhism as well. Could Kashmir be different just because at some time in its history people had converted or were forced to convert their faith. He said that history can't be separated from geography.

In the overall historical perspective and something that is commonly overlooked is also the fact that well before the region became the centre of contention between India and Pakistan, it had begun to draw the world's attention. Stories were published in various newspapers of 1946 & 1950. At the height of the cold war some even suggested the region's possible use as a launch pad for military action against the then USSR, he added.

He said that contemporary views recorded in whatever form – newspapers, reports, diaries or just simple notes, expressed as they are in the heat of the moment with natural spontaneity are more likely to contain hidden meaning and new light.

In the evening of that day, special Kirtan Darbar at the University Gurdwara Sahib was organized followed by Langer.

The department has established itself as nodal centre for contemporary research in the area of Optical Communication, Microwave Materials, Wireless and Data Communication, Nanomaterial applications in Electronics, VLSI and Molecular Electronics etc. The department boasts of well-developed research facilities for research in the field of optical communication. The department is contributing towards research in the field of fiber non-linearity control methods, gain flatness of optical fiber amplifiers, development of novel methods for optical switching and optical coupling. The current research is towards implementation of underwater optical communication and in visible light spectrum for applications such as secured military communication and radiation free communication in hospitals. Microwave ferrites and dielectric ceramics find applications in practical systems like radars, microwave absorbers, wireless communication systems, mobile base stations, satellite uplinks & broadcasting systems. Radar absorbing paints made from ferrites can be used to coat military aircraft for stealth operation. The department has state of the art facility to fabricate and characterize these materials especially at microwave frequencies in GHz range for such applications. The Carbon based molecular electronic components are being considered as alternative to conventional Silicon based electronic components. Atomistic modelling has been at the forefront of computational investigation of nanomaterials and has revealed a wealth of information on structure and properties of individual structural elements such as Nanowires, Nano films, Nano ribbons using Graphene, Fullerene, Carbon Nano Tube, Organic and Inorganic molecules as well as the characteristics of the interfacial regions and modification of the material properties at the nanoscale. The department feels proud to possess a dynamic and energetic faculty having a recognized research experience in their niche areas.

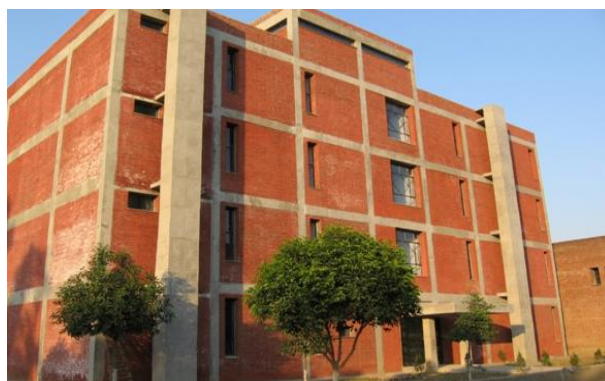

The shortage of faculty was compensated by the visits of the well-known and senior faculty members from other universities. This helped the Department to grow on a solid footing. The Department tried to conserve its research and intellectual base and took upon itself the responsibility of publishing its own journal,



namely *Guru Nanak Journal of Sociology* in 1980. The journal has helped the Department to establish its own academic network in the country. The second stage of the development of the Department was between 1986 and 1995. The faculty strength reached seven and diverse areas such as; Population Studies, Urban Studies, Sociology of Entrepreneurship and Sociology of Movements were the new areas of thrust. The Department has the distinction of organizing 5th and 15th Conferences of the North West Indian Sociological Association, 27th Conference of the Indian Sociological Association and one International Conference on Habitat Agenda. Faculty members of the Department have published 52 books and 390 research papers. The UGC identified the Department for a grant in the area of Sociology of Environment in 1995. The UGC also recognized it under the Special Assistance Programme (SAP) and the department has entered DRS level III and got a grant of Rs. 82 lakhs for five years (2014-19). During the past few years a shift in the thrust areas of the Department has taken place.

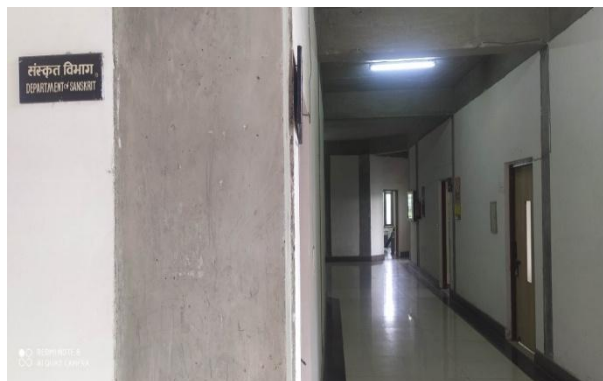

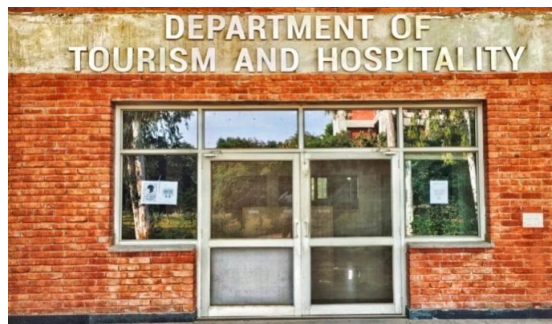

DETAILS OF DEPARTMENT REGIONAL CAMPUS

REGIONAL CAMPUS GURDASPUR

About the Department

Guru Nanak Dev University Regional Campus, Gurdaspur spread over an area of 28 acres, is located on Hardochanni Road in the lap of pristine nature which adds to the beauty and glory of the Institution. The campus was set up in the year 1999, to cater to the educational needs of the students of Punjab and neighboring states such as Himachal Pradesh, Haryana, Rajasthan and Jammu & Kashmir. Apart from the basic amenities, the Regional



Campus, Gurdaspur has a separate hostel facility for boys and girls with the capacity of 200 and 300 students respectively. The Hostels are well furnished and have facility for indoor games, Wi-Fi-Internet, common room and canteen etc. The regular placements of students from Regional Campus, Gurdaspur have been a distinguished achievement of the Campus. Further keeping pace with evolving cyber age, the University envisaged dedicated internet connectivity (20 Mbps) and four high end programming cum computing labs. There being a revolution in the telecommunication world, different advanced Computer and Electronics labs have been setup. Wi-Fi Internet connectivity is provided in the boys' and girls' hostels. All departments in the campus have been provided the internet connectivity. One Internet Lab is provided in the girls' hostel for working in evening hours. The campus also has 250 KVA generator to provide 24hrs electricity in the departments and hostels. The Campus is having well stocked library with a collection of more than 19000 books and a subscription of various national and international e-journals. Special book bank has been set up for students belonging to SC students. The campus also has an active Technical Student Society (TSS#) that organizes various technical and cultural events and workshops/ seminars/ conferences to enhance the technical and personality development skills of the students. It organizes an annual Tech Fest LAKSHYA 2K (Technical events) and URJA 2K (Sports activities) every year. The campus organized two national seminars in 2012, 2014 and a National Conference in 2017. The NSS unit of campus is also active in organizing various social activities like tree plantation, blood donation and awareness programs on gender sensitization, drug abuse problem, traffic rules & road safety, etc.

DEPARTMENT OF ENGINEERING AND TECHNOLOGY

The Department of Engineering and Technology was established in year 2002 with full-time 4-year B.Tech. (Electronics and Communication Engineering), B.Tech.(Computer Science and Engineering) and MCA (FYIC) degree programmes. In 2013, M. Tech.,(Computer



Science and Engineering) and M.Tech. (Electronics and Communication Engineering) courses were also started in the department. Further in 2021, two new programmes i.e. 3-year BCA and 4-year B.Tech. (Electronics and Computer Engineering) have been introduced. The department is catering to the needs of the students hailing from various parts of the country especially the backward and border areas of Punjab. The department imparts high quality education in Engineering and Technology to produce competent technical manpower to meet the ever growing demand of the global industrial sector and nurtures young minds to grow and excel in the technical world. Students are motivated to participate in the various activities like mock tests, group discussions, and seminars, workshops to improve their soft skills and enrich their personality. The syllabi of the various courses are regularly updated to keep pace with the latest development in the industry. The performance of the students is continuously evaluated according to Credit-Based Evaluation and Grading System.

It has highly qualified faculty members to educate the students theoretically and practically as per the industrial requirement. The faculty regularly attends various International/National Conferences/Symposia and Workshops to keep themselves updated with the emerging technological trends. The faculty of the Department undertakes an active interest in various research areas like Software Engineering, Computer Networks, Optimization Methods and Parallel Computing, Image Processing, Nano-Technology, Optical Communication and Networks etc.. Each member of the department bears a continuous responsibility to articulate, reinforce and reflect those values that support our highest aspiration.

Infrastructure

The department has well stocked air conditioned library having around 9,000 books, various Newspapers, Magazines and many other e- Journals for ready reference to the students. Also, the department is well-equipped with the advanced laboratories and research softwares such as NetLogo, MATLAB, OptiSystem, LabVIEW and CST-Studio. The department provides state-of-the-art computing facilities and has about 150 Intel 5th Generation computers having i5 processor, with latest software platforms like Windows 7/10, LINUX, UNIX etc. All the computers in the various labs /offices in the Department are connected via campus wide Local Area Network and WiFi facility is also available. The department provides Internet connectivity through 20Mbps leased line catering to the need of entire Campus. The department has 8 ICT enabled classrooms and 2 Seminar halls for lectures and other co-curricular activities. During the course, the students are given theoretical and hands-on training in Programming Techniques, Database Management System, Operating Systems and other Application Software. Database Lab with latest SQL Server and supporting application software like MS Access, SQL Server, Oracle 10g & 11g are used for software development. Programming Lab is used for programming with latest IDE installed in it front-end tools like C/C++, Java, VB.Net Developer 2015. Also, the department has well-furnished laboratories of Electronic Devices and Circuits, Communication Systems, Digital Electronics, Microcontroller, Microprocessors Microwave Engineering, Industrial Electronics etc.



The various laboratories of the department are as follows:

Programming Lab I : The Programming Lab-I is exclusively dedicated for teaching the basic programming techniques and its implementation to the students of B. Tech first year (CSE). The lab has 40 terminals with tool like C, C++, and Microsoft Office etc.

Programming Lab II: The Programming Lab II is dedicated for teaching advanced programming techniques and its implementation to the students of B. Tech (CSE) second and third year. The lab has 25 terminals with Microsoft Visual Studio, Net Beans and other web development tools.

Database Lab: The Database lab is dedicated for teaching various database management systems and its implementation to the students of B. Tech (CSE) second and third year. The lab has 25 terminals with Oracle, MySQL and other front end development tools like PHP and Microsoft Visual Studio.

Internet Lab: The Internet lab is common for all the students of the campus. It has 25 latest Computers with high speed leased line internet connectivity. All the students are free to use the facility for academic and research purposes.

Electronic Devices and Circuits Lab: This lab emphasis on practical aspect of basic electronics and its applications like various rectifier circuits, amplifiers circuits for e.g. Class A, Class B, Class C, Class AB, Push Pull, and transistor configuration such as common base, common emitter and also FET based circuits.

Communication System Lab: It imparts knowledge to the students on the concept of Analog and Digital communications through trainer Kit like AM, FM, PM pulse, ASK, FSK, PSK Modulator and Demodulator.

Digital Electronic Lab: This lab equips students with basic knowledge of digital electronics circuit such as various Digital Gates, Flip Flops, Registers, Counters, Multiplexers and De-Multiplexers, Timers, Encoder and Decode.

Analog Integrated Circuits Lab: In this lab students design the operational amplifiers and IC 555, 565, 566 based circuit for analyzing theirs the characteristics like gain, input impedance, output impedance, frequency, locking range, capture range measurements etc.

Microprocessor, Micro controller & Digital Signal Processing Lab: In this lab students learn about the programming concept of 8085, 8086 & Microcontroller from basic to various interfacing cards because these systems are building blocks for all the intelligent systems. Digital Signal processing lab helps the students to understand the concepts of various operations on different types of data, voice and video signals i.e., manipulation, processing and visualization.

Microwave Lab: This lab encourages the students to work towards the design and analysis of microwave circuits, and components such as antennas, phase shifters, attenuators, VSWR meter, directional coupler, klystron tube, filters etc. for RF, microwave, millimeter wave applications.

Electronic Measuring Instrument Lab: This Lab helps students to study various instruments like Shearing Bridge, Wheat-Stone Bridge, Anderson Bridge, Wein Bridge, Kelvin Double Bridge, CRO, Function Generator, L.V Power Supply for Kelvin Bridge etc.

Introduction of the College

Amardeep Singh Shergill Memorial College, Mukandpur (SBS Nagar) was taken over by Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar on July 4th, 2007 as a University College with the mission to provide quality education to the rural youth. Brief Introduction:

Being housed in the Emerging Life Sciences Block of the University, the Directorate of Research deals with matters relating to research activities in the University. It Includes, postgraduate research leading to M.Sc., M.Phil and Ph.D. degrees; submission of new research projects for extramural funding and development of national and international research collaborations. The Directorate deals with developing Memorandum of Understanding with other institutions, award of scholarship and memorial lectures etc. The office also looks after the rate contract with various firms for the purchase of equipments, chemicals, glassware etc. and assists the departments for the purchase of various scientific equipments. Directorate monitors the progress of the research activities under various programs like DST-PURSE scheme of Department of Science and Technology, New Delhi; “University with Potential for Excellence (UPE)” scheme of University Grants Commission. The Centralized Sophisticated Instruments facility created in the Emerging Life Science building is being maintained and regularized by this office. PhD Eligibility test is conducted by the Directorate for admission to Pre-PhD Course every year.

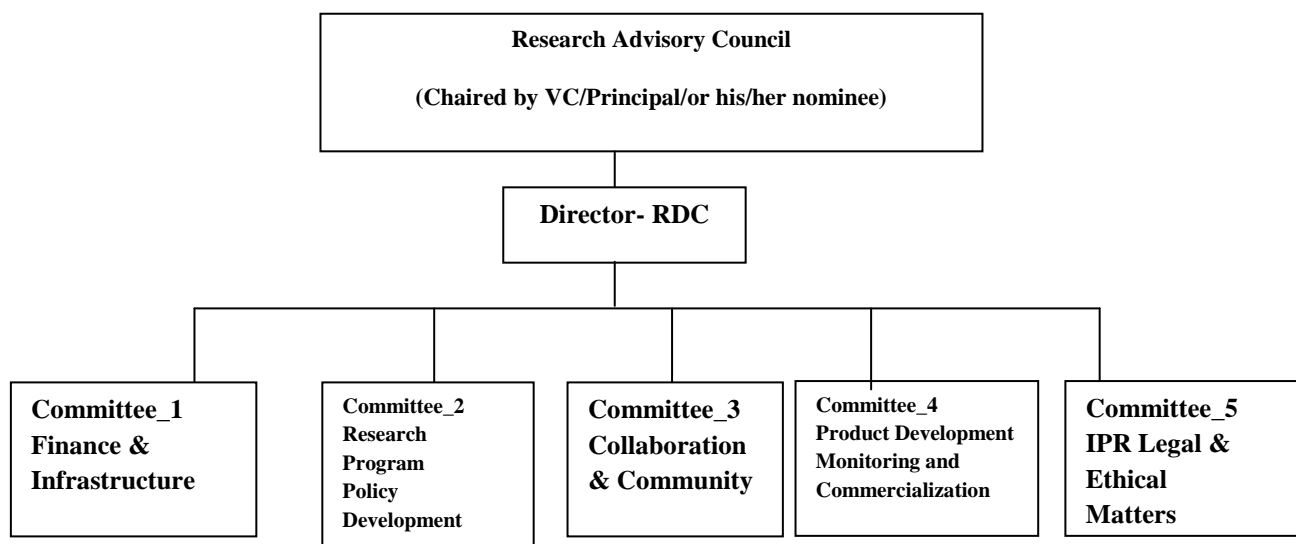

Open and Distance Learning reflects both the fact that all or most of the teaching is conducted by someone removed in time and space from the learner, and that the mission aims to include greater dimensions of openness and flexibility, whether in terms of access, curriculum or other elements of structure. Contributing to social and economic development, Open and Distance Learning is fast becoming an accepted and indispensable part of the mainstream educational systems.

Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar is accredited as A++ grade (highest level) by NAAC (as per modified criteria, notified on 27/07/2017), conferred 'University with Potential for Excellence' and 'Category-I University' by UGC, New Delhi

As per the UGC notification F. No. 1-8-2017 (CPP-II) "Categorization of Universities (Only) for Grant of Graded Autonomy Regulations, 2018" dated 12th Feb, 2018, Guru Nanak Dev University has been categorized as 'Category-I University'. Guru Nanak Dev University, being Category-I University, has been given the privilege to run Open & Distance Programme(s) without seeking the permissions from UGC as per below given notification:

4.10 "University may offer courses in the open and distance learning mode, without approval of the commission, provided it satisfies all the conditions laid down under UGC (Open and Distance Learning) and amendments from time to time."

All the courses under Category-I autonomy provisions are approved by UGC vide letter no. F. No. 74-2/2018 (DEB-I) dated 18/10/2018 and under this provision, with the permissions from Academic Council, Senate & Syndicate, Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar has established the Directorate of Open and Distance Learning in the main campus of GNDU, Amritsar. As per the provisions, new programmes under ODL mode have been introduced in the University, its Regional Campuses and its Colleges (Both University and Constituent) from Session 2018-19. Presently, the Directorate is offering 13 courses (Diploma in Computer Applications (DCA), B. Com., B.C.A., B. Lib., PG Diploma in Applied Nutrition (PGDAN), PG Diploma in Computer Applications (PGDCA), PG Diploma in Business Management (PGDBM), Post Graduate Diploma in Journalism & Mass Communication (PGDJMC), M.B.A., M.C.A., M. Com., M.A. (English), M.A. (Punjabi), in areas of Arts, Humanities, Business Management, Commerce, Computer Science and Sports Sciences. Directorate started its academic activity from session 2018-19 and in this session 2022-23 student count has increased to approx 1000.

Availability of Self Learning materials (SLMs) is the backbone of open and distance learning mode of education. Directorate has worked extensively in this area and presently having the



SLMs for almost for all subjects/courses. In the last two years, total 178 SLMs has been developed for different subjects for courses offered under ODL mode.

During the ongoing COVID 19 pandemic following practices has been developed and followed by Directorate to support the learner at their door steps

- Conduct of PCP classes in online mode
- Submission of the Internal Assignments in Online Mode.
- Submission of all documents in Online mode.
- Online Grievances Redressal System.
- Sending of hard copy of study materials to home/office address of learner
- Provision to provide Online Support / Counseling with dedicated Mobile Landline No.

Some Highlights/Milestones achieved by the Directorate during the Session 2021-22

To better facilitate the candidates, the Directorate has successfully conducted the Personal Contact Programme (PCP) classes in online mode during the Covid-19 pandemic

Centre for Internal Quality Assurance (CIQA) (dedicated to programmes being offered under ODL mode) was established and Directorate has successfully submitted the CIQA report to Distance Education Bureau, University Grants Commission, New Delhi.

In terms of infrastructure development, directorate has allocated the dedicated floor in old education block. In last session two dedicated computers labs and multimedia labs, store and office has been set up.

Established as Academic Staff College in the year 1988, rechristened as Human Resource Development Centre by the UGC w.e.f. February 1, 2015, it has traversed a long, arduous journey under the stewardship of eminent scholars, academicians pertaining to diverse disciplines & has already carved a niche for itself in the realms of Higher Education in the country. Successful completion of 113 Orientation Programmes, more than 229 Refresher Courses, more than 48 Short Terms Courses, in which teachers and Research Scholars pertaining to a wide spectrum of disciplines from various nooks and corners of the country participated, bears a testimony to its growing stature (approx. 12,000 participants). The NAAC team in the year 2012 ranked our ASC (now known as HRDC) 12th amongst the 66 in the country. The visiting team of the NAAC in November 2014 once again was highly impressed with our performance.

Fully conscious of the various aims & objectives of establishing these Centres, our HRDC leaves no stone unturned to meet the aspirations of the teachers. Keeping in view the heterogeneity of the participants for an Orientation Programme, the curriculum is designed to cover current burning social, political, economical, ethical issues like Gender Sensitization, Women Empowerment, Moral Values, Female Foeticide, Drug Addiction, Changing Educational scenario etc. in addition to the other diverse disciplines. Apart from erudite scholars, academicians, experts from the other walks of life, like renowned social workers, public administrators, bureaucrats, playwrights, etc. are brought face to face with the participants. Much emphasis is laid on honing the pedagogical skills of the young faculty members. In consonance with the rapid advancements in the field of information technology, the participants are imparted training in the optimum use of the ICT & other latest gadgets in the classroom teaching. So far as Refresher Courses are concerned, a Coordinator is appointed to look after the entire academic aspect of the course. The main motive of these Refresher Courses is to update the learned participants with the latest advancements in their respective discipline. All these courses including the Short Term Courses are intended to augment the existing knowledge of the learned teaching faculty/Research Scholars, in addition to enhance their pedagogical skills to raise the level of teaching in the institutes of higher education.

The academic administrators like Principals of the Colleges, Heads of the Departments are also brought together in the form of One-Day Meet, where the current issues pertaining to the Higher Education are discussed threadbare with the leading academicians. The HRDC has



also ventured into organizing Short Term Courses for the Non-Teaching Employees, who, needless to say, act as a backbone of an Institute of higher learning.

All these courses are conducted with the prior approval of the University Grants Commission, New Delhi and are fully financed by it. Due to the pandemic of COVID-19 all courses were undertaken in online mode as per the UGC guidelines. In addition to the Faculty Induction Programmes, Refresher Courses, Short Term Courses and workshops; webinars were also undertaken in online mode.

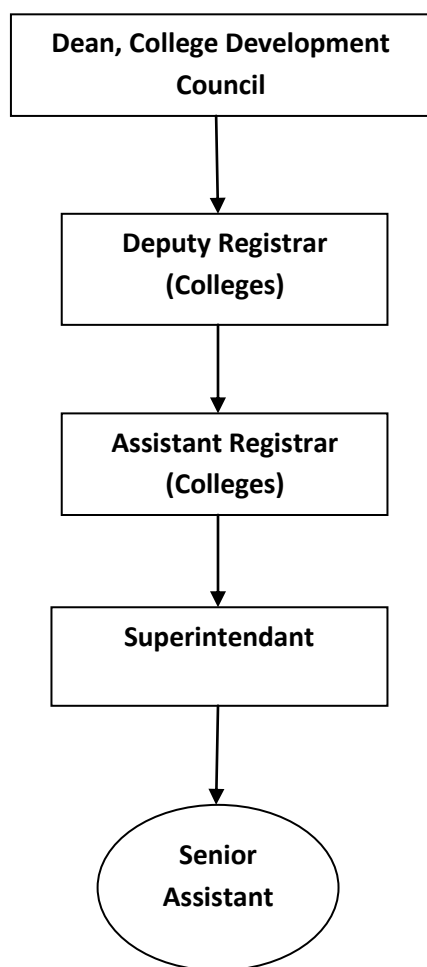

CENTRE FOR BASIC AND TRANSLATIONAL RESEARCH IN HEALTH SCIENCES

Established Under Component 4.0 RUSA 2.0 Scheme

The Centre for Basic and Translational Research in Health Sciences (CBTRHS) is established in the University in 2019 under Component 4.0 of RUSA 2.0 scheme with a budgetary provision of Rs. 10 Crore. Its main goal is to provide the necessary platform for converting fundamental research and concepts into useful practices in the field of health sciences. The foundational research and concepts in the field of health sciences can now be translated into practical applications due to the development of the Centre for "Basic and Translational Research in Health Sciences." Leading researchers from Guru Nanak Dev University working in various important fields of health science are also being brought together by the Center. By giving resources to researchers, employees, scholars, trainees and other stakeholders, it serves as a catalyst for advancing health science research. The Centre is also in process of developing a centralized facility in Emerging Life Science building to provide a centralized resource dedicated to facilitating biomedical research, promote multidisciplinary basic & translational research, and foster long term collaboration between clinicians & basic science researchers.

The major objectives of this Centre are

- i. To be a pioneer in improving clinical care and health by developing innovative strategies for prevention, early diagnosis and treatment of disease.
- ii. To find problem based solutions in the area of health sciences using modern technologies and multidimensional approach.
- iii. Address key challenges in the area of diagnostics, drug discovery, drug delivery and regulatory compliance.
- iv. Developing innovative, cost effective technologies to solve complex problems in the area of health sciences.
- v. To educate, mentor and train young investigators.
- vi. Knowledge generation and IPR protection.

Different activities undertaking in last one year

Since the last year, Centre has developed a centralized facility in Emerging Life Science building to provide resources dedicated to facilitating biomedical research, promote multidisciplinary basic & translational research, and foster long term collaboration between clinicians & basic science researchers. The basic infrastructure facilities have been built to cater the research needs of Ph.D. scholars from different departments of GNDU. The instrumentation is such that research scholars can have multifaceted approach to achieve their desired objectives. Different research training programs for students at all levels are arranged

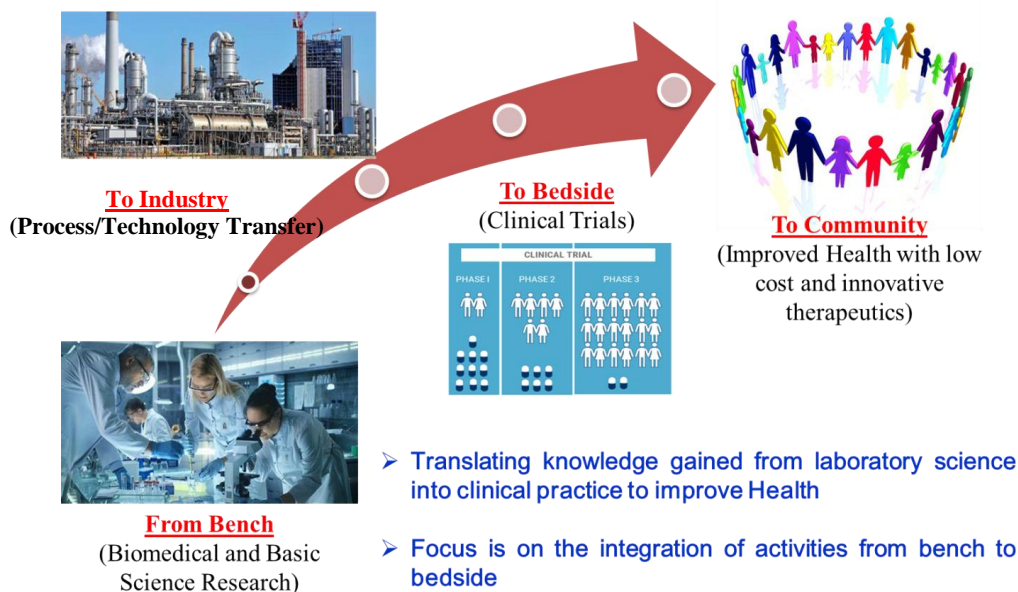
to provide the knowledge of a broad range of safety topics applicable to a biomedical research facility. The number of students trained here are around 120. Besides provision of basic instruments like hot air oven, BOD incubator, orbital shaker, refrigerator, deep freezer required at initial sample preparation and storage phases, sophisticated instrumentation (Multimode ELISA plate reader, Ultratome etc.) for further sample processing and analysis is also available. The numbers of samples from different institutes analyzed are around 322.

Centre has appointed two post doctorate fellows (PDFs) to do the advance research in following thrust areas as approved under RUSA DPR.

- I. Genetic disorders, Life Style disorders and infectious diseases
- II. Drug discovery and development (Natural and synthetic approach)
- III. Development of drug formulations, herbal formulations and their validation

In addition, advance research is going on in fifteen research projects sanctioned under this Centre to faculty members of ten different departments of the University (Botany, Biotechnology, Chemistry, Human Genetics, Microbiology, Molecular Biology & Biochemistry, MYAS-GNDU, Pharmaceutical Sciences, Drug & Pollution Testing Lab and Psychology) with grant in aid of Rs. 15 lakhs each (Total 2.23Cr). We have published 44 research articles in national and international journals of repute and filed 02 patents.

CENTRE FOR AGRICULTURAL RESEARCH AND INNOVATION (CARI)

The Centre for Agricultural Research and Innovation (CARI) has been established in the university with a vision to integrate research and outreach education in agriculture, food systems and the environment to establish ecologically and economically sustainable models of agriculture. The centre also aims to build a world-class ecosystem for promoting research and finding innovative and meaningful solutions in the field of agriculture for the benefit of society.

Recently, the centre is actively involved in developing agrotechnologies for the cultivation of highly valued non-traditional crops such as low-chilled apples, banana, saffron, and elite varieties of sweet potato enriched with beta carotene and anthocyanin at the experimental farm and their successful *in vitro* propagation protocols in the lab. The centre is also making sincere efforts to establish a synergistic relationship with various stakeholders like farmers, researchers, entrepreneurs and investors to create an ecosystem of entrepreneurship and innovation.



Saffron

1. Saffron is one of the costliest spices, traditionally grown in the Kashmir valley and part of Himachal Pradesh.
2. The lack of good quality, disease-free, flowering size saffron corm and their propagation techniques are the major bottleneck in saffron cultivation.
3. To enhance the production of saffron and its cultivation in non-traditional areas is a huge challenge. Through innovation-driven research, the centre is engaged in the propagation and cultivation of saffron

Low chilled apple cultivation at Agriculture farm GNDU

1. In order to broaden the crop diversity of the state, the centre is involved in the introduction of apple varieties suitable for the region
2. Screening of apple rootstocks and their performance, and developing appropriate agrotechnologies will be a major contribution to the successful cultivation of apples in non-traditional areas.
3. The centre is developing *in vitro* propagation protocols for mass multiplication of desired rootstocks of apple and agrotechnologies for the cultivation of low-chilled apple varieties

**Banana**

1. Banana is an important cash crop and plays a vital role in global food security.
2. The major constraint in the cultivation of banana is attributed to the lack of suitable planting material (sucker), its susceptibility to diseases and environmental conditions.
3. The centre aims at *in vitro* propagation of commercial banana and their establishment under field conditions

To promote skill education and training, from the current academic year, various new courses such as B.Sc. (Hons.) Dietetics and Nutrition, M.Sc. (Sports Nutrition), Bachelor in Management Studies (Agri Storage and Supply Chain) in collaboration with the Logistics Sector Skill Council (Govt. of India) and one year PG Diploma (Artificial Intelligence in Agriculture) have been introduced.

A state of the art infrastructure has been developed to support various courses offered by the centre. Eight labs have been completely furnished in the department of agriculture for teaching, training and research. An Agri Innovation and Extension Centre has also been set up by the centre to promote outreach activities and Agripreneurship.



CENTRE FOR SUSTAINABLE HABITAT

The Centre for Sustainable Habitat is established in the University in late 2018 under Rashtriya Uchchattar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA) 2.0 Component 4 with a budgetary provision of Rs. 10 Crore to propagate the agenda of sustainability in education, living and professional practice. It attempts to demonstrate coexistence of the natural and built environment in a way that reduces our planetary footprint, emissions, resource consumption and waste, and improves quality of life for all. This is done by integrating multi-faceted ecological, social, economic and cultural perspectives together and translating into applied sciences, technology and most importantly behaviour. The Centre specializes in research towards comprehensive understanding of environmental issues facing, but not limited to, the country. The Centre has come up in line with the Sustainable Development Goals purposed by United Nations for Quality Education, Clean Water and Sanitation, Affordable and Green Energy, Sustainable Cities and Communities and Climate Actions. The Centre's research and conduct interests are formed by four interconnected pillars i.e. Sustainable Urbanism, Resilient Natural Systems, Green Enovation Systems and Community for Sustainability. For the same, the Centre has identified six tracks viz Sustainable Habitat, Transportation Planning, Water Management, Sanitation and Septage, Waste Management and Green Energy. Inter-disciplinary teaching, research and training in the above mentioned tracks will address the key challenges of sustainable habitat, environment and ecology, social economic characteristics to help in formulating workable, achievable and rational planning and management policies and strategies at the local and regional levels. The Centre's resources provide ample opportunities for hands-on learning through research and training programmes. The Centre intends to introduce Certificate/Diploma/Degree/Doctoral Degree/Post-Doctoral, Faculty Development and outreach programmes in the times to come. The state-of-art centralized design, transport, water and air and noise pollution labs are in the process of establishment for the conduct of the Centre Core Committee has been constituted by the University to prepare action plans for various activities of the Centre. Also, a Steering Committee comprising of experts from a research and professional institutes is constituted to advise on different matters concerning the Centre. A Project Review Committee comprising of experts from academic, research and professional training institute is constituted by the University to review the research conducted under the projects of the Centre. The Centre has initiated possible collaborations for research and capacity enhancement with the National and International organizations. The Center has signed MoU's with Centre for Science and Environment, New Delhi; Cities Forum, London; National Highway Authority of India, New Delhi to undertake collaborative research and capacity building training programmes. In this endeavour the Centre had awarded 11 research projects to the Faculty of the University addressing the water, sanitation, environmental pollution, and energy challenges faced by the urban and rural settlements of Punjab. The research projects aim at analysing and identifying the impacts of these challenges on the health and liveability conditions of the inhabitants of the settlements. The projects have been completed by the faculty and their reports are submitted to the Centre. Three Post-Doctoral Fellows are recruited to conduct research on aspects related to the mandate of the Centre.

This was primarily with the intent to take research from margins to mainstream and carve an enviable niche in the research society. The Centre remains committed to its edifying goals and has been working to provide every possible assistance to the researchers of the region- from within and beyond the university and instil a creative and constructive research spirit and provide a strong foothold to the researchers for a rewarding and satisfying experience. The following are the specific activities undertaken by centre during the academic year:

1. **Access to comprehensive and competitive databases:** In the light of the indispensability of data and its paramount importance in research work, CDAR has made available the comprehensive and most accessed database for researchers in field of social sciences. ACE Equity is a corporate database of listed and unlisted companies with their financial and non-financial information kept updated every day through internet. The database involves extensive data coverage at company, industry, business house level for satiating the intense data requirements of researchers. CDAR has yet again made available this database (another year) and also provides assistance to researchers in retrieving the data from this extensive database. In addition, CDAR also obtained licensed access of ProwessIQ, which is a powerful internet-based application for querying CMIE's database on performances of listed and unlisted companies. ProwessIQ provides charting tools and well-formatted reports on performances of companies. The reports provide financial information including analytical ratios and benchmark comparisons. Access is ensured for all users (upto 65,000 researchers can register) in the campus making access available through their own systems and accessing data through interactive query builders.

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2. **Guidance and solutions for researchers:** CDAR has espoused itself to the cause and service researchers from university and outside and provides assistance to students, faculty and scholars on issues which may hamper their research journey. The Centre and its committed staff offers services relating to various facets of research ranging from accessing the literature, data collection, data cleaning and most importantly in analysing the data in the best and methodologically sound manner. Following research scholars were successfully guided by the centre.

3. **Promoting use of OpenSource Software:** In the current times of influx of voluminous data the statistical analysis has assumed added significance and analytical processes need to be scientific yet comprehensive. In the face of indispensability of statistical operations and very highly priced data analysis software which prove a drain on financial resources CDAR is attempting to create a culture of opensource software. Centre has shouldered the responsibility of sensitising the researchers about the efficacy and eminence of opensource software, creating awareness about these software and underlying ethical considerations, sharing links for accessing these software and making the users familiar to these software. The centre is trying to create a culture of making open source software a part of research analysis and has been promoting use of software like R, R studio, R Commander, Jamovi, Gretl, Bluesky, Jasp etc.

4. **Instrument validation and scientific research work:** CDAR has committed itself to assisting researchers and provide solutions to the minor and major hiccups faced in their research journey. To enhance the quality of research work and ensure no compromise at any stage, the MYAS Department of the university has made it mandatory for the students of project work to get their data collection instruments validated before data collection. This involves guidance of students in construction of data collection instrument (questionnaire/interview schedule etc.) and documented visits to centre together with written approval from the Director, CDAR of the instrument validation. Formal documents for appointment proforma, sequential visits, suggestions for improvement and final validation of instrument have all been approved and put in place with an intent to have a directed research journey.

University Library was established in March 1970. In 1979, it was shifted to the present building of five storeyed, inverted pyramid shaped magnificent building, directly visible from the main gate of the University on the Grand Trunk Road. It is centrally located with teaching departments all around. University Library has been named after the great Sikh Scholar BhaiGurdas and is popularly known as BhaiGurdas Library. BhaiGurdas had a rare privilege of taking dictation from the fifth Sikh Guru, Guru ArjanDevJi for the compilation of the holy scripture of the Sikhs, the AdiGranth.

The library remains open on all days of the year except on two National Holidays i.e. 26th January, and 15th August.

Periodical Section

For the academic year 2021-2022 library has subscribed 189 printed research journals (65 Foreign Journals and 124 Indian journals). "IEEE ASPP+POP" Online database has been subscribed by the library. Through this database university is getting access to 190 IEEE online journals + 5 lacs articles of various Conference Proceedings related to Electronics Technology Department, Computer Science Department & Computer Engineering Department. Bibliographic online databases "SCOPUS" & "SciFinder" have also been subscribed by the library. 2200 E-journals of various publishers such as Elsevier, Wiley & Royal Society of Chemistry have been subscribed by the library. Online access to 7032 Journals, Bibliographic Databases and some other databases are available through E-ShodhSindhu. In addition to this 129 backsets of Journals were also processed. Electronic journals and databases also can be accessed from this section and students are trained how to access e-journals and e-databases.

Rare Books & Manuscripts/Theses/Dissertations section

In this academic session, 26 Manuscripts, 319 Ph.D theses, 74 B.Arch(Reports) and 64 Food Science & Technology reports were processed by the section. 587 theses were also uploaded on Shodhganga.

Departmental Libraries

The university library has 23 departmental libraries. Bhai Gurdas Library has transferred 1428 books to different departmental libraries.

Binding Unit

Binding of 86 books, 187 journals, 48 theses and 42 month-wise bound volumes of newspapers were done by this section.



DELNET

University library is a member of DELNET (Developing Library Network, New Delhi). It helps the faculty members and researchers to procure those books, articles and documents from other educational institutions which are not available in our library.

Computer Section

The library has its own computer section. All the library operations such as housekeeping, bibliographical services, preparation of database of books with complete bibliographical details etc. are carried out by computer section. Students, research scholars and faculty members are constantly kept aware of the latest information /e-book/e-journals through e-mail by this section.

INFLIBNET Centre provides access to anti plagiarism software namely 'Ouriginal'.

Automation and Digitization

Earlier, BhaiGurdas Library was having a system where circulation of books was being done by in house developed software. As this is not fully integrated system and has certain limitations like one has to keep record manually for the books in circulation and faculty and students are not able to track the status of their library account and lot of human intervention is required in day-to-day tasks. In order to overcome this and to make the library system more effective and user-friendly following steps have been taken:

A fully Integrated LMS(KOHA) has been implemented in the library with complete RFID Integration which automates data collection and vastly reduces human effort and error. This facilitates automated access to faculty, research scholars and students. In this system, once students/faculty members enter in the library, his/her entry is automatically recorded by tapping RFID Smart ID Cards issued to them on Access Control Flap barriers. OPAC Kiosks are available for searching the books on every floor through Koha and users can locate the books easily as floor number rack number is already given in the system. Students/Faculty/members scan independently issue/return books using RFID Equipment without any human intervention. All users (PATRONS) can track their account on KOHA system where they can see the details of books issued to them and their due date and fine imposed in case of delay etc. Users can also hold the book which is already issued and intimation will be sent to the user once it is available for issuance. All the books in the library are tagged with RFID tags and thus any kind of theft is also being prevented with the installation of RFID Security Gates.

Digital Lounge

Keeping in view of the optimum and effective usage of e-resources subscribed by BhaiGurdas Library, a new dedicated computer Lab(Digital Lounge) consisting of 100 high end systems with latest configuration and internet facility has recently been established with the help of RUSA 2.0 grant. This lab is being used for faculty and students for accessing e resources (E-journals and E-Books)



E-books

Library has also purchased about 15000+ E-books from publishers like Elsevier, Springer Nature, Taylor & Francis, Sage, Cambridge University Press and Oxford University Press. Now teachers, research scholars and students can access E books from anywhere inside campus.

Website

University library has its own web page. The address of this website is <http://library.gndu.ac.in>. The library web page can also be accessed from Guru Nanak Dev University website www.gndu.ac.in. This website contains useful information about library services.

OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue)

University library has prepared database of books in English, Hindi & Punjabi Languages. As soon as new books are purchased and processed, their bibliographic description is added to OPAC. Web OPAC is also available at <http://library.gndu.ac.in>.

Seminar cum Library Orientation Hall

A Seminar cum Library Orientation Hall has also been established with multimedia facilities and smart digital podium to organize orientation programme for a batch of students and faculty.

CCTV Surveillance

64 High-Definition Cameras (Sixteen Cameras at each floor) have been installed in the Bhai Gurdas Library for better CCTV surveillance.



CENTRE FOR IT SOLUTIONS

The “Centre for IT Solutions” is established with the vision for uplifting the computerization of various processes by providing IT related services like Software Development, Consultancy Services and Website Designing & Management etc. to enhance the efficiency and transparency in the University. The Centre is providing these services to various departments of University as well as outside of University. The Centre has three computer laboratories equipped with desirable configuration of hardware and software. The staff of Centre is primarily involved in Software Development and Maintenance to cater the IT related requirements of the University. The staff of centre is fully equipped to teach these courses. The students are also given practical exposure of software development.

The technical expertise of centre is utilized during online centralized state level admissions to various Law courses in different Universities/Institutes/Colleges throughout the state. The centre also provides its technical services for recruitment of staff in schools and colleges of Punjab. The database of Inter Disciplinary Courses for various departments of the University campus is being prepared and managed by the centre in every semester which facilitates the students to fill their choices online for ID-courses using online software application. The centre imparts computer training to the employees of the University. The laboratories of centre are also used for computer proficiency test for recruitment as well as promotion of employees. The staff of centre has played an important role in redesigning and development of University website. The centre also maintains the official website of University on regular basis.

The infrastructure support available in the centre is provided for conducting practical classes and practical examinations of students from different departments. The online tests are also conducted in the laboratories of centre for placement of students. The internet facility is available in computer laboratories, rooms of officers and office of centre. The help desk facility is established in one of the computer laboratories for helping the students to fill their application/examination forms through online process. The results of entrance tests during admission process in the university campus and its regional campuses are also compiled in the centre.

The Placement Department in Guru Nanak Dev University was established in March 1998 to cater the needs of university students for their placements in various institutions / organisations – both Govt. and Private having national / international reputation. Since then this office has performed remarkably well both in the matter of placements and providing academic guidance to the students. Students of professional courses are helped to do their industrial training in multinational companies in India and abroad. Interaction of faculty members with company officials is arranged to get feedback regarding requirements of industry. It has helped the departments to revise and update their syllabi as per industry demands. Database of around 1500 potential employers has been prepared. All these employers have been invited for campus recruitment at GNDU, Amritsar through letters and emails. Regular interaction with industry through letters, phone, emails and personal visits is made to develop a long term relationship between industry and university.

HIGHLIGHTS:

GNDU student placed at Rs. 44.00 Lakh per annum

GNDU students have been placed at high packages in multinational companies. The highest salary package of Rs. 44.00 Lakhs per annum (LPA) has been offered by Amazon company. Ms. Pawandeep Kaur, student of B.Tech. CSE, GNDU Amritsar has been selected by this company. The pay package includes fix salary of Rs. 33.26 Lakh per annum and 143 RSU (Restricted Stock Units) of the company. The student also got Rs. 80,000 per month from Amazon during the six months internship at the company. Apart from the highest package offered by Amazon, Walmart offered Rs. 23.39 LPA, Josh Technology Group Rs. 18.00 LPA and Zscaler offered Rs. 17.50 LPA to GNDU students.

ALUMNI ASSOCIATION

The Alumni Association Guru Nanak Dev University (AAGNDU) was set up in the year 2007. In the beginning, only offline membership facility was available, however in 2018 the association launched a website to strengthen the relationship with alumni settled in India and abroad. The alumni can now register themselves online on this portal (<http://alumni.gndu.ac.in>). The registration is completely free of any charges. After registration, the alumni are provided with unique ID and password to update their information. The website is continuously updated with the achievements of the alumni and the university. A section for the Alumni Achievers on the website provides brief profile of the renowned alumni. The website has become a platform for the alumni to stay connected. The alumni office is regularly collecting the details of alumni from the various departments of GNDU, regional campuses and updates the list to strengthen the database. As of now 21,830 alumni members have registered themselves on the website.

AAGNDU has started the Alumni Life Membership Card Scheme under which several lifetime facilities such as gym, guest house, and swimming pool facilities are offered to the Alumni Life Membership Card holders at discounted rates. These facilities are provided to the alumni after paying one time fee (Rs.5000/- from the member living in India and Rs.15000/- from the member living abroad). So far 63 alumni have enrolled in this programme and Rs. 3,15,000/- has been earned by the association.

The G.N.D.U. Alumni Society is a separate body with a mandate to generate funding for the university, the society recently got itself registered under section 12A and donors to the society can avail of tax benefits under section 80(G) of the income tax act. Donations and contributions will be used for the growth of the University. An online website (<http://eservices.gndu.ac.in/donations/>) has been created to accept donations from persons/organisations based in India. The FCRA approval for foreign contributions to the society is under process, which will enable the society to generate funding from donors outside India.

The annual alumni meets could not be organized in 2020 and 2021 due to pandemic, and AAGNDU has been organizing online talks during the last 2 years. Ms. Maninder (Kamal) Sachdev, a social educator, mindset coach and soft skill trainer gave a webinar on stress management in Oct, 2021. Dr. Harmit Singh, Professor and Chair, Department of Nutrition and Food Science, California State Polytechnic University, USA gave a webinar in Nov, 2021 in which he shared his professional experiences and life journey from GNDU, India to USA. An online interreaction meeting was organized in December, 2021 with Dr. Vijay Kumar Babbar, Vice President (Overseas) – AAGNDU, and President-GNDUAA Eastern Canada Chapter and Senior Research Scientist Canadian Nuclear Laboratories Chalk River, Canada, where he provided an overview of his area of research; Non-Destructive



Evaluation Techniques. Shri Manjit Singh Nijjar, Senior Honorary NRI Co-ordinator and Honourable Member of High Powered Investment Committee, Government of Punjab gave a seminar in March, 2022 in GNDU where he spoke about establishing collaborations between GNDU and foreign universities.

The department chapters of AAGNDU have been organizing webinars, in which the distinguished alumni are invited to give presentations on their vocation and provide career counseling advice to the students. The Physics department and Electronics departments of the university have organized about 20 webinars under “Know Your Alumni” program during 2021-22.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Guru Nanak Dev University accredited by NAAC with 'A' grade was established on November 24, 1969 to mark the 500th birth Anniversary of Sri Guru Nanak Dev Ji. It is both a residential and affiliating university. Guru Nanak Dev University has made phenomenal progress in the field of sports in the Inter-University, National and International competitions. The Department of Physical Education (Allied Teaching) was set up in 1970. The Department started organizing Inter-College tournaments from 1970 itself and sent teams for the Inter-Varsity tournaments for the first time in 1971. From the very beginning, Sports Committees for men and women were formed to guide and coordinate the sports activities and to organize games and sports in the affiliated colleges to raise the university teams for Inter-University and other tournaments. On the basis of the performance in the Inter-College tournaments, various universities teams are selected for participation in the Inter-University competitions which are organized by the Association of Indian Universities, New Delhi. Each year, the Department of Physical Education (Allied Teaching) organizes 120 Guru Nanak Dev University Inter-college (Men and Women) tournaments and sends 95 universities (M&W) teams for participation in North Zone / All India Inter-University (M&W) Championships. In order to attain excellence in sports, coaching camps for selected men and women teams are organized at a Hill Station during summer vacation for imparting physical fitness and conditioning training. Liberal facilities are provided to the players who participate in the Inter-University tournaments as members of Guru Nanak Dev University teams in terms of free board and lodging during coaching camps and cash prize money to those players who win the positions in Inter-University competitions. Today, in the field of sports, Guru Nanak Dev University is rated as the Top University amongst 609 universities in the country. The unparalleled achievement of Guru Nanak Dev University in sports is much due to its sportsmen and sportswomen of the colleges as well as a mechanism of 'right type of training' 'right type of selection' and 'right type of administration' which remained the key factors in achieving high standards in sports at Inter-University, National and International levels.

SPORTS FACILITIES AND INFRASTRUCTURE AVAILABLE AT UNIVERSITY CAMPUS.

An Area of 30 acres of land has already been developed into various grounds / playfields for development of sports.

FACILITIES & INCENTIVES:

1. **Sports Hostel for Boys & Girls :** The University has separate Sports hostels for Boys and Girls within university campus with capacity of 150 and 100 members respectively.. The outstanding athletes are accommodated free of cost in these hostels. The new separate Sports Hostels for Boys and Girls is under progress in the University Campus.
2. **Hockey Stadium:** The Hockey Astro Turf at the university campus is available for the players with sitting capacity along with flood lighting facility.
3. Swimming Pool of International Standard has already been put to used for competitions / practice.
4. Indoor Multipurpose Gymnasium equipped with Maple wood flooring, wall paneling, sound proofing and false ceiling is available for the players. It has been put to use for various inter-college/inter-university competitions.



5. Velodrome: The velodrome at the university campus is ready for use. The Velodrome grooms the budding cyclists of this area and to project them in the inter-university, national and international competitions.
6. Shooting Range in the campus is equipped with 38 target facilities so that the shooters of this university can groom their skill and field them for the inter-university, national and international level competitions. All India Inter-University Shooting as well as National level Championships have been organized in the range very successfully.

Campus Sports Department situated in student centre, is working under Dean Student's Welfare, Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar. In order to develop the physical, mental and overall fitness as well as to develop the interest of campus students in sports, Campus Sports Department provides facilities for various outdoor and indoor games. An ultra modern Gym “The Golden Jubilee Fitness Centre” equipped with the modern machines has also been established for faculty and students.

Sports equipments and other necessary items are provided to the students throughout the year. Four Badminton courts are available near the students centre which remains open day and night. Other playfields like Basketball, Volleyball, Handball, Tennis, Football and International Standard Swimming Pool, Indoor Multipurpose Gymnasium, International Standard Shooting Range, International Standard Hockey Turf and International Standard Velodrome are available to the campus students throughout the year.

Each year, Campus Sports Department organizes Inter-department competitions in different games viz. Table Tennis, Chess, Carom, Basketball, Volleyball, Handball, Tennis, Football, Kabaddi, Cricket, Swimming, Arm Wrestling, Best Physique, Tug of War and Hockey etc. Annual Sports Meet has also been organized every year and sports persons are honored with incentives and mementos. The students both boys and girls from different departments participate in these competitions. The position holder team's upto third positions are awarded with Mementoes, Overall Trophies and Merit Certificates.

The campus students also take part in GNDU Inter-college sports competitions/North Zone/All India Inter-University/ World University games/National and Inter-National Championships. The campus sports persons who secure first positions in All India Inter-university or National Championships are entitled to 100% fee & funds refund, financial Assistant and honored with Blazer and University Color. Similarly, Second or Third position holders in All India Inter-university or National Championships are awarded with refund of 100% fees & funds, financial Assistance and Track Suits. The players who participate in All India Inter-university championships are awarded with refund of 50% of tuition fee & funds with financial Assistance to campus students.

SAHIBZADA ZORAWAR SINGH BOY'S HOSTEL-I

The Boys' Hostel No.1 has provided accommodation to about 354 students of 44 Departments (approximately). The mess-halls are furnished with quality furniture. The Kitchen areas are spacious, airy and there is power backup of inverters in the mess area. Water cooling machines, deep freezers and chest coolers are part of the kitchen area. The two canteens are being run in the hostel by two contractors and the services are available to the residents from 6.00 a.m. to 11.00 p.m. to provide quality food products. Bath rooms and toilets of each block in the hostel are recently renovated as per the quality standards. Further, geysers are installed in block of bathrooms. Two common rooms of the hostel are well-equipped with 42" LCD screens and 42" LED screens. There are provisions for indoor games like table tennis and carom-board. Arrangements are there for out-door games like badminton and volley ball as well. The hostel has a reading room having seating capacity of 100 students and remains open round the clock. The hostel premises are internet ready through Wi-Fi technology. Special care is taken for maintaining sanitary and hygiene conditions in and around the buildings within the hostel premises. The hostel is given an aesthetics look through proper landscaping.

SAHIBZADA ZORAWAR SINGH BOY'S HOSTEL-2

Sahibzada Zorawar Singh Boys Hostel was started in October 2000 with a capacity to accommodate 198 students in 65 rooms. To meet the requirement of additional accommodation, a new block of 68 rooms was constructed in 2003. A new block has been constructed in Sahibzada Zorawar Singh Boys Hostel in the year 2010. This block consists of 128 rooms to be allotted to research scholars.

MESS:

There are two messes in the hostel run by separate contractors and are managed by mess committees of the students under the supervision of the Hostel Warden. The mess halls are furnished with furniture, and are equipped with desert coolers, water cooler along with water filters. Ban marry hot case are provided in the messes to serve hot food to the residents.



Chimneys are installed in the mess kitchens to exhaust out the smoke and maintain the temperature of the kitchen to workable conditions.

CANTEEN:

The canteen is being run in the hostel by a contractor. Canteen offers snacks, tea, coffee, juice, milk products etc at fixed prices are served in the canteens and remains open from 8:00 am to 10:00 pm.

COMMON ROOM FACILITIES:

Hostel has two well-equipped common rooms with LCD television and Dish T.V facility. Common Room facilities are available to the students from 07:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m. Eleven leading newspapers in English, Hindi & Punjabi and eight magazines and periodicals are subscribed the benefit of the students.

Reading Room:

Hostel has one Reading Hall with adequate furniture for the hostel residents. Reading Room facilities are available to the residents from 07:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m.

Wi-Fi Facility:

The residents have access to the internet through Wi-Fi in all the rooms at each floor in all three blocks.

INDOOR AND OUT DOOR GAMES:

The hostel has provision for outdoor and indoor games like Volleyball, Badminton, Chess, Table Tennis and Carom-board.

LAWNS:

There are beautiful lawns around the three blocks of the hostel. Ten lawn benches have been placed at various places in the lawns.

OUTDOOR GYM

The outdoor gym is available for students in the hostel

SOLAR GYSERS:

There are 3 working Solar Geysers in the hostel.

REPAIR AND MAINTENANCE SERVICES:

The hostel has instant repair and maintenance services for electricity, furniture and water supply.



SAHIBZADA ZORAWAR SINGH BOY'S HOSTEL BOY'S HOSTEL - III

The Boy's Hostel-3 started in 2016 with provision of accommodation for 134 students in 44 rooms and is spread over four storey interconnected blocks. The rooms are offered on sharing basis. Each room is well lit and ventilated and has an attached balcony/verandah to it. The hostel has provision of geysers in all the bathrooms and water coolers along with water purifiers on each floor. The hostel premise is beautified by spacious green lawn interspersed with seasonal flower beds and trees. Lawns and squares inside the hostel are properly landscaped by trees, shrubs and colourful seasonal flowers to add to the aesthetics of the hostel.

The hostel is well equipped with the modern facility of Wi-Fi system. CCTV cameras have also been installed at the hostel entry gate as well as at the entrance of each floor.

The hostel has a spacious mess run by contractor. The hostel warden and the students' mess committee supervise the food preparation to ensure quality food and better services to the students. The dining hall is equipped with desert coolers, water cooler along with water filters and fly/insect killer for health, sanitary & hygiene prospectus. The kitchen and dining area are spacious, airy and there is power backup from inverter. Bain-marie and electric chimney have been installed in hostel mess. The cook and other mess staff follow good habits of hygiene.

The hostel has the facility of common room as well as reading room. The hostel common room provides necessary facilities such as L.E.D. (42") with Dish TV, newspapers, magazines and indoor games like Carom board, Chess, Table Tennis etc. One A. C. Reading Hall having seating capacity of about 100 students.

The other activities during the given period are as follows:

- CCTV cameras have been installed at the entrance of all the gates at each floor of the hostel premises.
- Air conditioners have been installed in the reading room.



MATA NANAKI GIRLS HOSTEL-I

Structure:

Mata Nanaki Girls Hostel-1 established in 1973 provides accommodation to students studying in different departments at the university campus. There are 174 rooms having intake capacity of 460 girls. The accommodation offered includes two bedded, four bedded and five bedded rooms. The hostel is well-equipped with facilities like internet with wi-fi, common room with T.V., well equipped medical room, Photostat-cum-utility shop, PCO-cum-stationary store, well equipped fully Air Conditioner reading hall, mess, canteen, open air gymnasium with latest machine etc. The hostel has lush green lawns with benches for sitting.

To ensure the safety and security of the residents, the hostel entrance and boundaries are under 24 hrs CCTV surveillance. In addition to this, the hostel is manned by female attendants and night guards. Every effort is made to make the stay of residents safe, secure, comfortable, enjoyable and fruitful.

Activities in Hostel

Festivals of Lohri, Janamashtmi, Guru Nanak Devji's birthday and Prabhat pheri were celebrated in the hostel and attended by the residents and staff with great enthusiasm in normal circumstances.

2. Common Room is furnished with new Chairs, Sofa sets and Air Conditioners.
3. Medical Room well furnished with AC Facility and Chrome plated steel chairs.

5. Mess is fully furnished with new chairs & Dining Tables.

MATA NANAKI GIRLS' HOSTEL-II

Mata Nanaki Girls Hostel-2 established in 1973 provides accommodation to students studying in different departments at the university campus. There are 225 rooms having intake capacity of 622 girls. The accommodation offered includes two seated, three seated, four seated and five seated rooms. The hostel is well-equipped with facilities like utility shop, Photostat, PCO-cum-stationary store, reading hall, mess, canteen, etc. The hostel blocks have geysers and water coolers with filters. Wi-Fi facility is also available for the residents. For security purposes, the boundaries and entrance to the hostel are under CCTV surveillance in addition to being manned by female attendants, male security guards at the entrance and women night guards. The residents are provided with mess facility which is run on contract basis and provided clean and nutritious food to students according to a pre-decided menu. 'Bain Marie' has been also provided to students in mess for their self services. The dining hall of the mess is equipped with water cooler and fly/insect killers. In addition, there is a separate canteen which offers a variety of snacks, beverages, fast food and others items of choice. The hostel has also well furnished common room with facilities like L.E.D TV with Dish connection.. The common room provides necessary facilities such as various newspapers, magazines and some indoor games for the overall developments of the residents. A separate reading room is also available to the residents for studying. The Facility of Open Gym is also available for hostel residents.

The hostel has a well furnished guest room for its visitors. A Medical room with Para-medical service is available in the hostel with a well qualified female nurse on duty during night.



MATA NANAKI GIRLS HOSTEL III

Mata Nanaki Girls Hostel III started in January 2014 with provision of accommodation for 761 Students in 255 well lit and ventilated rooms spread over six storey high interconnected blocks. Each block has separate lift with back up facility of generator. This hostel is allotted only to the students who are in the second or higher year of their respective courses on sharing basis. The hostel has provision of geysers in all the bathrooms and water coolers along with water purifiers in each block. The mess of the hostel is being run on contract basis and provides clean nutritious food to the students according to a pre decided menu. The dining hall of the mess is equipped with water coolers along with water purifiers and fly/ insect killers. The hostel has the facility of fully air conditioned common room as well as reading room. The hostel common room provides necessary facilities such as L.E.D. with Dish TV, newspapers, magazines and many indoor games. The hostel premises have spacious green lawns with seasonal flower beds and trees surrounding the main building. The facility of common open gym is also available for hostel residents.

A common medical room is available in the hostel with a nurse, attendant and security Guards on duty at night. To ensure the safety and security of the residents, the hostel boundaries and entrance are under 24 hours CCTV surveillance. The hostel is equipped with wifi connectivity. The hostel has common computer lab, provisional store and shops providing stationary and other utility items and photocopying facility, tailoring facility within the premises. To promote hygiene among the residents, facility of Sanitary napkin vending machine with Incinerator has been provided in the hostel. There are different Student's Committees (Mess, Canteen & Block) for discussing various hostel issues so that their problems can be resolved in time.

Like previous years, this year also the hostel residents actively participated in various activities & festivals such as Lohri and various Gurupurab Celebrations. All the efforts are being made to give a homely feeling to the residents.



MATA NANAKI GIRLS HOSTEL NO. - IV

Introduction and functions

Mata Nanaki Girls Hostel No. - IV has currently six blocks named 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6. Blocks 1, 2 and 3 have 288 single seated rooms while 4, 5 and 6 Blocks have 179 rooms on sharing basis providing accommodation for 741 students in total. Mostly all the Ph.D., M. Phil. and final year students of Post Graduate courses are being provided accommodation in this hostel.

The hostel is well-equipped with all basic facilities such as Wi-Fi, medical facility, Open Gym facility etc. The mess of the hostel provides clean nutritious food to students according to pre-decided menu and are also equipped with water coolers along with water purifiers, fire extinguishers and fly/insect killers. There are two Ban Maries in mess of the hostel and food is served in ban Maries to ensure timely and efficient serving to the residents. In this session Comptuer Lab is established with 15 computers and one printer for the usage of hostel residents. Common Room, Reading Room, Guest Room and Computer Lab of the hostel are fully air conditioned. The hostel common-room provides all the necessary facilities such as television, newspapers, magazines and some indoor & outdoor games. CCTV cameras have also been installed all around the hostel boundary keeping in view the security of the girl students. A scooter stand is also available outside the hostel. Sanitary Napkin Vending Machine along with incinerator machine is installed in the hostel for the usage of the residents.

**I. Activities in the calendar year 2021-22**

In the current academic session (2021-22), 724 students were accommodated in Girls Hostel No. IV. Various festivals were celebrated by the students from time to time such as Lohri, Janamashtmi, Gurpurab, etc. In November 2021, students welcomed Prabhat Pheri to the hostel with great fervour.

II. Achievements in the calendar year 2021-22

As committed for the welfare of the students, the hostel provides homely atmosphere to its residents. The hostel has lush green gardens providing good atmosphere of learning to hostel residents. New furniture for the mess, reading room and common room has been procured under Rusa Grant during this session. Also the establishment of air conditioned Computer Lab with 15 computers having Wi-Fi facility in the hostel is a big achievement of the session.

III. Innovations and best practices

In session 2021-22 student council was formed with 40 student residents of the hostel that looked after various issues concerning the hostel residents. These students used to have regular meetings with hostel residents and the hostel staff for maintaining smooth and lively staying experience in the hostel. Beside it, there are visits of medical officers of the Guru Nanak Dev University on weekly basis for checking the food quality and cleanliness in hostel mess and canteen during this session.

IV. Plans for next year

The Hostel is committed towards providing best hostel facilities to its residents and in this direction the hostel aimed to provide neat & clean environment, hygienic food, security arrangements and homely environment to the students.



UNIVERSITY HEALTH CENTRE

The University Health Centre was established in 1973 as a primary health care facility. The mission of the Health Centre is to enhance the health and wellness of University students, faculty and staff by providing access to quality health services and ensuring their well being. Health Centre provides clinical (supporting health and well being through care for acute and ongoing diseases and injuries) as well as ancillary services like laboratory, radiology and pharmacy services to the University community apart from supporting educational and research activities as well.

The University Health Centre provides services for Medical, Dental as well as Ayurvedic O.P.D. There is also a specialized sports dentistry clinic which provides custom made mouth guards to all the university/college sports persons for prevention of dental injuries. Attached to the Health Centre is a well equipped Physiotherapy Centre having trained physiotherapist. These facilities remain open Monday to Saturday and even on gazetted/declared holidays. Emergency services including ambulance services are available 24x7. The doctors at Health Centre provide primary health care to students, staff, pensioners & their dependants. For services not covered at Health Centre, referral services to Government and Multispecialty hospitals for specialized treatment/hospitalization are available. 42 hospitals are on empanelment with the University at CGHS rates.

Other in house facilities available at Health Centre are:

- Fully computerized digital Electrocardiograph (ECG)
- Digital X-ray
- Bone mineral density scan (DEXA Scan)
- Mammography
- Dental X-ray (RVG)
- Orthopantomogram
- Vacuum thermoforming machine (for making mouth guards)

A Medical Board has been constituted at the Health Centre (with two outside experts) for issuing chronic complicated disease certificates to eligible University patients. In addition a Medical Committee is also constituted to assess the working of Health Centre and recommend programs for the benefit of University patients.

In order to manage any casualty among girl students, Health Centre has set up a medical room in the Girls' Hostel and a staff nurse is available at the hostel from 8 pm to 8 am daily including on Sundays & holidays. The medical officers of Health Centre regularly inspect the messes and Canteens in Boys & Girls Hostels. The mess & canteens workers are periodically examined and screened for any communicable diseases.



The University Health Centre has set up a sample collection unit in collaboration with NABL accredited laboratory for providing quality lab facilities at special subsidised rates. Ultrasonography facility has been provided to the university patients at discounted/CGHS rates in collaboration with three leading diagnostic centres of the city.

Keeping in view the unprecedented COVID-19 time, an isolation room has been set up at Health Centre to separate and restrict movement of persons who are not ill but believed to have been exposed to the infection for the purpose of preventing the transmission of the disease. A few students of the University had availed of this facility in co-ordination with District Health Authority and successfully completed their quarantine period. Furthermore, recognising the community transfer of COVID-19, the University had made arrangements for sample collection for rt-PCR tests at the Health Centre. Being committed to the health of the faculty, staff and students of Guru Nanak Dev University and following the procedure and guidelines issued by the Punjab Government a vaccination drive against COVID-19 was started in April 2021 and is still continuing at University Health Centre.

An emergency helpline number 70877-07052 has been started to facilitate the faculty staff and students in case of any medical emergency. This number is operational 24x7.

The medical and para medical staff of Health Centre participated in the following activities :-

1. Free Eye checkup camp was held in Sept 2021 in collaboration with a leading eye hospital in Amritsar in which a large number of faculty, students and the employees of University were examined.
2. Blood donation Camp was organized at Health Centre in collaboration with Smt. Parvati Devi Hospital Blood Centre, Amritsar on 10 Sept 2021.
3. An interactive session on liver health was organised by the University Health Centre in collaboration with GI Rendezvous and GLF (Gastroenterology and Liver Forum) on 19-04-2022 i.e. World Liver Day.
4. The COVID-19 vaccination drive started in April 2021 is still being continued and approx 15000 doses of Covishield/Covaxin have been administered till date.

University Campus has a beautiful network of roads which has been well maintained. University has given 24 hours uninterrupted water supply to the campus which is maintained with 10 nos. tubewells. University also maintains two STP and disposal besides network of water supply lines and sewerage lines, has separate system of storm water and Sewage Sullage.

It also looks after the repair of furniture, addition/alteration of various buildings and construction of various projects.

Security Wing of the University was raised in Feb 1979 to meet security requirements of the University. The security environment plays an important role in the development of an Academic Institution especially in education field by creating and maintaining congenial and peaceful environment. All out efforts were made by the security staff of the University to provide effective security cover as a result the year 2021 remained free from any major mishappening/security violation. However, isolated incidents of petty theft cases and indiscipline were reported.

Strict Security arrangements were made to prevent internal quarrels amongst the students and residents.

The security staff was also made responsive to the calls of campus residents and to provide them every possible help/assistance.

DEPARTMENT OF LANDSCAPING

Commemorating Guru Nanak Dev's birth quincentenary celebrations Guru Nanak Dev University Amritsar was established on 24th November 1969. Hence a high powered committee was constituted with S. Bishan Singh Samundari the then founder Vice Chancellor Guru Nanak Dev University, Dr. M. S. Randhawa the then Vice Chancellor Punjab Agricultural University Ludhiana, the then Vice Chancellor Punjab university Chandigarh, Chief Architect U.T. Chandigarh, Architect PAU Ludhiana and some prominent personalities in the subject for planning, designing and development of the new campus of university. Accordingly the department of Landscaping was also established for the proper planning and development of landscaping through selection and collection of different types of plants in trees, shrubs, climbers, indoor plants, ground covers and grasses then their plantation and maintenance for beautiful campus Landscaping. The committee did extensive survey of the campus then intensive planning selected the promising and beautiful plants and planted them to make the campus of Guru Nanak Dev University evergreen, colorful, fragrant and pleasant. This department had been looked after by Mr. H. S. Dhindsa as the founder Landscape Officer (Dec. 1971 – July 1978) who was followed by Mr. G. S. Pannu from August 1978 to April 30th 2009 his superannuation.

The department of Landscaping has been activated by Prof. (Dr.) Jaspal Singh Sandhu the worthy Vice Chancellor after a big gap when he joined Guru Nanak Dev University Amritsar (16th August 2017). He picked up Dr. J. S. Bilga from Central University of Punjab Bathinda as Consultant Horticulture. Mr. Gurwinder Singh joined as Landscape Officer (22.12.2020) against permanent post. Dr. Bilga did surveyed and planted large number of plants to the complete saturation of GNDU campus. He retired as Consultant Horticulture from Landscape department on dated 19th march 2022. Then competent authority retained him as Advisor Horticulture for his valuable advice in the field of Landscaping/Horticulture. Mr. Gurwinder Singh Landscape Officer assisted by, 5 head Malis, a small number of 19 Malis and 35 workers for a vast campus of 500 acres of Guru Nanak Dev University including 25 acres of Botanical Garden. Mrs. Mandeep Kaur is working as Data Entry Operator.

Department of Landscaping is assigned the responsibilities of planning, plantation, transplanting and maintenance of gardening all over the campus including, nursery production, hoeing, irrigation, pruning, training & trimming, replacement of plants, fertilization and plant protection along with over all greening and cleaning of lawns. Under educative agenda this department is organizing Flower shows and seminars twice a year in the subject for the awareness of students and residents.

During the reporting year 2021 - 22 the department of Landscaping has performed the following activities:



❖ **NEW LANDSCAPING AND PLANTATION WORKS:**

- New planning and development of Landscaping around the following departments have been done during the current year:
- Different species of ground covers have been planted on the Left side of Bhai Gurdas Library for its beautiful look.
- Different species of ground covers with *Livistonia chinensis* Palms along the Registrar house outside wall have been planted.
- Department of Financial studies

- Department of Physics
- Centre for sustainable habitat
- Area between Punjab and Sind Bank and University shopping centre

❖ **PROCUREMENT OF PLANTS AND SEEDS :**

- All flowering seeds are also received complimentary from Mr. Avtar Singh, Beauscape Farm Ludhiana that saves lot of revenue of GNDU.

❖ **REVENUE PLANTATIONS:**

In continuation with the previous plantation of Shisham trees (the state tree of Punjab) area backside of UIT workshop along the wall of Sadda Pind has been covered with thick plantation as a source of revenue for university in future.

❖ **FRUIT TREE PLANTATIONS:**

Different fruit and flowering trees have been planted backside of Education and Agriculture department building for the beautification and source of nutrition for students.

❖ **LABELING OF PLANTS:**

Inventory of total plants in the campus has been prepared systematically and proper labeling of plants in collaboration of department of Botanical and Environmental Sciences has been done to make the campus flora educative.

❖ **POLLUTION CHECK BARRIERS:**

Buffer plantation has been done in last year with different species of trees, shrubs and three varieties of Bamboos i.e. *Dendrocalamus strictus*, *Bamboosa multiplex* and *Phyllostachys aurea* (brought from CSIR - IHBTP Palampur, HP) inside the boundary wall starting from Ram Tirath gate to HRDC through UIT as a green barrier to check total pollution is being looked after by department.



❖ **PROPAGATION:**

Landscape nursery being maintained by department is doing various activities like propagation of different varieties of Bougainvilleas, climbers, shrubs, trees, chrysanthemum and annual flowers.

❖ **GAP FILLING :**

- Bougainvilleas around Sports complex and boundary wall of Botanical garden from university house to Administrative block.
- Plantation along road starting from Boys Hostel 3 to UIT than HRDC.
- Enrichment of flora in the Botanical Garden continued with additional species in medicinal, fruits and other plants continued.
- Different species of Lilly have been planted in front of Maintenance department.
- In continuity with the plantation and maintenance of different species of fragrant shrubs and trees for sweet fragrance added at prominent places.

❖ **GOLDEN JUBILEE ROSE PARK**

Dream project conceived by the worthy Vice Chancellor Prof. (Dr.) Jaspal Singh Sandhu developed during the Golden Jubilee year with 50 named varieties of Roses matching with Golden Jubilee celebrations of the university is being maintained properly.

❖ **THE 49TH SACRED JUNGLE**

Developed in the campus of GNDU with the co-operation of Baba Sewa Singh, Kar Sewa Sri Khadoor Sahib with 1800 plants is being looked after by this department.

❖ **MECHANIZATION OF LANDSCAPING DEPARTMENT:**

- Hedge trimmer for hedge cutting and chain saw machines for trees training and pruning has been added to the department.
- High quality water pipe (Blue strip pipe) has been purchased by department for watering of plants especially during summer season.
- Grafting and budding tools for budding of roses is also added to the nursery.

❖ **AWARENESS AGENDA:**

To get the residents in general and the students in particular aware about the importance of green and beautiful environment and growing of different plants for their surrounding Guru Nanak Dev University organized two Flower shows:

- Bhai Vir Singh Flower Show was organized on 15th, 16th and 17th December 2021 continued in the chain of awareness and educational activities.
- Spring Flower show and Rangoli was organized from 14th, 15th and 16th March 2022. Where large number of educational institutes and individuals participated with full enthusiasm. This Flower show and Rangoli was inaugurated by Prof. Dr. Jaspal Singh Sandhu Vice Chancellor and prizes were distributed by Dr. Anish Dua, Dean Students' Welfare.



- This year Seminar could not be organized due to Covid 19 guidelines.

❖ **BOTANICAL GARDEN:**

Botanical Garden of Guru Nanak Dev University had been put under the supervision of Landscape department. Accordingly Department of Landscaping during the year 2022 has taken the following activities:

- New varieties of RET species, ferns, aromatic plants, medicinal plants, spices and fruit plants from different sources including many nurseries.
- To make the Botanical Garden more colorful and pleasant different varieties of seasonal flowers have been planted at different locations.
- Mulching of plants was continued for the conservation of soil and water both along with suppressing weeds and gradual addition of organic matter to the plants besides protecting the plants from extreme summer as well as winter.

❖ **CONTINUATION OF REJUVENATION OF CAMPUS:**

Due to poor quality of soil in the campus of Guru Nanak Dev University the growth of trees had been retarded even trees started drying up from top. Hence rejuvenation of campus soil has been continued. Accordingly large quantities of leaves shed were ploughed in the soil that made the soil fertile, aerated and improved its absorption of water. Due to this technique all the lawns have been completely regrassed and the tree tops which were drying up before have been rejuvenated resulting good growth and flowering of plants.

❖ **MAINTENANCE WORKS:**

- Tree plantation along road starting from Boys Hostel 3 to UIT than HRDC
- To make the campus more attractive, hanging baskets hanged throughout the campus with different varieties of plants added during 2018 have been enriched with more varieties.
- Frequently cutting of grass and wild growth all over the campus.
- Training, pruning and trimming of plants.
- Hoeing, weeding and staking of plants whenever required
- Protection of plants from weather, insects, pests and disease
- Collection of broken, dry and dead twigs
- General cleaning of lawns & removal of dead and broken plant parts

❖ **NEXT YEAR PROGRAMMES (2022-2023):**

OFFICE OF NODAL OFFICER (For SC/ST)

1. NODAL OFFICER for SC/ST category has been appointed by the competent authorities vide letter no. 2044-593 dated 23.11.2020.

AIM OF UNIVERSITY NODAL OFFICER FOR SC/ST CATEGORY CELL

1. To circulate Government of India and Commission's decisions and to collect regularly, on an annual basis. information regarding course-wise admissions to candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in the Universities and Colleges for different courses, in forms prescribed, by a stipulated date, and to take follow up action, where required.
2. To circulate Government of India orders and Commission's decisions and to collect information in respect of appointment, training of these communities in teaching and non-teaching posts in the Universities and Colleges, in suitable forms by a stipulated date and take follow up action where required..
3. To collect reports and information regarding the Government of India orders on the various aspects of education, training and employment of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes candidates, for evolving new policies or modifying existing policy by the Commission.
4. To analyse the information collected above and prepare reports and digests for onward transmission to the Ministry of Human Resource Development/University Grants Commission and such other authorities as may be required.
5. To deal with representations received from Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes candidates regarding their admission, recruitment, promotion and other similar matters in Universities/Colleges.
6. To monitor the working of the remedial coaching scheme, if approved in the affiliated colleges and university.



7. To function as a Grievances Redressal Cell for the Grievances of SC/ST students and employees of the university and render them necessary help in solving their academic as well as administrative problems.
8. To maintain a register for employment of SCs/STs in the University and Colleges for the candidates belonging to SC/ST communities for various posts in the university/colleges.
9. Any other work assigned from time to time to promote higher education among these two communities suffering economic, social and education deprivations.
10. The SC/ST Cell exclusively looks after the work related to SCs/STs matters and no other work is assigned to the Cell.

SOLID LIQUID WASTE MANAGEMENT

Nodal Officer: Prof. Dalbir Singh Sogi

Guru Nanak Dev University has been recognized as a 'Category A++' University by the UGC and has taken lead in academics, sports and cultural activities. The University has taken several measures to provide clean and green environment to its faculty and students. The University has resolved to make the main campus a 'Zero Waste Campus'. Solid Liquid Resource Management Centre was established in 2016 to achieve this objective. One committee was constituted to manage the activities of this centre consisting of Prof Dalbir Singh Sogi as convener and Prof Arvinder Kaur, Prof Manpreet Singh Bhatti, Dr Kiran Sandhu, Dr Vikram Sandhu as members. Since its inception several steps has been taken to manage different types of solid wastes.

Solid waste generation points:

The main campus is spread over 500 acres land and situated towards the west side of the Amritsar city. It can be divided into academic and residential areas. Academic area consists of teaching and non-teaching departments. There are 37 teaching Departments housed in seventeen buildings. The University has over 5000 students and more than 350 faculty members teaching different courses. Non teaching departments are functioning from six buildings. The residential area includes 409 houses of teaching and non-teaching employees, 04 Girl hostels, 04 boy hostels, 01 sports hostel, 01 faculty house, 01 working women hostels, 02 Guest Houses, 10 canteens and cafeteria. All these buildings produce solid waste which is collected on daily basis.

Solid waste collection system:

Solid waste is collected in different types of the bins with colour code green, red and black. Green colored bins are used to collect biodegradable waste; red bins are used to collect non-biodegradable waste; whereas black colored bins were used for the collection of used masks. One tractor trolley with driver and helper collects the solid waste from the campus. The Non-biodegradable or dry solid wastes are collected from teaching, non-teaching and residential area and taken to the SLRM centre where this waste is segregated and all the recyclable material are separated and send to the recycling units for further processing. Biodegradable or wet solid waste is collected by a dedicated team separately and is utilized to convert it into compost, biogas or animal feed. Cooked biodegradable waste is generated mainly from the messes where students leave a small part of their meal which is collected in a drum and is collected by dairy farmers to feed their animals. Uncooked waste mainly peels of the vegetables and fruits are collected by SLRM persons from door to door. This waste is converted into vermicompost and microbial compost. This waste is also utilized for the production of biogas.

Quantification of the waste generation:

The average solid waste collection on daily basis is as follows:



Cooked waste 110kg per day

Uncooked Waste 31 kg per day

Recyclable dry waste 35 kg per day

Non-recyclable waste 40 kg per day

Biomedical Waste 1 kg per day [Collected from Health Center and Teaching Departments by Amritsar Envirocare Systems, Ibbankalan Amritsar]

Sanitary waste generation NIL [Incineration units Installed in Hostels]

Garden waste: University has adopted on-site-decomposing method in which the garden waste is crushed and mixed with the soil for natural composting.

Utilization of the Solid waste:

SLRM Centre was created to utilize the solid waste generated in the campus and it has taken many steps to maximize the extraction of useful products from the waste.

Non-Biodegradable or dry waste utilization:

The dry waste collection system is in place and working well. One tractor trolley along with one driver and one helper are working for the collection of the non-biodegradable waste from the dustbins of Red colour. These dust bins have been installed in the entire campus. The collected waste is taken to SLRM Centre where it is segregated into white paper, Newspaper, corrugated fiber board boxes, glass bottles, plastic bottles, metal, plastic film etc. These items are sent to the recycling industry through agents.

Cooked waste:

It is a biodegradable waste which is produced mainly in Boys and Girls hostels. The leftover food is collected in a plastic drum. Dairy farmers visit the mess every day in the early morning and take away the waste to feed the dairy animals.

Vermicomposting:

One vermicomposting unit is being run at the SLRM Centre in a shed. Cow dung is procured from the local vendors and used to rear the earthworms. Once the earth worms become active, the uncooked waste collected from the hostel messes, canteens and residential area is crushed in a grinder to reduce the particle size. The ground waste is fed to the earth worms by opening the raw and transferring the waste into the rows followed by covering with the composting material. The ground waste takes about 8-10 days in summer to get completely decomposed.

Microbial Composting:

The garden waste and uncooked waste were decomposed under aerobic condition following Bangalore Model. Three layer system was adopted in which the first layer was of leaves from garden waste, second layer was of ground uncooked waste and the third layer was of cow dung. Two pits were prepared of 10ft x 12ft x 4ft. The first pit was filled by utilizing the uncooked waste and leaves as mentioned earlier and then the compost was transferred to the second pit. The compost was allowed to decompose in second pit for one month. The compost



was kept moist by sprinkling water regularly all the time. The compost was of dark brown colour without any off odour.

Biogas unit:

One biogas plant was designed to utilize the uncooked waste to produce energy. The design was developed by calculating the amount of biogas required by a family of four persons. The biogas plant is under trial for the production of biogas.

Pre-composting Unit:

SLRM Centre has designed a pre-composting system to partially degrade the uncooked and garden waste. There is variation in the generation of the organic waste due to vacations in the University and other reasons. This pre-composting unit will ensure the regular supply of the partially composed waste for vermicomposting, microbial composting and biogas generation. The pre-composting unit has been commissioned and in first trial the leaves are being decomposed in the pre-composting unit.

E-rickshaw for organic waste collection:

University has procured two E-rickshaws for the collection of the organic waste from residential area, hostel messes and canteens. These vehicles with tipping facility have improved the process of biodegradation of the organic wastes.

Future Plans

Organic waste Converter:

One organic waste converter has been sanctioned under RUSA-II scheme. This organic waste converter will be used to convert the biodegradable waste into high quality compost under aerobic conditions. It will use specially designed microbial culture along with controlled temperature and aeration to facilitate the microbes to degrade the organic waste. The process of procurement is in progress.

All these steps will lead to a '*ZERO WASTE UNIVERSITY*' in coming time. It will further strengthen our efforts to make our campus clean and green.



NATIONAL YOUTH PARLIAMENT SCHEME (NYPS)

Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs has been implementing the Youth Parliament programme since 1966 in Schools under the Directorate of Education, Government of NCT of Delhi and NDMC, Kendriya Vidyalaya, Jawahar Navodaya Vidyalayas, and Universities/ Colleges. At special function on the occasion to commemorate 70th Anniversary of adoption of the Constitution of India, - “Samvidhan Diwas”, organized in the Central Hall of Parliament, the Hon’ble President Shri Ram Nath Kovind launched the Web-Portal of “National Youth Parliament Scheme”.

Aims of the NYPS

- All recognized educational institutions of the country are eligible to participate in this programme.
- The registration for participation will be done by the education institutions through the web-portal.
- E-training modules, videos, photographs, and scripts are available on the portal for online self-learning of the participants.
- After successful registration, the educational institutions will be able to conduct youth parliament sittings in their respective institutions.
- Each student taking part in the sitting will get a Digital ‘Certificate of Participation’ and each Teacher-in-charge and Head of Institution will get a ‘Certificate of Appreciation’ through the web portal.
- The programme envisages Kishore Sabha for the students of Class IX to Class XII and Tarun Sabha for the students of the Under Graduate/ Post Graduate level.
- To ensure effective implementation of the scheme, the participating institutions may invite an MP/ex-MP/ MLA/ Ex-MLA/ MLC/ Ex-MLC or a Person of eminence as the Chief Guest who would oversee the performance of the Youth Parliament sitting of the institution.
- The institutions shall upload the reports and photos/ videos of Youth Parliament conducted by them on the web portal for scrutiny and verification by the Ministry.
- If reports and photos/ videos of Youth Parliament are found to be in order after scrutiny and verification, participating students will get digital “Certificate of Participation” and teachers-in-charge / head of institutions will get digital “Certificate of Appreciation” for the programme.



Activities

In Guru Nanak Dev University the scheme was opted in year 2020 and I was assigned the duty of Nodal officer on 20 February 2020. So there is no past record for this scheme available to me. Since February 2020 due to the Covid-19 offline physical activity were very few.

- Enrollment drive for students to be participant in National Youth Parliament Scheme was initiated and time to time meetings were called for making prospective participants aware about the activities to be done.
- Online lecture on the working of Indian Parliament was delivered by Dr Devender Singh, Associate Professor and Registrar, Khalsa College, Amritsar on 16 October 2021.
- Another Online lecture on recent Trends in the composition of Indian Parliament was delivered by Ms Daljeet Kaur, Assistant Professor in Political Science, Trinity College, Jalandhar on 09 April 2022.
- In the last meeting with the students various roles were assigned to them to be part of the Act soon to be performed as Youth Parliament. After completion of the process of new admission, the Youth Parliament Activity as depicting Indian Parliament will soon be conducted.



NATIONAL ACADEMIC DEPOSITORY (NAD)

Indian Higher Education system is a large and growing system with approximately 60 school boards, 416 state universities, 124 deemed universities, 54 central universities and 364 private universities. Apart from these, there are 107 other institutions such as IISc/IITs/IIMs/NITs/IISERs/IIITs/NITIE and 12 other centrally funded institutions. These institutions issue academic awards to students including degrees, diplomas and certificates along with mark sheets and evaluation reports. Apart from these, institutions under various Ministries/Departments and other skill based institutions also dispense certificates, diplomas and advanced diploma. Those who are entering into employment or pursuing higher studies require a credible, authentic and convenient mechanism for access, retrieval and validation of such academic awards. Retrieval of old academic records maintained in paper form is cumbersome. Academic records maintained in paper form are susceptible to hazards such as spoilage and forgery. Students often face difficulties in obtaining copies of their certificates/mark-sheets whenever they are lost or destroyed.

Maintaining academic awards in an electronic depository would provide benefit to educational institutions, students and employers by enabling online access of academic awards which will eliminate the need for persons to approach educational institutions for obtaining transcripts of such awards or marks-sheets for verification. It would also eliminate fraudulent practices such as forging of certificates and mark-sheets, by facilitating online verifications thereof.

The National Academic Depository aims at ensuring a credible and convenient mechanism for online lodging, verification and authentication of the academic awards issued by various educational institutions. The vision of National Academic Depository (NAD) is born out of an initiative to provide an online store house of all academic awards. National Academic Depository (NAD) is a 24X7 online store house of all academic awards viz. certificates, diplomas, degrees, mark-sheets etc. duly digitised and lodged by academic institutions / boards / eligibility assessment bodies. NAD not only ensures easy access to and retrieval of an academic award but also validates and guarantees its authenticity and safe storage.

Digi Locker is a provider of NAD services and aims at 'Digital Empowerment' of citizen by providing access to authentic digital documents to citizen's digital document wallet. Maintaining academic awards in an electronic depository would provide benefit to educational institutions, students and employers by enabling online access of academic awards which will eliminate the need for persons to approach educational institutions for obtaining transcripts of such awards for verification. It would also eliminate fraudulent practices such as forging of awards, by facilitating online verification thereof and maintains the authenticity, integrity and confidentiality of the award. It aspires to make the vision of Digital Academic awards for every Indian a reality.

Guru Nanak Dev University is live on Digi locker platform. Degree data for year (2015,2016,2017,2018,2019,2020) has already been uploaded and for year 2021 it is under



process. photographs of students also being uploaded on the portal. University has uploaded more than 2,50,000 Degree records on the portal. Work on DMC template is under process and soon DMC for different courses will be available through Digi locker platform.

FOREIGN STUDENT CELL

This year the University has received 1277 applications through ICCR for admission to different courses. The international student cell is trying to offer an international ambience to these students to effectively integrate with our society.

GOLDEN JUBILEE CENTRE FOR ENTREPRENEURSHIP AND INNOVATION (GJCEI)

Golden Jubilee Centre for Entrepreneurship and Innovation (GJCEI) established at Guru Nanak Dev University under component-4 (Quality and Excellence in Select State Universities) of RUSA 2.0 is actively engaged in building an ecosystem of entrepreneurship and innovation which will catalyze the economy of the state and country at large.

Aligned with the mandate of the centre, a state of the art infrastructure has been created. Around 120 All in One computers, servers, printers, workstations, and photocopier machines have been procured by the centre. A high-speed internet facility has been provided to the centre for its routine functioning. Further, the centre has set up a 3D printing facility with a capacity to develop 3D prototypes having dimensions of 600*600*600 mm³. In addition, a 3D Scanning facility has also been developed which can scan and develop 3D models of any micro/macro object. Furthermore, to help the young minds in developing their own 3D models and in printing 3D prototypes, ANSYS and SOLIDWORKS software have also been made available at the centre. The centre has also set up a discovery lab equipped with PCB Design Machine, Electronic Workbenches and numerous other equipment necessary for developing a working electronic model/prototype.

To impart skill-based training for generating employability and enhancing entrepreneurship, the centre has developed two skill labs. To promote start-up activities, a coworking space and adequate start-up cabins have been designed at the centre. To facilitate IPR (Intellectual Property Rights) related activities, an IPR cell has also been made functional at the centre. Besides these, a video conferencing facility to hold online meetings and interact with various stakeholders has been set up.

During this period the centre has signed three MoUs including Indigram Labs Foundation (ILF), New Delhi, Sabudh Foundation, Mohali, Punjab and Start Up Punjab, Chandigarh. The centre has also established a strong academic partnership with Mission Innovate Punjab, State Council for Science & Technology, Chandigarh for start-up support, capacity building and outreach activities. The Centre has also been identified by Punjab Agro Industries Corporation as one of the mentor Institutes for the newly planned Incubation Center for pickle, murabba, amla candy & sharbet at the Primary Processing Center set up at village Verka, Near Verka Chowk, Amritsar under PM FME Scheme.
