MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

between

Sardar Swaran Singh National Institute of Bio-Energy, Kapurthala and

Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar

WHEREAS, Sardar Swaran Singh National Institute of Bio-Energy (SSS-NIBE), an autonomous Institution of the Ministry of New & Renewable Energy, Government of India is engaged in research, design and development and consultancy in the field of Bio-energy including conversion of biomass into more common form of fuels such as Biogas, Biomass-briquetting, bio-oil, bio-ethanol, bio-hydrogen etc. Other activities include the R&D on biomass combustion, power generation, development of domestic cook stove program, testing centre of Bio-energy related devices, training to stake-holders etc.

WHEREAS the Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar (GNDU) was established at Amritsar on November 24, 1969 to mark the 500th birth anniversary of Sri Guru Nanak Dev Ji. It is both a residential and an affiliating university. In conceiving the future course of the University, the objectives enshrined in the Guru Nanak Dev University Act 1969, emphasized that the new University would make provision for imparting education and promoting research in the human ics, learned professions, sciences, especially of applied an its eventful history of 43 years has taken long strides in spreading the message of the California of Technology, Industrial Technology, Environment, Planning and Architecture.

WHEREAS both SSS-NIBE and GNL U now

- Recognizing the importance of research and development in the areas of Renewable Energy, especially, the Bio-energy, Environmental protection, Clean Energy Systems etc.
- Appreciating the need for creation of large reservoir of highly qualified manpower in all fields related to Bio-energy, Environment & Energy Engineering and Management.
- Desiring to club their effort by pooling their expertise and resources.

Renewable energy technology and Science with special emphasis on Bio-Energy.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises made herein and of good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which both SSS-NIBE and GNDU hereby acknowledge and sign a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU).

ARTICLE-I: SCOPE OF THE MoU

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This MoU the modalities and general conditions regarding collaboration between SSS-NIBE and GNDU for enhancing within the country, the availability of highly qualified manpower in Bio-Energy & environment without any prejudice to prevailing rules and regulations in SSS-NIBE and GNDU and without my disregard to any mechanism evolved and approved by the competent authorities under Govt. of India in so far such mechanism applies to SSS-NIBE and GNDU. The areas of cooperation can be extended through mutual consent.

ARTICLE-II: SCOPE OF ACADEMIC INTERACATION

Both SSS-NIBE and CNDU shall en ourage interaction between the Scientists, Research Fellows Faculty members and Students through the following arrangements:

- a) Exchange of personnel through deputation for limited periods are mutually agreed upon;
 - b) Both the institutes can prepare and submit joint research projects for funding to the funding agencies like-MNRE, DST, CSIR, BT, UGC, ICTE, etc. on mutually agreeable terms and conditions.
- c) Joint guidance of student projects/thesis in Bio-energy, Environment, Renewable Energy and other areas of National interest at GNDU by SSS-NIBE on mutually terms as listed below:
 - i) The student(s) registered for Ph.D. degree of CNDU will be allotted two Research Supervisors, one from each or the Argument Faculty member from GNDU and a Scientist from SSS-N
 - ii) The students will carry cu 1 york at SSS-NIBE and GNDU depending on facilities and requirements
 - iii) SSS-NIBE personnel, as well as research scholars, may also be allowed for their Ph.D. at GNDU, subject to availability of seats, research facilities and subject to their fulfilling eligibility criteria and all other academic requirements.
 - iv) There will be no restriction on the contents of the thesis and on publication of results of the thesis, subject to the condition that no Intellectual Property Rights is violated for any part of the work which will be decided with mutual consent.
 - v) Both SSS-NIBE and GNDU will be free independently carry out follow-up research on the thesis work conducted under his scheme.
 - vi) If the outcome of a project related to product 'evel oment, process, technology and design etc. which involves matter of secrecy and concern with security of the state and country the same will not be allowed for publication/printing in any form such as electronically/verbal etc. If the outcome of a project result into an intellectual property, for which can be secured, it will be decided on case to case basis. Similarly, sharing of expenditure in securing under the law will be decided on case to case after mut is consultation.

ARTICLE-III: SHARING OF FACILITIES

- a) SSS-NIBE and GNDU shall make provision to share their respective important R&D/Lab facilities in order to promote academic and research interaction in the areas of corporation.
- b) SSS-NIBE and GNDU shall permit the exchange of software and other materials, technology and emponents developed in-house in the areas of cooperation, if permissible within the rules governing the two Institutions.
- c) SSS-NIBE and GNDU shall provide access to the library facilities to Scientists, Faculty members and Students as per the prevailing rules/norms in the respective Institutes.

ARTICLE – IV: CO-ORDINATION OF THE PROGRAM INCLUDING FINANCIAL ARRANGEMENTS

- a) The collaboration program between SSS-NIBF and GNDU shall be coordinated by a coordination committee appointed by Director General/Vice Chancellor of both the Institutes.
- b) Financial arrangements for each specific conlaboration will be decided on a caseto-case basis and brought on record in each case after due approval from Heads of both the Institutes.

ARTICLE-V: EFFECTIVE DATE AND DURATION OF MoU

- a) This McU shall be effective from the date of its approval by competent authorities at both ends.
- b) The duration of MoU shall be for a period of 3 years from the effective date.
- c) During its tenancy, the MoU may be extended or terminated by a prior notice of not less than six months by either party. However, termination of the MoU will not in any manner affect the interests of the students/faculty/scientists who have been admitted to pursue a programme under the MoU.
- d) Any clause or article of the MoU may be modified or amended by mutual agreement of SSS-NIBE and GNDU.

ARTICLE-VI: INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS

Rights regarding publications, patents royalty, own rehip of software/design, product developed etc., under the scope of this MoU, shall be decided by the two parties on mutual consent.

ATICI E-VII: CONFIDENT ALITY

During the tenure of the MoU both SSS-NIBE and GNDU will maintain strict confidentiality and prevent disclosure of all the information and data exchanged under the scope of this MoU for any purpose than in accordance with this MoU.

Both SSS-NIBE and GNDU shall oind their respective personnel who come into possession or knowledge of any confidential information not to disclose the same to third parties without written approval of the disclosing party or use such confidential information for any use other than intended under this agreement or PROJECTS.

Further both SSS-NIBE and GNDU shall put in place adequate and reasonable measure to keep and store confidential information secure so as to prevent any unauthorized use.

CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION shall mean any propriet y information, data or facts belonging to PARTIES collectively or severally, disclosed by the disclosing party under this agreement or any subsequent agreement, whether in writing, verocal electronically, irrespective of the medium in which such information is stored, valid is marked confidential or with any other words having similar meaning by the disclosing party, or specifically agreed to be kept confidential by the parties or declared or identified to by the disclosing party before such disclosure or during the discussion. However confidential information shall not include any data or information which:

- a) Is or becomes publicly available though no fault of the receiving party.
- b) Is already in the rightful possession of receiving party prior to receipt of such data or information.
- c) Is independently developed by the receiving party without reference to the confidential information of disclosing party.
- d) Is rightfully obtained by the receiving party from a third party in the public domain
- e) Is disclosed with the written consent of the party whose information it is or
- f) Is disclosed pure ant to court order or other legal compulsion, after providing prior notice to the disclosing party.

ARTICLE-VIII: AMENDMENTS

Any amendment and/or Addenda to the AGREEMENT chall be in writing and signed by the PARTIES. Here to and shall only after such execution be deemed to form part of the agreement and have the effect of modifying the agreement to the extent required by such amendment of additional.

ARTICLE-IX: RESOLUTION OF DISPUTES

- a) This agreement shall take effect and be construed with the Laws of India and be subject to the jurisdiction of the courts at New Delhi/Chandigarh.
- b) The dispute or difference whatsoever arises between PARTIES in relation to or in connection with this agreement both the parties shall first rry to resolve the dispute/difference amicably between themselves, failing which the matter shall be referred to and settled through arbitration. The arbitration proceeding shall be held in accordance with the provision of Indian Arbitration and Reconc'liation ACT, 1996. The language of arbitration shall be English.

ARTICLE-X: MISCELLANEC'IS

- a) The heading and sub-hes, ing are inserted for convenience only and shall not affect the construction of this Agreement.
- b) Both SSS-NIBE and GNDU hall not, a ring the terms of this Agreement directly or indirectly, solicit or offer employment or engagement to any personnel of other party without the previous consent in writing of that other party.
- c) No failure to exercise and no delay in exercising, on the part of a Party, and right, remedy, power or privilege hereur der shall operate as a waiver thereof, nor shall any single or partial exercise thereof or the exercise of any other right, remedy, power or privilege. The rights, remedies, power and privileges herein provided are cumulative and not exclusive of any right, remedies, powers and privileges provided by law.
- d) After this Agreement has been signed, all preceding understanding/negotiations and correspondence pertaining to it shall become null and void.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

between

South Dakota School of Mines and Technology, USA and

Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar, India

Guru Nanak Dev University of India (hereafter referred to as "GNDU") and the South Dakota School of Mines and Technology of the USA (hereafter referred to as "SDSMT"), believe the development of collaborative academic, educational, and scientific goals are of mutual value, which are set forth in this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU).

All collaborative efforts will be entered into with due diligence given to ethical and professional considerations and standards. Cooperative activities will be developed on the basis of equality and reciprocity, and promoting sustainable partnerships.

Within fields that are mutually acceptable, the following general forms of cooperation will be pursued:

- Staff exchange and collaboration
 - The two institutions agree in principle to the possibility of exchanges by general staff (administrative and technical) and faculty members. The details of such arrangements will be negotiated at the appropriate time and will be governed by the institutional staffing rules and relevant approval processes. The participating institutions shall not be responsible for any private arrangements made by participating staff members concerning exchange of accommodation, vehicles, etc.
- Joint research activities and publications
 - Cooperative research is to be encouraged as individual scholars establish contact and develop mutual interests.
- Each party will encourage continuing education and professional development for teachers, professors, and academic staff, which may include
 - Visits for studying teaching principles and methods
 - Exchange of academic materials and other information
 - Participation in seminars, congresses and meetings
 - Organizing training workshops
- Student exchange
 - Each party will recommend potential students to participate in an exchange for the matriculation of the other university's appropriate academic programs on a reciprocal basis. The student's acceptance is subject to approval by the host university. The host institution will provide guidance and identify options for students in locating living accommodations and will place the students in

appropriate academic programs. Unless otherwise agreed, students will be responsible for meeting their own costs of living and pay tuition and fees to the host institution.

GNDU and SDSMT agree to continue discussions on further cooperative activities as opportunities arise. Both institutions recognize that collaborative efforts will be of mutual benefit and will contribute to an enduring institutional linkage for cooperation in education and research.

Detailed descriptions of additional activities shall be defined in a separate addendum to the MOU. The addendum will include detailed information on the activity, including legal considerations for each university's home country and governing body.

Both universities agree that all additional activities are dependent on the availability of funds. Both universities agree to seek financial support for the activities stated in this MOU.

This Memorandum of Understanding becomes effective on the date of signature. It is valid for five years with the understanding that it can be terminated by either party with six months notice, unless an earlier termination is mutually agreed upon. Revisions or modifications may be proposed at any time, effective from the date of written agreement signed by both parties.

REVALIDATION OF MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN INSTITUTE OF HIMALAYAN BIORESOURCE TECHNOLOGY (IHBT) AND GURU NANAK DEV UNIVERSITY (GNDU)

PREAMBLE:

The Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR) and the University Grants Commission (UGC) have realized the need for a close linkage between the National Laboratories and the Universities in terms of research and academic activities. In compliance to this idea, the Institute of Himalayan Bioresource Technology (IHBT), Palampur and Guru Nanak Dev University (GNDU), Amritsar signed Memorandum of Understanding MoU on 7th June, 1997 at IHBT, Palampur in the presence of Dr. R.A. Mashelker, Director General CSIR and Secretary Science & Technology, Government of India to initiate academic and research programmes between the two Institutions in the broad areas of biosciences, biotechnology and chemical sciences. Considering the performance under the aforesaid agreement, the two Institutions have decided to revalidate the MoU between GNDU (Amritsar) and IHBT (Palampur) as per the following terms and conditions:

1. GENERAL:

- IHBT scientists will participate in the teaching programmes of the 1.1 Departments of Botanical & Environmental Science, Biotechnology, Human Genetics, Microbiology, Molecular Biology & Biochemistry, Zoology, Chemistry, and Pharmaceutical Sciences, GNDU upon request and subject mutual convenience.
- GNDU will recognize IHBT as an accredited centre for pursuing research 1.2 leading to Ph.D degree in the subjects given under para 1.1. For the purpose, students eligible for Ph.D. under the Ordinances of the university would be allowed to register for Ph.D. in the respective faculties.
- IHBT scientists and faculty members of the concerned departments of 1.3 GNDU will work towards joint research projects, thereby mutually using research facilities at IHBT and GNDU.
- GNDU shall bestow upon the Director, IHBT, the status and powers of 1.4 the Head of the Department (HOD) of the University for academic and research purposes.
- GNDU will recognize and accredit IHBT scientists for guiding research 1.5 leading to Ph.D. degrees. If need be Board of Control/Research Degree Committee shall recommend a supervisor from the GNDU.
- In case of any academic lapses, GNDU will bring the matter to the notice 1.6 of the Director, IHBT for initiating necessary action.

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- GNDU will also confer the status of Adjunct Professor, Adjunct Reader 1.7 and Adjunct Lecturer on IHBT scientists involved in common programmes depending upon their qualification and designations.
- The faculty and students of the concerned departments of GNDU shall be 1.8 enrolled as ad-hoc members of the library of the IHBT. While using IHBT library facilities they shall be governed by the rules and regulations as operative in IHBT. Scientists and Ph.D. students of IHBT shall likewise be given ad- hoc membership of the GNDU library.
- The faculty and students of the concerned departments of GNDU shall be 1.9 issued temporary identity cards, by IHBT as per IHBT rules, so as to provide them an unhindered access to lab and other facilities of the Institute.
- The aforesaid faculty and students of GNDU shall be provided Photostat 2.0 facilities on the same terms and conditions as are provided to the IHBT staff and research fellows.
- IHBT shall arrange Hostel/Guest House accommodation for GNDU 2.1 students coming to IHBT for summer trainings.

2. ACADEMIC PROGRAMMES

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- For the mutual benefit of the two Institutions i.e. IHBT and GNDU, there 2.1 will be exchange of IHBT scientists and faculty members of the concerned departments of GNDU.
- While registering IHBT scientists for Ph.D. degree, the ordinances related 2.2 to Ph.D. of GNDU will be valid including the appointment of supervisors and co-supervisors.
- IHBT and GNDU will work closely to generate appropriately trained 2.3 manpower in the areas of Science & Technology through organization of formal academic curricula, symposia, short-term training courses etc.
- IHBT will provide summer training facilities to students (not more than 2.4 10 at a time) and IHBT scientists will help in the preparation of teaching material for these students.
- IHBT scientists will assist in the evaluation of students performance in 2.5 theory as well as practical classes.
- Director IHBT will nominate one member each on various Research 2.6 Degree Committees (RDC) and two members on Research Degree Board (RDB) of GNDU.
- During RDC meetings, external guides of candidates working in IHBT 2.7 shall be invited. 2 ml

It is agreed that the progress of this MoU shall be monitored by the Review Committee comprising of Vice-Chancellor, GNDU and Director, IHBT through periodic meetings.

This MoU is valid for a period of 5 (five) years starting ... 2... 2011 subject to further extension on mutually agreed terms and conditions. Any mid term change/alteration in the terms and conditions of MoU as suggested by the Review Committee shall also be deemed to be valid for both the Institutions. The MoU may be terminated if any of the parties wants to withdraw from it. However, the Ph. D students admitted under the MoU_shall be governed by the same terms and conditions as prevailing at the time of signing of this MoU, till the completion of their degrees under the ordinances of GNDU.

This **Agreement** is being entered into on **27**th day of **March** 2017 between **Faculty of Physical Planning and Architecture, Guru Nanak Dev University**, located at Grand Trunk Road, Off NH 1, Amritsar, Punjab-143005, represented by Registrar, Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar on the one part,

and

Centre for Science and Environment, located at 41, Tughlakabad Institutional Area, New Delhi, 110062 (hereinafter referred to as 'CSE'), legally represented by its Executive Director on the other part.

BACKGROUND

Guru Ramdas School of Planning (GRDSP) and Department of Architecture, represented by Faculty of Physical Planning and Architecture is affiliated to Guru Nanak Dev University and approved by AICTE, UGC, ITPI, Council of Architecture (CoA). It is one of the premier institutions in northwest India to impart education and training in the field of Urban Planning and Regional Planning and Architecture, Urban Design and Infrastructure Planning. The schools offer Bachelor and Master Degree in the respective fields.

Centre for Science and Environment (CSE) is a non-governmental, independent policy research institution based in Delhi that was started in 1981 by the late Anil Agarwal, a leading figure in India's environment movement. For more than three decades now, CSE has helped shape policies and build public awareness to bring change in areas of pollution mitigation and public health security, low carbon development, natural resource management and livelihood security to make growth sustainable and inclusive. CSE's Sustainable Building and Habitat Programme is designed to reduce energy and resource consumption, waste generation and emissions from urban development. The programme seeks to promote a collaborative system of research, training and curriculum development in issues related to sustainable development in built environment.

The two institutions agree to jointly promote the cause of sustainable habitat in built sector focusing sustainability in built schemes of buildings and area planning.

POINT 1: SPECIFIC PURPOSE OF AGREEMENT

Jointly we agree to cooperate in the following areas: -

1.1 Knowledge Partnership

CSE will act as the knowledge partner of Faculty of Physical Planning and Architecture to help in the inclusion of sustainability content in the curriculum.CSE shall assist Faculty of Physical Planning and Architecture in providing technical, advisory, knowledge and capacity building support to facilitate handholding in course development and helping build capacities through requisite level of training programme and workshops for students and faculty.

1.2 Capacity Building and Training Activities

CSE agrees to conduct three seminar/trainings and one workshop in a calendar year 2017-18 for students and nominated faculty of Faculty of Physical Planning and Architecture. While the two trainings and one workshop will be held at the Anil Agarwal Environment Training Institute (AAETI), a residential research, training and demonstration 'green campus' located in Nimli in Dist. Alwar, Rajasthan, while one seminar/training will be held on the campus of the GNDU Amritsar.

1.3 Development of Course Modules

CSE will assist Faculty of Physical Planning and Architecture in preparing specific course modules to be offered as mandatory or elective courses in line with model guidelines focused and integrated on sustainable and environment related topics under the existing curriculum. Faculty of Physical Planning and Architecture agrees to make efforts to ensure that 10% of students' dissertation or thesis should be aligned with sustainability guidelines in the built sector.

1.4 Needs-based Research and Capacity Building

Based on mutual need, Institutions shall explore additional ways of collaborating to help strengthen the research and capacities. Activities may include joint research, workshops, seminars and conferences, among other potential areas of cooperation in the field of sustainable habitats. The details of such arrangement shall be negotiated at the

appropriate time on a case-to-case basis and be governed by the relevant approval processes.

POINT 2: RESPONSIBILITIES

Both institutions acknowledge the mutual alignment of their institutional vision, mission and values. Both organizations commit themselves to jointly accomplish the goals of the Capacity Building Project.

- 2.1 Sharing of information: Both Faculty of Physical Planning and Architecture and CSE shall each maintain their respective lawful status with the appropriate authorities for the duration of the Agreement. Either institutions shall keep the other informed of any change whatsoever occurring in the engagement plan which may affect the timely delivery of services and accomplishment of project outcomes.
- 2.2 Financial support: For training and workshop at CSE's AAETI campus, CSE will not charge any course fee for the trainings and workshop including field visits (if any), and also agrees to cover the cost of accommodation and meals during the period of said training and workshop. Faculty of Physical Planning and Architecture agrees to cover travel costs of its faculty and/or students to the CSE office and training facilities. For seminar/training at GNDU campus Amritsar, CSE will not charge any course fee for the trainings including field visits (if any), and also agrees to cover the cost of accommodation and meals during the period of said training and workshop, although venue for hosting such events shall be arranged by the Faculty of Physical Planning and Architecture. For long term viability and sustainability of the Capacity Building Project, Institutions agree to explore and identify respective funding opportunities.
- **2.3 Focal Person:** Both institutions shall each assign a designated focal person (Senior Professor from Departments and Senior official from CSE) to provide support to the project, whose duties include supporting the visits of either institutions, or who will also arrange training and logistics for the smooth implementation of the Project.

POINT 3: LANGUAGE

All written correspondence and activities relating to the project shall be transacted in the English Language.

POINT 4: ACCOUNTABILITY AND COMPLIANCE

The said project shall be implemented in line with relevant policies and law of the Government of India, and shall comply with the institutional guidelines of both Institutions. This AGREEMENT is not binding or legal enforceable, does not impose enforceability of obligation upon the Institutions and does not grant any rights.

POINT 5: CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION AND COPYRIGHT

- 5.1 Neither Institution shall disclose confidential information of the other party to any person or third-party or use of such confidential information for its own purpose at any time without the written consent of the other party.
- 5.2 Any idea, innovation, training materials, management processes or documentation arising out of this collaboration shall be the intellectual property of both Institutions. Both Institutions may however use such intellectual materials, but with appropriate acknowledgement to the contributions made by either party.

POINT 6: FORCE MAJEURE

No Institution covered under this agreement shall be liable for any failure to perform its obligation where such failure is a result of Acts of God, which are here defined as force majeure.

POINT 7: DURATION AND TERMINATION

This AGREEMENT shall come into effect on the date of signature by both Institutions and shall remain in force for an initial period of three (3) years, unless otherwise terminated by mutual consent, and with 30 days prior written notice to the other Institution.

POINT 8: DISPUTE RESOLUTION

Both Institutions agreed that if there is any dispute of difference between both arising out of the Agreement or in the interpretation of any of the provision thereof, they shall endeavour to meet in an effort to resolve such dispute by discussion, within 30 days of such dispute arising, failing such resolution then the parties in dispute shall refer at their costs the dispute to a mutually to the senior executive/faculty agreed Institutions.

NIPER and **DOPS** individually referred to herein as a 'party' and collectively as the 'parties'. The Department of Pharmaceutical Sciences (**DOPS**) of Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar will be the participating department on behalf of Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar.

A: Preamble:

Whereas, DOPS, Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar is one of the premier institution of Pharmaceutical Education and Research in the country. Department of Pharmaceutical Sciences was established in 1995 with dual objective of providing trained manpower for rapidly expanding pharmaceuticals and allied chemical industries and to carryout research in advanced areas of pharmaceutical sciences. Department has made significant progress in realization of these objectives. The department offers a four year B. Pharmacy degree course, two year M. Pharm. Courses and PhD course. The department is equipped with modern facilities for effective practical training of the students. The department has ongoing research programmes in Medicinal Chemistry, Synthetic Organic Chemistry, Pharmaceutical formulation & Product development and Pharmacological Evaluation of Natural products funded by various national agencies. Students passing out from this department are being readily accepted by the industry all over the country and many of them have taken up research/teaching assignments in India and abroad.

Whereas, **NIPER** is an acclaimed national research institute of the country engaged in the education research activity in several contemporary areas of pharmaceutical sciences especially pharmaceutics, pharmacognosy, pharmaceutical chemistry, pharmaceutical biotechnology and pharmacology. It involves in R&D as well as human resource development in a wide range of topics in pharmaceutical sciences and technologies.NIPER is also involved in toning up the level of pharmaceutical education and research by training the future teachers, research scientists and managers for the industry and profession.

Whereas, it is highly desirable to develop multi-disciplinary training and research through involvement and integration of diverse but relevant disciplines through synergy and knowledge sharing, and ensure dissemination of knowledge to all corners of the country;

Both parties felt that a sustained, synergetic and effective collaboration between **DoPS** and **NIPER** will enhance the strength, and add value to, the efforts of each party;

The Parties therefore agree on the objective of creating an institutional framework for enriching scientific endeavors in mutually agreed fields of research and training with the following broad objectives:

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B: Broad Objectives:

- 1. To develop synergetic collaborations in a resource-sharing and knowledge-sharing environment in various areas of science and technology;
- 2. To develop academic programmes and share expertise in training and other academic activities through joint organization of events, joint guidance of students, exchange of faculty and students, etc.;
- 3. To develop research programmes for funding by internal, national and international agencies;
- To design and develop outreach activities and programmes for various mutually identified goals of **DOPS** and **NIPER**;
- 5. To develop collaborations in laboratories and equipments sharing as well as publications and patents (if any);

C: Mode of Operation:

Both parties will provide necessary support for effective implementation of the MoU within the institutional rules and procedures

- 1. This MoU shall be effective from the date it is signed by both the Parties.
- 2. Within the broad framework of the MoU, a **NIPER**, and **DOPS** can develop joint research, academic or scientific programmes, exchanges, development of facilities, etc.
- 3. Any financial commitment for joint activities under this MoU shall be subject to the approval by the competent authority of the respective organizations.
- 4. The activities under this MoU shall be coordinated, monitored and recorded by an Internal Coordination Committee constituted of members nominated by both parties; each organization will appoint an internal coordinator who will organize joint meetings at regular intervals at mutually agreed locations and maintain records of agreements, work plan and progress.
- 5. The visitors will be bound by the Rules and Regulations as well as code of conduct of the host institution.
- 6. The Internal Coordination Committee will also formulate the procedure for exchange of students, faculty and other visitors, in accordance with the Rules of the host participating institutions as defined in preamble.
- 7. The mode and quantum of resource sharing will be decided based on recommendation of the Internal Coordination Committee on the case to case basis, subject to approval of competent authority as required.
- 8. The Internal Coordination Committee will formulate action plans at its meetings and communicate for information and necessary approvals by the concerned authorities.
- 9. In case of transfer/installation of equipments and other capital assets, an additional document of commitments shall have to be signed by the

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receiving institute. Such a transfer will be as per norms of both institutions.

D: Obligations of the Parties

- 1. In accordance with the clause C-4 as above, Prof. (Dr.) Preet Mohinder Singh Bedi will be the internal Coordinator from DOPS, GNDU Amritsar, whereas, Director, NIPER, Mohali or a person nominated by the Director, NIPER will be the internal coordinator from NIPER, Mohali
- 2. Each party shall nominate members to the Internal Coordination Committee within 15 days of signing the MoU.
- 3. Each Party shall provide all necessary support at its disposal and as allowed by its institutional Rules, for implementing this MoU effectively.
- 4. DoPS and NIPER will recognize their scientists as guides/co-guide(s) as per the provisions of pertaining ordinance of organization for students registered at DoPS/NIPER for PhD programme.
- NIPER will train & guide students and faculties from DoPS based on need and availability of resources as per institutional procedure.
- 3. The Parties shall share knowledge and facilities within the institutional Rules of each Party, to:
- (a) Provide access to libraries, archives, research laboratories and other facilities;
- (b) Provide access to high-end instruments and equipments as mutually agreed.
- (c) Encourage joint discussions on new developments, formulation of academic and writing of scientific and technical papers and projects;
- (d) Share knowledge/ information and publications/magazines/literature as may be essential for the academic pursuit;
- (e) Provide logistical support/guest house facility for the scientists/experts involved in this MoU at locations of both parties by treating them official guests of their respective institution AND.
- (g) No financial commitment from either Organization shall be assumed unless a formal approval/acceptance to that effect has been accorded through signed documents by both the Organizations.

E: Duration and Termination

- This MoU shall remain in force initially for a period of three years, however, where after, it may be renewed automatically for an extended for three years period unless any of the parties seeks termination in writing.
- This MoU may be terminated prior to the expiry of the MoU as indicated above with three months notice in writing and with the written consent of the Heads of the two organizations.
- 3. Termination of this MoU between the participating components shall not terminate the agreementsentered between the **Parties** with any third parties which the **Parties** may have entered into in executing the

After termination of MoU, neither of the **Parties** will be responsible for any losses, financial or otherwise, which the other **Party** may suffer. F: Data Sharing and Intellectual Property Rights

- 1. No rights in Industrial and/or Intellectual Property (Including without limitation, letters, patent, registered design, software copyrights, trademark and copyright) owned by the **Parties** on the date of signature of this MoU and independently developed on their part are hereby granted by the owning **Party** to the other **Party**, nor shall any such rights be deemed to be granted except specified by the owning **Party** in writing.
- 2. The Intellectual Property Rights in respect of joint project will be decided on case-to-case basis. **Parties** will mutually decide on sharing of required information by way of joint publication in journals and seminars or workshops etc. All publications resulting from the collaboration between the **Parties** will be mentioned in the scientific reports of either **Party**.
- 3. Sharing of any data generated (either observational or computational) under the aegis of this MoU shall be as per the provisions of the specific project/programmme
- 4. Each Party shall duly acknowledge the contribution/involvement of the other Party in a given activity in its bulletins/publications/media release/outreach and any other official communication.
- 5. Every member of both Parties in any activity under the aegis of this MoU shall abide by the prevailing policies of Govt. of India with respect to classified information/data. During the tenure of this MoU including extension ,if any and for *Five years* thereafter, *Parties* undertake on their behalf and on behalf of their employees or representatives or associates to maintain strict confidentiality and prevent disclosure thereof to any third party, all the information and data exchanged or generated during the operation of MoU.

G: GENERAL PROVISIONS

- 1. Neither **Party** shall assign, or in any manner, transfer its interest or any part thereof in this MoU, except to wholly owned subsidiaries and agreed explicitly to that effect in writing. This MoU shall be binding on and inure to the benefit of the **Parties** hereto and their respective heirs, personal representatives, successors and assignees; and,
- 2. This MoU constitutes the entire understanding between the **Parties** relating to the subject matter hereof and supersedes and cancels any and all previous or collateral MoUs, negotiations, commitments, representations or understandings between the **Parties** with respect to this MoU, and the subject matter hereof. If any of the provisions of this MoU are determined to be invalid under applicable law, they are, to that extent, deemed omitted. The invalidity of any portion of this MoU shall not render any other portion invalid; and,

Nothing in this MoU shall be construed to grant either **Party** the right to make commitments of any kind for or on behalf of the other without the other's prior written consent.

H: FORCE MAJEURE

Neither **Parties** shall be held responsible for non-fulfillment of their respective obligations under this MoU due to the exigency of one or more of the Force Majeure events such as, but not limited to, the acts of God, War, Flood, Earthquake, Strikes, Lockouts, Epidemic, Riots, Civil commotions etc. provided on the occurrence and cessation of any such event the **Party** affected thereby shall give a notice in writing to the other **Party** within 30 (Thirty) days of such occurrence or cessation. If the Force Majeure conditions continue beyond 6 (six) months, the **Parties** shall jointly decide about the future course of action.

J: GOVERNING LAWS AND DISPUTES RESOLUTION

- 1. This MoU shall, in all respects, be governed by and construed in all respects in accordance with the laws of the Republic of India.
- 2. This MoU is to create a framework for enriching scientific endeavors in mutually agreed fields of research through collaboration in developing and implementing new academic and research programmes and faculty and students exchange. Hence any question, doubt or dispute arising out of the interpretation of any term or usage herein or on the implementation and functioning of the various understandings forming a part of this MoU shall be resolved by the Executive Heads of the two organizations or their authorized representatives for the purpose mentioned herein by discussions and negotiations based on consensus in the spirit of developing and strengthening the mutual relationships.
- 3. Any unresolved dispute if any, shall be referred toDirector, NIPER, Mohali AND Dr. Preet Mohinder Singh Bedi, Professor & Head, DOPS, GNDU, Amritsar, and an independent arbitrator involved with mutual consent in accordance with **Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996** and rules framed thereof. Arbitration shall be conducted at the place that may be mutually decided by both parties. The decision of arbitrators so reached shall be final and binding on both the parties.

THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (the "MOU") is entered at Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar on 01.02.2018

Between

Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar 143005, Punjab which was established on November 24, 1969, has a long tradition of pursuing excellence in teaching and research in science and technology, humanities, social sciences, performing arts and sports. The University supports excellence and innovation in academic programmes, promotes excellence in research, scholarship and teaching.

OCM, Amritsar (Punjab) which is a well revered for its quality credentials and a leading name in the fabrics, apparel and fashion industry.

OCM and **GNDU** individually referred to herein as a 'party' and collectively as the 'parties'.

A: Preamble:

Guru Nanak Dev University today feels proud of 35 academic departments at the University Campus and 148 affiliated colleges and 71 Associate Institutes, most are situated in the rural areas. In the field of Science and Technology, University is one of the leading institutions in North India. Our faculty members have bagged prestigious projects from the apex bodies like the DOT, CSIR, BARC and other organizations worth crores of rupees. Recently BARC has established a Nodal Calibration Centre at the campus. This is one of the four centres established all over the country. C: Mode of Operation:

Both parties will provide necessary support for effective implementation of the MoU within the institutional rules and procedures

- 1. This MoU shall be effective from the date it is signed by both the Parties.
- 2. Within the broad framework of the MoU, **OCM**, and **GNDU** can develop joint academic and field programmes and share expertise in training and other academic activities, development of facilities, etc.
- 3. Any financial commitment for joint activities under this MoU shall be subject to the approval by the competent authority of the respective organizations.
- 4. The activities under this MoU shall be coordinated, monitored and recorded by an Internal Coordination Committee constituted of members nominated by both parties; each organization will appoint an internal coordinator who will organize joint meetings at regular intervals at mutually agreed locations and maintain records of agreements, work plan and progress.
- 5. The visitors will be bound by the Rules and Regulations for Boarding/lodging as well as code of conduct of the host institution.
- 6. The Internal Coordination Committee will also formulate the procedure for training and placement of students, exchange of experts and other visitors, in accordance with the Rules of the host participating institutions as defined in preamble.
- 7. The mode and quantum of resource sharing will be decided based on recommendation of the Internal Coordination Committee on the case to case basis, subject to approval of competent authority as required.

- 8. The Internal Coordination Committee will formulate action plans at its meetings and communicate for information and necessary approvals by the concerned authorities.
- 9. In case of transfer/installation of equipments and other capital assets, an additional document of commitments shall have to be signed by the receiving institute. Such a transfer will be as per norms of both institutions.

D: Obligations of the Parties

- 1. In accordance with the clause C-4 as above, Head, Department of Chemistry, GNDU, Amritsar will be the internal Coordinator from GNDU Amritsar, whereas, CEO, OCM, Amritsar or a person nominated by the Director, OCM will be the internal coordinator from OCM, Amritsar.
- 2. Each party shall nominate seven members to the Internal Coordination Committee within 15 days of signing the MoU.
- 3. Each Party shall provide all necessary support at its disposal and as allowed by its institutional Rules, for implementing this MoU effectively.
- 4. **OCM** will train & guide students and faculties on complimentary basis from **GNDU** based on need and availability of resources as per institutional procedure.
- 5. The Parties shall share knowledge and facilities within the institutional Rules of each Party, to:
 - (a) Provide access to libraries, archives, research laboratories and other facilities;
 - (b) Provide access to high-end instruments and equipments as mutually agreed.
 - (c) Encourage joint discussions on new developments, formulation of academic and writing of scientific and technical papers and projects;
 - (d) Share knowledge/ information and publications/magazines/literature as may be essential for the academic pursuit;
 - (e) Provide logistical support/guest house facility for the scientists/experts involved in this MoU at locations of both parties by treating them official guests of their respective institution AND.
 - (g) No financial commitment from either Organization shall be assumed unless a formal approval/acceptance to that effect has been accorded through signed documents by both the Organizations.

E: Duration and Termination

- 1. This MoU shall remain in force initially for a period of three years, however, where after, it may be renewed automatically for an extended for three years period unless any of the parties seeks termination in writing.
- 2. This MoU may be terminated prior to the expiry of the MoU as indicated above with three months prior notice in writing and with the written consent of the Heads of the two organizations.
- 3. Termination of this MoU between the participating components shall not terminate the agreements entered between the **Parties** with any third parties which the **Parties** may have entered into in executing the agreements under this MoU; **the Parties** shall continue to obtain the benefits of such agreement for three years. After termination of MoU, neither of the **Parties** will be responsible for any losses, financial or otherwise, which the other **Party** may suffer. Upon termination or expiry of the MoU, **Parties** are obliged to keep the information confidential, as agreed above.

F: Data Sharing and Intellectual Property Rights

- 1. No rights in Industrial and/or Intellectual Property (Including without limitation, letters, patent, registered design, software copyrights, trademark and copyright) owned by the **Parties** on the date of signature of this MoU and independently developed on their part are hereby granted by the owning **Party** to the other **Party**, nor shall any such rights be deemed to be granted except specified by the owning **Party** in writing.
- 2. The Intellectual Property Rights in respect of joint project will be decided on case-to-case basis.
- 3. Sharing of any data generated (either observational or computational) under the aegis of this MoU shall be as per the provisions of the specific project/programmme
- 4. Each Party shall duly acknowledge the contribution/involvement of the other Party in a given activity in its bulletins/publications/media release/outreach and any other official communication.
- 5. Every member of both Parties in any activity under the aegis of this MoU shall abide by the prevailing policies of Govt. of India with respect to classified information/data. During the tenure of this MoU including extension ,if any and

for *Five years* thereafter, *Parties* undertake on their behalf and on behalf of their employees or representatives or associates to maintain strict confidentiality and prevent disclosure thereof to any third party, all the information and data exchanged or generated during the operation of MoU.

G: GENERAL PROVISIONS

- 1. Neither **Party** shall assign, or in any manner, transfer its interest or any part thereof in this MoU, except to wholly owned subsidiaries and agreed explicitly to that effect in writing. This MoU shall be binding on and inure to the benefit of the **Parties** hereto and their respective heirs, personal representatives, successors and assignees; and,
- 2. This MoU constitutes the entire understanding between the **Parties** relating to the subject matter hereof and supersedes and cancels any and all previous or collateral MoUs, negotiations, commitments, representations or understandings between the **Parties** with respect to this MoU, and the subject matter hereof. If any of the provisions of this MoU are determined to be invalid under applicable law, they are, to that extent, deemed omitted. The invalidity of any portion of this MoU shall not render any other portion invalid; and,
- 3. No amendments or modifications of this MoU shall be valid unless they are made in writing by both the **Parties** or their authorized representatives and specifically stating the same to be an amendment of this MoU. The modifications/changes shall be effective from the date on which they are made or executed unless otherwise agreed to.
- 4. This MoU is not intended to constitute, create, give effect to, or otherwise recognize a joint venture, partnership, or formal business organization of any kind, and the rights and obligations of the **Parties** shall be only those expressly set forth herein. Nothing in this MoU shall be construed to grant either **Party** the right to make commitments of any kind for or on behalf of the other without the other's prior written consent.

H: FORCE MAJEURE

Neither **Parties** shall be held responsible for non-fulfillment of their respective obligations under this MoU due to the exigency of one or more of the Force Majeure events such as, but not limited to, the acts of God, War, Flood, Earthquake, Strikes, Lockouts, Epidemic, Riots, Civil commotions etc. provided on the occurrence and cessation of any such event the **Party** affected thereby shall give a notice in writing to the other **Party** within 30 (Thirty) days of such occurrence or cessation. If the Force Majeure conditions continue beyond 6 (six) months, the **Parties** shall jointly decide about the future course of action.

J: GOVERNING LAWS AND DISPUTES RESOLUTION

- 1. This MoU shall, in all respects, be governed by and construed in all respects in accordance with the laws of the Republic of India.
- 2. This MoU is to create a framework for enriching scientific endeavors in mutually agreed fields of research through collaboration in developing and implementing new academic and research programmes and faculty and students exchange. Hence any question, doubt or dispute arising out of the interpretation of any term or usage herein or on the implementation and functioning of the various understandings forming a part of this MoU shall be resolved by in the first place the Executive Heads of the two organizations or their authorized representatives for the purpose mentioned herein by discussions and negotiations based on consensus in the spirit of developing and strengthening the mutual relationships.
- 3.Unresolved dispute if any, shall be referred to Director OCM AND Cordinator, UILP, GNDU, Amritsar, and an independent arbitrator to be appointed with mutual consent in accordance with **Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996** and rules framed thereof. Arbitration shall be conducted at Amritsar. The decision of arbitrators so reached shall be final and binding on both the parties.
- 4. Each clause of this MoU is severable and if one clause is rendered illegal or is severed, it will not render the whole MOU illegal and all clauses except severed clause shall be valid & binding between two parties.

F: SEAL OF THE PARTIES

Memorandum of understanding (MoU) Mentoring Relationship

Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar (GNDU) & Meritorious School, Amritsar

Meritorious School, Amritsar functions under the 'Society of Quality Education for Poor and Meritorious Students of Punjab'. These schools are fully Co-Ed residential schools for 10+1 and 10+2 classes meant for children who have studied in Govt schools. Capacity of the school is for 1000 with 60:40 ratio of girls and boys. The society provides total free education including boarding and lodging and is fully funded by the Punjab Govt.

2. We, the mentor and mentee are both voluntarily entering into this mentoring relationship and have mutually agreed upon the terms and conditions of our relationship as outlined below. It is anticipated that specific goals of the mentoring relationship will develop and evolve over time. Below are some examples of areas wherein the mentor may provide advice, assistance and encouragement. Mentoring relationship may be modified as the relationship moves forward.

3. Teaching

- a) Discussing ways to enhance teaching skills.
- b) Identifying opportunities, resources and workshops for skill development.
- c) Providing feedback on students' class evaluations and other presentations.
- d) Refresher courses for professional growth.
- e) Practical knowledge of various streams (Science and Commerce) through seminars in school for both teachers and students.

4. Internships of M. Ed. students of GNDU;

a) M. Ed. students for internship phase can be allotted to the school.

- b) The school will assist the University in evaluation of the interns' performance;
- c) The university and the school will work together to determine potential policy to improve outcomes.
- d) The partnership will provide mentoring and supervision for interns throughout their internship; including both the host principal and a university supervisor;

5. Professional Development

- a) Assisting by identifying professional associations and conferences.
- b) Nominate mentee for awards that are appropriate for their fields, work and career level where essential.
- c) Referring mentee to skill development workshops; and resources as needed.

6. Balancing work and life.

- a) Provide general advice on balancing work and non-work activities.
- Inform mentee of university resource available to promote individuals all round development.
- c) Invite/encourage to join in house professional and non-professional activities.
- 7. Networking--Linking the mentee with potential collaborators and leaders within the GNDU.

8. Accountability

Although the mentor may provide advice in many areas, it is the responsibility of the mentee to develop and achieve specific goals to meet the standards for productivity and promotion. This mentoring relationship is to be promoted with the overall concurrence of the Meritorious Society, SAS Nagar.

9. Frequency of Contact and Documentation

Between

Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar 143005, Punjab which was established on November 24, 1969, has a long tradition of pursuing excellence in teaching and research in science and technology, humanities, social sciences, performing arts and sports. The University supports excellence and innovation in academic programmes, promotes excellence in research, scholarship and teaching.

RANJIT VILAS, Amritsar (Punjab) which is a well known name in the hospitality & Tourism Industry..

RANJIT VILAS and GNDU individually referred to herein as a 'party' and collectively as the 'parties'.

A: Preamble:

Guru Nanak Dev University today feels proud of 35 academic departments at the University Campus and 148 affiliated colleges and 71 Associate Institutes, most are situated in the rural areas. In the field of Science and Technology, University is one of the leading institutions in North India. Our faculty members have bagged prestigious projects from the apex bodies like the DOT, CSIR, BARC and other organizations worth crores of rupees. The Parties therefore agree on the objective of creating an institutional framework for enriching scientific endeavors in mutually agreed fields of research and training with the following broad objectives:

B: Broad Objectives:

- 1. Create a strong connection between Ranjit Vilas & GNDU;
- 2. To develop synergetic collaborations in a resource-sharing and knowledge-sharing environment in Tourism & Hospitality Industry.
- 3. To develop academic programmes and share expertise in training and other academic activities through joint organization of events;
- 4. To design and develop outreach activities and programmes for various mutually identified goals of **GNDU** and **RANJIT VILAS**;
- 5. To develop collaborations with different Travel Agency and tourism Department for promoting Tourism and Hospitality Industry.

The different verticals to associate is highlighted below -

Provided by RANJIT VILAS

- Hospitality Industry related:
 - a. Internships, for the training of fresh students in various department of Hospitality like Receptions desk, House-keeping and restaurant (Kitchen) department.
 - b. Tourism Industry experience related: To Provide Tourism practical experience with the foreign delegates to trained the fresh students for giving experience of escorting.

Specific to certain curriculums, a batch-wise mill visit could be arranged

- c. Guest lectures: Lectures to be made available for the students from the renowned Officials of Hospitality and Tourism Industry.
 - d. Skill requirement
 - i. Placement drives
 If there are openings/ opportunities, Ranjit Vilas will be part of placement drives
 - Ranjit Vilas could possibly introduce a flexible/ vocational curriculum to support in-house requirements
 - e. Educational stipends to the under privileged by Ranjit Vilas

C: Mode of Operation:

Both parties will provide necessary support for effective implementation of the MoU within the institutional rules and procedures

- 1. This MoU shall be effective from the date it is signed by both the Parties.
- 2. Within the broad framework of the MoU, RANJIT VILAS, and GNDU can develop joint academic and field programmes and share expertise in training and other academic activities, development of facilities, etc.
- 3. Any financial commitment for joint activities under this MoU shall be subject to the approval by the competent authority of the respective organizations.
- 4. The activities under this MoU shall be coordinated, monitored and recorded by an Internal Coordination Committee constituted of members nominated by both parties; each organization will appoint an internal coordinator who will organize joint meetings at regular intervals at mutually agreed locations and maintain records of agreements, work plan and progress.
- 5. The Internal Coordination Committee will also formulate the procedure for training and placement of students, exchange of experts and other visitors, in accordance with the Rules of the host participating institutions as defined in preamble.
- 6. The mode and quantum of resource sharing will be decided based on recommendation of the Internal Coordination Committee on the case to case basis, subject to approval of competent authority as required.

D: Obligations of the Parties

- 1. In accordance with the clause C-4 as above, Coordinator, UILP, GNDU, Amritsar will be the internal Coordinator from GNDU Amritsar, whereas, the Sh. Vikram Singh makhni (One of the partner) of India House Tours & Travels, Amritsar or a person nominated by him will be the internal coordinator from India House Tours & Travels, Amritsar.
- 2. Each party shall nominate seven members to the Internal Coordination Committee within 15 days of signing the MoU.
- 3. Each Party shall provide all necessary support at its disposal and as allowed by its institutional Rules, for implementing this MoU effectively.
- RANJIT VILAS will train & guide students and faculties on complimentary basis from GNDU based on need and availability of resources as per institutional procedure.
- 5. The Parties shall share knowledge and facilities within the institutional Rules of each Party, to:
 - (a) Provide access to librariès, archives, research laboratories and other facilities;
 - (b) Provide access to high-end instruments and equipments as mutually agreed.
 - (c) Encourage joint discussions on new developments, formulation of academic and writing of scientific and technical papers and projects;
 - (d) Share knowledge/ information and publications/magazines/literature as may be essential for the academic pursuit;
 - (e) Provide logistical support/guest house facility for the scientists/experts involved in this MoU at locations of both parties by treating them official guests of their respective institution AND.
 - (g) No financial commitment from either Organization shall be assumed unless a formal approval/acceptance to that effect has been accorded through signed documents by both the Organizations.

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 This MoU shall remain in force initially for a period of three years, however, where after, it may be renewed automatically for an extended for three years period unless any of the parties seek termination in writing.

- 2. This MoU may be terminated prior to the expiry of the MoU as indicated above with three months prior notice in writing and with the written consent of the Heads of the two organizations.
- 3. Termination of this MoU between the participating components shall not terminate the agreements entered between the Parties with any third parties which the Parties may have entered into in executing the agreements under this MoU; the Parties shall continue to obtain the benefits of such agreement for three years. After termination of MoU, neither of the Parties will be responsible for any losses, financial or otherwise, which the other Party may suffer. Upon termination or expiry of the MoU, Parties are obliged to keep the information confidential, as agreed above.

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- 1. No rights in Industrial and/or Intellectual Property (Including without limitation, letters, patent, registered design, software copyrights, trademark and copyright) owned by the Parties on the date of signature of this MoU and independently developed on their part are hereby granted by the owning Party to the other Party, nor shall any such rights be deemed to be granted except specified by the owning Party in writing.
- 2. The Intellectual Property Rights in respect of joint project will be decided on caseto-case basis.
- Sharing of any data generated (either observational or computational) under the aegis of this MoU shall be as per the provisions of the specific project/programmes.
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- 5. Every member of both Parties in any activity under the aegis of this MoU shall abide by the prevailing policies of Govt. of India with respect to classified information/data. During the tenure of this MoU including extension, if any and for *Five years* thereafter, *Parties* undertake on their behalf and on behalf of their employees or representatives or associates to maintain strict confidentiality and

prevent disclosure thereof to any third party, all the information and data exchanged or generated during the operation of MoU.

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- Neither Party shall assign, or in any manner, transfer its interest or any part thereof in this MoU, except to wholly owned subsidiaries and agreed explicitly to that effect in writing. This MoU shall be binding on and inure to the benefit of the Parties hereto and their respective heirs, personal representatives, successors and assignees; and,
- 2. This MoU constitutes the entire understanding between the **Parties** relating to the subject matter hereof and supersedes and cancels any and all previous or collateral MoUs, negotiations, commitments, representations or understandings between the **Parties** with respect to this MoU, and the subject matter hereof. If any of the provisions of this MoU are determined to be invalid under applicable law, they are, to that extent, deemed omitted. The invalidity of any portion of this MoU shall not render any other portion invalid; and,
- 3. No amendments or modifications of this MoU shall be valid unless they are made in writing by both the **Parties** or their authorized representatives and specifically stating the same to be an amendment of this MoU. The modifications/changes shall be effective from the date on which they are made or executed unless otherwise agreed to.
- 4. This MoU is not intended to constitute, create, give effect to, or otherwise recognize a joint venture, partnership, or formal business organization of any kind, and the rights and obligations of the **Parties** shall be only those expressly set forth herein. Nothing in this MoU shall be construed to grant either **Party** the right to make commitments of any kind for or on behalf of the other without the other's prior written consent.

H: FORCE MAJEURE

Neither **Parties** shall be held responsible for non-fulfillment of their respective obligations under this MoU due to the exigency of one or more of the Force Majeure events such as, but not limited to, the acts of God, War, Flood, Earthquake, Strikes,

Lockouts, Epidemic, Riots, Civil commotions etc. provided on the occurrence and cessation of any such event the **Party** affected thereby shall give a notice in writing to the other **Party** within 30 (Thirty) days of such occurrence or cessation. If the Force Majeure conditions continue beyond 6 (six) months, the **Parties** shall jointly decide about the future course of action.

J: GOVERNING LAWS AND DISPUTES RESOLUTION

- This MoU shall, in all respects, be governed by and construed in all respects in accordance with the laws of the Republic of India.
- 2. This MoU is to create a framework for enriching scientific endeavors in mutually agreed fields of research through collaboration in developing and implementing new academic and research programmes and faculty and students exchange. Hence any question, doubt or dispute arising out of the interpretation of any term or usage herein or on the implementation and functioning of the various understandings forming a part of this MoU shall be resolved by in the first place the Executive Heads of the two organizations or their authorized representatives for the purpose mentioned herein by discussions and negotiations based on consensus in the spirit of developing and strengthening the mutual relationships.
- 3.Unresolved dispute if any, shall be referred to Vice-Chancellor, GNDU in accordance with **Arbitration and Conciliation Act**, 1996 and rules framed thereof. Arbitration shall be conducted at Amritsar. The decision of arbitrators so reached shall be final and binding on both the parties.
- 4. Each clause of this MoU is severable and if one clause is rendered illegal or is severed, it will not render the whole MOU illegal and all clauses except severed clause shall be valid & binding between two parties.

THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (the "MOU") is entered at Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar on the 06.04.2018

Between

PHD Chamber of Commerce and Industry, New Delhi including its successors, assignees and legal representatives (hereafter to be known as the First party).

And

Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar including its successors, assignees and legal representatives (hereafter to be known as the Second party)

1. Background of Parties

Established in 1905, PHD Chamber of Commerce and Industry is the largest and oldest apex business organization in India. Its history is closely interwoven with India's struggle for independence and its subsequent emergence as one of the most rapidly growing economies globally. PHD Chamber of Commerce and Industry plays a leading role in policy debates that are at the forefront of social, economic and political change. Through its 250 professionals, PHD Chamber of Commerce and Industry is active in 67 sectors of the economy. PHD Chamber's stand on policy issues is sought out by think tanks, governments and academia. Its publications are widely read for their in-depth research and policy prescriptions. PHD Chamber of Commerce and Industry have mobilized tie-ups with a network of 60 world-wide chambers of commerce for allowing a one-to-one interaction between the industry and Govt. peers across the borders. 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- b. Research products resulting from joint research (industrial property, intellectual property, reports, prototypes, etc.) are to be shared. Research products resulting from one party's participation in the other party's research program belong to the party hosting the research program.
- c. When a party is to disclose or transfer research products resulting from joint research to a third party, it shall acquire approval from the other party. Any revenues. such as technical fees, resulting from such interaction shall be shared between The Parties as mutually decided by both parties.
- Creation of industrial chair to support research
- Short-Term Training Programmes
- Onsite Educational Programmes
- Part time Educational Programmes
- Collaborative Educational Programmes
- Visiting faculty/Experts from industry for interaction with students
- Startup entrepreneurship program
- Training programmes / Short term assignments to the faculty members in industries
- Participation of industrial experts in curriculum design
- . Both the parties agree to hold/conduct, whenever feasible, national events, Joint workshops, conferences, training programs within the areas of mutual interest.
- Shared Use of Research Equipment and Facilities: Under mutual consent, The Parties can share each other's research equipment and facilities. If any expenses arise from doing so, the expenses shall be discussed in advance and shall be handled accordingly.
- Guiding in Setting up Incubation Centre.
- Facilitating for tie-ups for student's internships and placements.
- . Helps in setting up Technology and Innovation Support Center network which provides innovators in university to locally based, high quality technology information and related services, helping them to exploit their innovative potential and to create, protect, and manage their Intellectual Property Rights (IPRs).

4: Mode of Operation:

Both parties will provide necessary support for effective implementation of the MoU within the institutional rules and procedures

- A. This MoU shall be effective from the date it is signed by both the Parties.
- B. Within the broad framework of the MoU, a PHD Chamber of Commerce and Industry, and GNDU can develop joint research, academic or, exchanges, development of facilities, etc AND THE PARTY OF THE

- C. Any financial commitment for joint activities under this MoU shall be subject to the approval by the competent authority of the respective organizations.
- D. The activities under this MoU shall be coordinated, monitored and recorded by an Internal Coordination Committee. Coordinator, UILP, GNDU will be the internal Coordinator from GNDU, GNDU Amritsar, whereas, President PHD Chamber of Commerce and Industry or a person nominated by the President PHD Chamber of Commerce and Industry will be the internal coordinator from PHD Chamber of Commerce and Industry. The visitors will be bound by the Rules and Regulations as well as code of conduct of the host institution.

5. Information Exchange:

- The Parties can co-hold conferences, seminars, workshops, etc. Technical information and related data are to be shared.
- When necessary, joint research teams, technology exchange teams, etc. shall be organized and operated for further cooperation.

6. Financial arrangements.

This Agreement places no financial obligations or supplementary funding commitments on either Party. These activities will be defined through separate program agreements that detail the commitment of resources (financial or otherwise) required by each Institution. Subsequent program agreements must be approved in writing by the authorized representatives of each institution. Each Party will be responsible for its own costs in connection with all matters relating to collaborations under this MOU. Where possible and appropriate, the Parties may also seek funding for collaborations from Government and related agencies.

7.Non-disclosure: The Parties shall not provide or disclose any confidential information related to the other party, acquired during the cooperation or exchange stated herein, to a third party.

8. Principle of Good Faith: The Parties shall practice this agreement in good faith.

9. General

This Agreement will become effective upon the date of signature by both Parties. It shall remain valid for a period of five (5) years from the date of the last signature, with the understanding that it may be modified by written mutual consent of both Parties. This Agreement may be terminated by either Party with advance written notice of at least thirty (30) days. The terms of this MoU may be amended with the consent of both the parties. Signed in behalf of PHD Chamber of Commerce and Industry and Guru Nanak Dev University was established at Amritsar as follows on the date and the year herein above written.

WHEREAS, the Punjab Police (hereinafter referred to as "Party I") is law enforcement in the state of Punjab, India. The mission of Punjab Police is the prevention and detection of crime, maintenance of law and order and the enforcement of the Constitution of India.; and

WHEREAS, the Guru Ram Dass School of Planning, Amritsar (Hereinafter referred to as "Party II"), is a School under Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar, established by the state government in the year 1969, the institute provides an excellent academic environment under the able guidance of well-qualified and highly dedicated faculty.

CONSIDERING THAT, the Party I and Party II (hereinafter referred to as the "Parties", and individually, each a "Party") wish to formalize a basis on which the Parties may explore opportunities for cooperation and collaboration on matters of common interest, and torender their respective activities more effective and beneficial.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties have agreed to enter into this Memorandum of Understanding (hereinafter referred to as the "MoU"), as follows:

ARTICLE 1 Objective

The objective of this MoU is to formalize a non-exclusive framework of cooperation and to facilitate collaboration between the Parties to promote programs and joint activities that foster cooperation between them and promote safe and sustainable transport in Punjab and the region in order to improve traffic management, control, and road safety by building scientific temperament. These and any other activities agreed to between the Parties shall be subject to the respective internal objectives, functions, policies, and procedures of the Parties.

ARTICLE 2 Areas of Cooperation

The parties may, in partcular, explore the possibility of cooperating in the following areas of activitiy;

- 2.1 Active participation and collaboration by the parties in the following areas of mutualinterest:
 - a) To develop scientific temper, new knowledge and the spirit of inquiry, reform through the data-led approach to change pragmatic methods applicable in road safety, traffic control, and management to change previous conclusions in the face of new evidence.
 - b) Carry out activities and events conducive to help measurably reduce the death toll and serious injuries caused by road incidents in the state or region of the state.
 - c) Develop state's own technical expertise on traffic management, control, traffic, transportation and road safety engineering, eg. conducting joint road safety audit & training with state police
 - d) To suggest intervention or activities to the police department in order to achieve the overall objectives of this MoU.
 - e) Support "Decade of Action on Road Safety" as announced by United Nations from 2011 to 2020.
 - f) A collaborative approach to exchange data available with both the parties, in order to conduct applied research within the Interdisciplinary departmental expertise available with the Party II
 - 2.2. Exchange of information and consultation, as necessary and appropriate, in the interest of identifying additional areas in which, and the concerned activities for which, effective and practical cooperation, such as the exchange of researchers, development of Terms of References and conducting technical review may be possible with the framework of this MoU. Any exchange of information between the parties shall be subjected to their

respective policies and procedures on the disclosure of information.

2.3. Other related activities may also be agreed upon between the parties from time to time, subject to each of the parties' internal policies and procedures, including those policies for the hiring of consultants and other services.

ARTICLE 3 Partnership Management

- 3.1 Party I and the Party II share a commitment to strengthening, monitoring and evaluation their support for safe and sustainable transport development efforts.
- 3.2 Party I and the Party II will conduct a join mid-term review of the cooperation under this MOU to decide on need for continuation, expiation or adjustment in area of cooperation; and
- 3.3. A final join review will be done during the last year of the duration of this MoU for the same purpose.

ARTICLE 4 Nature of this MoU

Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary in this MoU, this MoU is not intended to create legal relations or obligations between the two Parties or to impose formal obligations on them. Any specified activities identified under this MoU as opportunities for collaboration between the Parties will be the subject of additionally written agreements between the Parties. In particular, this MoU does not represent any commitment with regard to funding on the part of the Parties. In keeping with the administrative nature of these arrangements, no provision of this MoU will be construed to interfere in any way with the independent decision-making autonomy of the two Parties with regard to their respective affairs and operations. Furthermore, this MoU shall not represent any commitment on the part of either Party to give preferred treatment to the other any matter contemplated under this MoU or otherwise.

ARTICLE 5 Channel of Communication and Notice

5.1. Recognize that effective collaboration depends upon open, comprehensive and regular communication at the institutional level. They agree to make appropriate arrangements to;

- I. Exchange/deposit copies of publications and public documents of each organization in the main library of the partner organization, to be maintained as reference documents;
- II. Give notice, through information posted on the website/social medial channels of each organization.
- 5.2 For the purpose of facilitating the implementation of the working arrangements to be established by the parties of this MoU, the channel of communication of the parties shall be;

ARTICLE 6 Effectiveness, Amendments, Termination and other Matters

- 6.1. This MoU will enter into force on the date it is signed by both Parties and will remain in effect for five years after coming into force unless terminated in accordance with clause below;
- 6.2 This MoU may be terminated by either Party giving three months' notice in writing to the other Party.
- 6.3 Subject to the parties' policies and procedures with respect to the disclosure of Information, the parties may make this MoU publicly available.

ARTICLE 7 Resolution of Problems

During the course of this MoU, the respective focal points will be promptly notified 7.1. of all problems that impact adversely on the potential of the two Parties to collaborate effectively. The focal points will take appropriate action to seek an amicable resolution. If the focal points are unable to resolve the problem to the satisfaction of both Parties, the two Parties will take whatever action they consider

And



GNDU and PHTPB individually referred to herein as a 'party' and collectively as the 'parties'.

A: Preamble:

Where, Punjab Heritage & Tourism Promotion Board (PHTPB) which was set up vide Government of Punjab Notification No.12/108/2002-3TC/1490 dated 14-8-2002 and was subsequently registered as a Public Charitable Trust on 5-12-2002 through a Deed of Declaration. The body nurtures the objective of creating all necessary steps for planning, coordination, implementation and propagation of activities, events, projects and other matters connected with the Culture and Tourism including Documentation, Conservation, Preservation, and Dissemination of the Cultural heritage of Punjab.

Where, Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar, Punjab which was established on November 24, 1969, has a long tradition of pursuing excellence in teaching and research in science and technology, humanities, social sciences, performing arts and sports. The University supports excellence and innovation in academic programmes, promotes excellence in research, scholarship and teaching.

B: Broad Objectives and Scope:

Objectives

- The current agreement seeks to establish cooperation between the PHTPB and Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar for long-term partnership in knowledge sharing and activities for development and management of tourism in the State of Punjab. Both the parties agree that tourism needs to be managed on a sustained basis.
- Both the parties, PHTPB and Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar, will engage in a series of activities to initiate a consistent effort in the field of tourism development which will be mutually beneficial. For this, Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar, will develop various projects and programs in consultation with PHTPB towards achieving this.

Scope

- 1. Refresher/ Orientation Courses or Short Term Certificate Programmes offering training or workshop programmes in the areas of tourism by Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar for PHTPB if the latter requests so, for capacity building of various service providers.
- 2. This may particularly be relevant in the fields of Training for Tourism Police, and also conducting Training programs/ Workshop programmes for all kinds of Stakeholders of Hospitality and Tourism Industry besides other "First point of contact for Tourists" stakeholders etc.
- 3. Conducting dedicated Management Training programs/Workshop programmes for Officers and Administrative Staff/Officials of Heritage, Tourism and Hospitality departments.
- 4. Conducting Training Programme under Hunar se Rozgar and outreach training programme under Infrastructure Development Investment Program for Tourism.
- 5. On the Job Training or Internship Programme-Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar may also consider sending students to PHTPB during their summer internship.
- 6. Engage in a series of activities and develop various projects in the field of tourism which will be mutually beneficial.
- 7. Creation and development of content for PHTPB.
- 8. University Business School (Management, Tourism & Hospitality) department shall act as nodal centre for the MOU implementation on behalf of Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar.
- 9. Departments of Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar, which can be helpful in implementation of MOU:
 - University Business School (Management, Tourism & Hospitality)
 - Architecture
 - History/Punjab Historical Studies
 - · Youth Welfare
 - Heritage Museums
 - · Aschitecture

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C: Mode of Operation:

Both parties will provide necessary support for effective implementation of the MoU within the institutional rules and procedures

- 1. This MoU shall be effective from the date it is signed by both the Parties.
- 2. Within the broad framework of the MoU, a PHTPB, and GNDU can develop joint research, academic or, exchanges, development of facilities, etc
- 3. Any financial commitment for joint activities under this MoU shall be subject to the approval by the competent authority of the respective organizations.
- 4. The activities under this MoU shall be coordinated, monitored and recorded by an Internal Coordination Committee constituted of members nominated by both parties; each organization will appoint an internal coordinator who will organize joint meetings at regular intervals at mutually agreed locations and maintain records of agreements, work plan and progress.
- 5. The visitors will be bound by the Rules and Regulations as well as code of conduct of the host institution.
- 6. The Internal Coordination Committee will also formulate the procedure for exchange of students, faculty and other visitors, in accordance with the Rules of the host participating institutions as defined in preamble.
- 7. The mode and quantum of resource sharing will be decided based on recommendation of the Internal Coordination Committee on the case to case basis, subject to approval of competent authority as required.
- 8. The Internal Coordination Committee will formulate action plans at its meetings and communicate for information and necessary approvals by the concerned authorities.

D: Obligations of the Parties

1. In accordance with the clause C-4 as above, Head-University Business School(UBS) will be the internal Coordinator from GNDU, GNDU Amritsar, whereas, Chief Executive Officer, PHTPB, Chandigarh or a person nominated by the Chief Executive Officer, PHTPB will be the internal coordinator from PHTPB, Chandigarh. University Business School (Management, Tourism & Hospitality) department shall act as nodal centre for the MoU implementation on behalf of Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar.

- 2. Each party shall nominate members to the Internal Coordination Committee within 15 days of signing the MoU.
- 3. Each Party shall provide all necessary support at its disposal and as allowed by its institutional Rules, for implementing this MoU effectively.
- 4. PHTPB will train & guide students and faculties from GNDU based on need and availability of resources as per institutional procedure.
- 5. The Parties shall share knowledge and facilities within the institutional Rules of each Party, to:
 - (a) Provide access to libraries, archives, and other facilities;
 - (b) Share knowledge/ information and publications/magazines/literature as may be essential for the academic pursuit;
 - (c) Provide logistical support/guest house facility for the scientists/experts involved in this MoU at locations of both parties by treating them official guests of their respective institution and
 - (d) No financial commitment from either Organization shall be assumed unless a formal approval/acceptance to that effect has been accorded through signed documents by both the Organizations.

E: Duration and Termination

- 1 This general agreement will be effective for a period of three years from the date of signing of this agreement. However, a separate specific and detailed contract agreement may be signed for each defined activity/project. Such specific contract agreement shall include necessary details such as the line of activities, timelines and budget.
- 2 Both the parties agree that once the line of activities are detailed out and agreement is signed, further coordination and planning for execution will be carried out by both the signing parties. The form of cooperation and financial aspect may vary with the goal of each project.
- 3 This agreement may be terminated with at least a 90 days' notice given in writing by either party to another for any reason deemed necessary by the signing parties. However, in such cases, any ongoing project with a defined timeline may be allowed to complete its projected activities within the projected time-frame, unless mutually agreed otherwise.

F: Data Sharing and Intellectual Property Rights

- 1. No rights in Industrial and/or Intellectual Property (Including without limitation, letters, patent, registered design, software copyrights, trademark and copyright) owned by the Parties on the date of signature of this MoU and independently developed on their part are hereby granted by the owning Party to the other Party, nor shall any such rights be deemed to be granted except specified by the owning Party in writing.
- 2. The Intellectual Property Rights in respect of joint project will be decided on case-to-case basis. Parties will mutually decide on sharing of required information by way of joint publication in journals and seminars or workshops etc. All publications resulting from the collaboration between the Parties will be mentioned in the scientific reports of either Party.
- 3. Sharing of any data generated (either observational or computational) under the aegis of this MoU shall be as per the provisions of the specific project/programmme
- 4. Each Party shall duly acknowledge the contribution/involvement of the other Party in a given activity in its bulletins/publications/media release/outreach and any other official communication.
- 5. Every member of both Parties in any activity under the aegis of this MoU shall abide by the prevailing policies of Govt. of India with respect to classified information/data. During the tenure of this MoU including extension, if any and for *Five years* thereafter, Parties undertake on their behalf and on behalf of their employees or representatives or associates to maintain strict confidentiality and prevent disclosure thereof to any third party, all the information and data exchanged or generated during the operation of MoU.

G: GENERAL PROVISIONS

- 1. Neither Party shall assign, or in any manner, transfer its interest or any part thereof in this MoU. This MoU shall be binding on and inure to the benefit of the Parties hereto and their respective heirs, personal representatives, successors and assignees; and,
- 2. This MoU constitutes the entire understanding between the Parties relating to the subject matter hereof and supersedes and cancels any and all previous or collateral MoUs, negotiations, commitments, representations or understandings between the Parties with respect to this MoU, and the subject matter hereof. If





any of the provisions of this MoU are determined to be invalid under applicable law, they are, to that extent, deemed omitted. The invalidity of any portion of this MoU shall not render any other portion invalid; and,

- 3. No amendments or modifications of this MoU shall be valid unless they are made in writing by both the Parties or their authorized representatives and specifically stating the same to be an amendment of this MoU. The modifications/changes shall be effective from the date on which they are made or executed unless otherwise agreed to.
- 4. This MoU is not intended to constitute, create, give effect to, or otherwise recognize a joint venture, partnership, or formal business organization of any kind, and the rights and obligations of the Parties shall be only those expressly set forth herein. Nothing in this MoU shall be construed to grant either Party the right to make commitments of any kind for or on behalf of the other without the other's prior written consent.

H: FORCE MAJEURE

Neither Parties shall be held responsible for non-fulfillment of their respective obligations under this MoU due to the exigency of one or more of the Force Majeure events such as, but not limited to, the acts of God, War, Flood, Earthquake, Strikes, Lockouts, Epidemic, Riots, Civil commotions etc. provided on the occurrence and cessation of any such event the Party affected thereby shall give a notice in writing to the other Party within 30 (Thirty) days of such occurrence or cessation. If the Force Majeure conditions continue beyond 6 (six) months, the Parties shall jointly decide about the future course of action.

J: GOVERNING LAWS AND DISPUTES RESOLUTION

- 1. This MoU shall, in all respects, be governed by and construed in all respects in accordance with the laws of the Republic of India.
- 2. This MoU is to create a framework for enriching scientific endeavors in mutually agreed fields of research through collaboration in developing and implementing new academic and research programmes and faculty and students exchange. Hence any question, doubt or dispute arising out of the interpretation of any term or usage herein or on the implementation and functioning of the various understandings forming a part of this MoU shall be resolved by the Executive Heads of the two organizations or their authorized representatives for the purpose mentioned herein by discussions and negotiations based on consensus in the spirit of developing and strengthening the mutual relationships.

- 3. Any unresolved dispute, shall be referred to Chief Executive Officer, PHTPB, Chandigarh AND Coordinator UILP, GNDU and an independent arbitrator involved with mutual consent in accordance with Arbitration and Conciliation Act, decision of arbitrators so reached shall be final and binding on both the parties. Language of arbitrator shall be in English.
- 4. Each clause of this MoU is severable and if one clause is rendered illegal or is severed, it will not render the whole MOU illegal and all clauses except severed clause shall be valid & binding between two parties.

THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (the "MOU") is entered at Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar on 03.05. 2019

- a. Parties to the MoU
- 1 Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar (hereafter referred to as GNDU)
- 2. Punjab Remote Sensing Centre, Punjab Agricultural University Campus, Ludhiana an autonomous organization under the Government of Punjab (hereafter referred to as PRSC).

b. Purpose / Objective of MoU:

The purpose of this agreement is to provide framework for the conduct of an institutional cooperation agreement between GNDU and PRSC for research in thematic areas of mutual interests.

Broad Objectives of the common interest of both the institutions are given below:

- 1. Student and faculty exchange for academic and research activities (e.g., internships, joint research supervision, joint academic programmes, faculty development etc.) of mutual interest and benefit to the society at large.
- 2. Consultancy services and solution at state, national and international level as feasible on mutual interest in the field of Geospatial Technologies (Remote Sensing, GIS, GPS, ICT), surveys and allied techniques based on expertise and resource availability in the respective institution.
- 3. Leveraging technical potential and legal use of resources for development of processes, tools, techniques for joint academic research and professionally commercial projects across agencies on mutual interest as arises time to time for institutional development, capacity building and propagation & promotion of technology for societal benefits as may deemed fit and decided by Heads of both the institutions.

Sope of MoU:

The scope of the Institutional cooperation agreement between Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar and PRSC is outlined below:

1. Permission to use each other's laboratory and research facilities subject to prior mutual consent (without payment of any charges to either party)

2. The formal institutional cooperation programme between GNDU and PRSC will focus on improving the understanding in the field of Geospatial Technologies (Remote Sensing, Geographical Information System, Global Positioning System, Web/Mobile Based Applications etc)

Role of Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar and PRSC.

Broadly Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar and PRSC will work together jointly to develop new applications relevant to the fields within the scope of the MoU. Both will thrive to develop framework which would be helpful in developing and improving technologies related to the Geospatial Technologies and related fields.

- 3. Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar and PRSC will work together to develop new applications for the mutual benefits and for the benefits of the other relevant users.
 - (i) Coordinator, University Industry Linkage Programme from Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar will be the main coordinator (point of contact) for research and development at GNDU and lead coordinating Scientist (Director, PRSC) will be the coordinator (point of contact) for research and development from PRSC. Coordinators from both parties shall nominate three members each from their side for internal coordination committee. Under the guidance of respective Coordinators, they will retain overall responsibilities of executing the scientific collaboration items and ensure coordination amongst all involved. Respective Head of Institutes, if required, may change the research coordinators.
 - (ii) Dissemination: The research outcome will be documented internally for future references, presented at national and international conference / workshops with mutual consent and joint research papers will be published in journals with mutual consent.
 - (iii) Exchange. The duration of visits will be decided mutually by lead researchers as per requirement of the project.
- d. Effective date of MoU. This agreement shall come into force from the date of its signature.
- e. Period / Duration of MoU. MoU will be valued for the period of 05 years from the date of signature of parties and can be extended with mutual consent depending upon the scope of ongoing and future work.

Brief of Partners:

pRSC, an autonomous organization under the Government of Punjab, is the apex body in the State for related works. It is designated as a Nodal Agency by the Govt. of Punjab for geospatial needs of the State and also acts as the centralized hub for the geo-spatial data to all the user departments. PRSC has Department of Geography, Panjab University, Chandigarh and Punjab Agricultural University (PAU), jointly running M.Tech. Programme in Remote Sensing & GIS.

Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar is a state university accredited at 'A' grade level by NAAC for the third time and has been awarded University with Potential for Excellence status by UGC. The university is equipped with state-of-the-art research facilities and has highly trained and qualified faculty working in diverse research areas including life sciences, environmental sciences, chemistry, physics, social sciences etc. Besides teaching and academic research, Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar is engaged in sponsored research, consultancy services and development projects with various national and international agencies.

Project Site / Place of MoU.

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Project / consultancy work will be conducted at Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar and PRSC or onsite as per requirement. Output processing, methodology development will also be conducted at these two places or their designated laboratories respectively.

Responsibilities of each Party of MoU.

- i) Both parties mutually agree to identify various areas of interest and depute faculty/staff as per the requirements with mutual consent.
- ii) Both the institutions shall identify faculty for accomplishing the above laid down objectives. Each party shall attempt to make such faculty available as and when required. Such identified faculty may be given Visiting or Adjunct Faculty appointments in accordance with the norms and procedures of the host institution.
- iii) Both the institutions shall organize regular faculty interactions/meets to promote research interaction and collaboration among their faculty members. These meets may be organized for entire institute or specific to any department / school / division as per mutual convenience.
- iv) Every individual project collaboration will have a separate agreement/terms of reference that addresses issues such as Intellectual Property Right (IPR), funding pattern, disclosure of confidential information etc. Each party shall bear its own cost.
- v) Nominate Coordinators as nodal contacts to represent the organization and promote interface so as to plan, implement, monitor and review the various activity schedules from time to time. Draw the attention of the top management in case of any interface or operational problems.
- vi) After identification of any activity, a formal Agreement for the specific activities outlining the details of the scope of work, financial implications, phasing of work output / deliverables, phasing of

payments, Intellectual property rights and other term between Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar and PRSC shall be necessary before any work is formally initiated or any financial commitment becomes operative. The approval will be routed through the nodal contacts on either side.

- vii) All attempts will be made to ensure that developments and projects are accomplished to a very high
- viii) Each Party shall make its respective Contributions to the Project.
- ix) Each Party confirms that it will act in good faith when complying with its respective obligations

i. General terms of Cooperation:

- The institutional cooperation will primarily result in enhancing the technical and scientific a. b.
- The cooperation scheme is expected to provide a platform for mutual exchange of ideas and development of understanding on Geospatial Technologies and related fields.
- This cooperation agreement will be monitored through periodic reviews by joint committee C. constituting the Heads of Institutes as Co-Chairs either at Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar or at PRSC. The review will cover the following aspects:-
 - (i) Measure the progress of the activities and the achievements against the work plan.
 - Evaluate the quality of work completed and advise on the methodology to be (ii) applied for future work.
 - Identify and assess factors affecting the progress and quality of the work and (iii) suggest corrective measures to remove hurdles related with the implementation of the programme.
- Security/ Non disclosure of confidential information of the parties. The work carried out j. under the MoU will be unclassified and the dissemination / publication of results will be as per IPR points as discussed in following section (1)
- Protection of IPR. In broad terms, the IPR issues will be based on the following principles: k
 - All research results and foreground information as well as foreground intellectual (i) property rights, generated during the Joint Research Work, whether or not legally projected, shall be owned jointly by Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar and PRSC.
 - Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar and PRSC shall consult each other before (ii) publishing any research results and foreground information generated during the joint research to ensure that no proprietary information is released and that foreground intellectual property rights are not jeopardized. Post consultation, any such publication proposal, shall be deemed approved in the event there is no objection from the party seeking to oppose within a period of thirty (30) days of receipt of a content(s) of such a publication, both parties agree to suitably modify / amend the content thereof in order

to avoid disclosure of confidential information or patentable material. In any case, a provisional application till a period of ninety (90) days or the filing of a

result and foreground information, generated during the joint research, to any third information exchanged / shared between the parties for joint research / supervision will mentioning that both the parties should be diligent and cautious enough to avoid any public unrest in any manner.

Right and Obligations.

The designated personnel of each party shall meet (at least once a year) to plan the activities and review the progress of the work. The parties shall also discuss their mutual concern, if any, and shall arrive at a broader consensus in formulating the modalities for carrying out the work relating to the agreement. The minutes of the meeting shall be kept in writing and shall be forwarded to the Head of Institution of each party.

The authorized and designated official of each party shall be responsible for organizing the meetings, recording the minutes and circulating them to all concerned.

The parties shall inform each other about the attained research results or work progress, and shall exchange interim and final reports in the context of the subject of this agreement.

- m. Termination of MoU. This agreement shall remain in force for period of five years from the date of its signature and the same may be renewed further on mutual agreement. The terms of the agreement may be amended at any time subject to mutual written agreement. Both parties may agree to exit with mutual consent in case the desired objectives could not be achieved.
- Arbitration / Dispute Resolution among Parties. In the event of any dispute arising among the parties, the parties shall make possible efforts to resolve the same amicably, failing which the same shall be referred to the Head of the Institutions of the parties. In the interest of both the Institutions, all possible efforts may be made mutually to avoid legal hassles. Arbitrator shall be appointed by mutual consent of both the parties in case dispute is not amicably resolved.
- Amendments to the MoU. No amendment or modification of this agreement shall be valid unless the same is made in writing by all parties or their authorized representatives and specifically stating the same to be amendment to the MoU. The modification / changes shall specifically stating the same to be amendment to the MoU. 

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

1. A Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) has been reached this day of..... between the Ministry of Environment, Forest &' Climate Change, GOI (hereinafter referred to as MoEF&CC, BSI) g referred to as the Botanic Garden) with respect to implement the scheme Assistance to Botanic Garden (ABG) vide Ministry's sanction letter dated. 16:10:2018 for total amount of .71.80 Lakfor a period of thrue ... years.

The MoU deals mainly with delineating the responsibilities of the MoEFCC, BSI and the PI (Botanic Garden/Lead Garden); the fulfilment of terms and conditions which is essential for achieving the objectives of the scheme.

II. Objectives of the ABG Scheme:

1. Strengthening of infrastructural facilities in Botanic Gardens, Botanical Sections in popular Gardens and Centres of ex-situ conservation.

- 2.Ex-situ conservation of indigenous particularly Endemic and Threatened (Critically Endangered, Endangered and Vulnerable) plant species, their multiplication, Re-introduction and rehabilitation of said plants in natural habitats in collaboration with State Forest Department on project basis.
- 3.Establishment of seed banks, arboreta and mist propagation facilities.
- 4. Promotion of education and public awareness in respect of above said plants.

III.Responsibilities of MoEFCC

- To facilitate effective functioning of Botanic Gardens/Lead Gardens through BSI.
- ii.To issue the sanction order and release the grants-in-aid earmarked to the Botanic Garden subject to satisfactory progress and receipt of required financial status.
- iii. To assist and support the Botanic Garden in every way to ensure the achievement of objectivesof the ABG Scheme.
 - iv. To ensure timely completion of the project.
 - v.Monitoring evaluation and inspection of the Project by MoEFCC or any other officer / agency authorized in regard.
- IV.Responsibilities of the Smaller Botanic Garden/Lead Botanic Garden
 - The institute shall strive to maximise generation of internal resources and eventually attain self-sufficiency. It shall create a corpus fund, the returns in investment of which will enable the institute to meet its revenue expenditure.
 - ❖ To ensure that government grant is spent for the purpose forwhich it is given and to submit Utilization Certificate/Progress Report/Photos of physical deliverables.
 - To allow audit and inspection by the Ministry.
 - To follow DBT scheme in all its transaction.
 - To follow GFR and economy instructions in respect of groups received from the central government.

- To consolidate the accounts of all branches/units and get the accounts audited by an auditor appointed from the panel of C&AG.
- ◆ To get the audit done by C&AG, if the Government grant exceeds Rs 1Cr in a year.
- To publish the annual Audited accounts in its website for public viewing.
- The major responsibilities of the Lead Botanic Garden is to serve as a referral centre and a model with respect to conservation of threatened and endemic species of different phytogeographic region of the country.
- The lead Botanic Gardens would serve as a important node in the network of other Botanic Garden of the region supported by the Ministry under the scheme in term of exchanging knowledge and plant material of the identified threatened and endemic species and also ensuring maintenance of such plant species populations.
- The knowledge generation activity undertaken in the lead Botanic Garden is linked to the ultimate management objective of ex situ conservation.
- ❖ Conserve natural vegetation specially Endemic and Threatenedplant species through multiplying them *ex-situ*and rehabilitating them in their natural habitats.
- Study of the Phenology and response of the plants to climate variability/change.
- Serve as centres of training, with expertise in a focused area of subject specialization, including horticulture.
- Building up of information on in-situ as well as ex-situ conservation of the Endemic and Threatened species and their habitats.
- ❖ Compile information on the area of occurrence, area of occupancy, number and size of populations, spatial distribution of populations, identification of important associates such as pollinator's trends in relation to habitat changes and pattern of disturbance, etc. Besides prepare Red Data Sheets for the selected species as per IUCN format.
- Promote environmental awareness/nature conservation through well defined education programmes and educational materials.

- Standardisation of propagation techniques for Endemic and Threatened plant species of the particular region.
- Submission of half-yearly progress report in physical and financial terms (as per proforma) and to report to Ministry measurable Parameters for each grant and its achievement.
- Submit six monthly progress report on above items of work to Ministry
- V. Responsibilities of Botanical Survey of India (BSI)
- (i) BSI would be responsible for ensuring that quality milestones of the scheme are achieved at the end of the plan period.
- (ii) Funding of the Botanic Gardens/Lead Botanic Gardens under the scheme would be routed through BSI on the basis of authorization issued by the Ministry to the PAO of the BSI.
- (iii) BSI will receive the proposals in the prescribed proforma given in the Guidelines in response to the advertisement in print media (or) posted on the website of the MOEFCC.
- (iv)BSI will verify the competence of the proponent organization in terms of the expertise and experience of the proponents to undertake the proposed activities in accordance with the guidelines of the scheme. BSI will also conduct a technical scrutiny of the Action Plan of the proponent organization. The Action Plan would be accompanied by the budgetary estimates for the implementation of the action plan.
- (v) After the detailed scrutiny and the budget estimates, BSI will place the proposals before the Expert Group constituted by the Ministry for appraisal and recommendation to the Ministry for approval.
- (vi)Recommendations / Suggestions of the Expert Group would be appropriately incorporated in the Action Plan and final proposal would be submitted to the MOEFCC through BSI by the Botanic Gardens in a suitable format for obtaining concurrence of IFD and approval of the Competent Authority.
- (vii) Based on the recommendations of the Expert Group, the Ministry with the concurrence of IFD would issue authorization to the BSI for onward release of funds to the respective participating Botanic Gardens/Lead Botanic Gardens under the programme.

(viii) The BSI would ensure monitoring and review of the ongoing projects and also physical verification of the facilities created, number of Endemic and Threatened plant species conserved, rehabilitated and survived in the field and then submit the performance report to the Expert Group for review annually.

(ix) The BSI would submit to the MOEFCC duly examined utilization certificates/expenditure statements with their recommendations for authorization of funds out of allocation made by the Ministry for the scheme during the financial year.

VI. Terms & Conditions.

- 1. The grants-in-aid shall be released in annual instalments as not more than 60% in the first instalment, second installment not more than 30% and in the third installment rest of the amount. While the first instalment shall be released on the recommendations of the Expert Group Committee, subsequent releases will depend on the submission of the requisite Utilization Certificate, Expenditure Statements and Progress Reports, etc. by the project/implementing agencies and their acceptance by the BSI and Ministry. The Botanic Gardens should submit one set of Utilization Certificate, Expenditure Statements and Progress Reports, etc.to BSI and another set to MoEFCC. The project activities should be completed with in the allotted time period. The Institute receiving Grant under the Scheme shall open a separate Bank account and it shall be open for audit by Central Government or C&AG.
- 2. The PI of the project through Head of the Department or the Competent Authorityshall submit an Undertaking to the effect that the land use of the land designated for the proposed that the land use of the land designated for the proposed Botanic Garden shall remain unchanged and the Garden shall be maintained from the institute funds after receiving the financial support from the Ministry for improvement of Botanic Garden. The fixed assets created under out this grant shall not be disposed off without concurrence of the Ministry. If the implementing agency fail to utilize the fund for the purpose it was granted in project period than it has to refund the fund to Ministry along with the Bank interest incurred.
- 3. The Botanic Garden receiving funding should give saplings of all the endemic, threatened and economically important plant species introduced in their garden as a result of funding by MoEFCC from this project to the respective Regional Centres of BSI where the garden is located.
- 4. In the event of the Expert Group Committee recommending closure of the funding to the Botanic Garden, this MOU shall

be terminated, after giving a clear notice of one month's time to the Project implementing agency.

- 5. In case of termination of the MoU, all unutilized funds up to the date of termination of the agreement will have to be returned to the Ministry by the Botanical Garden and there should not be any overlapping of the activities under the projects with the activities of on -going scheme under CSS/CS state Government Scheme
- 6. Due caution should be exercised by the Botanic Garden in dissemination /publication of any information/data/findings of sensitive/classified nature, emanating out of the project. They can consult the BSI in this regard. The ultimate responsibility of ensuring discretion and secrecy of data/findings in such cases will rest entirely with the Botanic Garden.
- 7. There shall not be any cost -escalation of the project due to any delay/time over run and if so same will have to be borne by the Host Institution.
- 8. All disputes, disagreements, etc. if any, arising out of the Assistance to Botanic Garden Scheme, shall be resolved by the Ministry, in consultation with expert Group or any other agency.
- MoEFCCreserves the right to add, delete or modify the provisions of the MOU, which shall invariably be approved by the Competent Authority of the Ministry.
- 10. On all aspects where this MoU is silent or for special cases of deviation from the provisions of this MoU or the Assistance to Botanic Garden Scheme, the decision of the Ministry shall be final.

Majha House SS Gill Trust offers a unique space and facility that conceptualizes plans and executes a number of initiatives to showcase the best in literature, performance, art and culture, attracting the best and brightest. This includes initiatives to locate and showcase the intellectual and cultural heritage of Punjab; encourage cutting edge research in the arts; and workshops and trainings especially for young people to come to learn and grow their skills and build interface and linkages nationally and internationally and ongoing basis, through Managing Trustee, Majha House, Amritsar.

Guru Nanak Dev University and Majha House individually referred to herein as a 'party' and collectively as the 'parties'.

Managing Trustee Majha House, Amritsar Registrar Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar

A: Preamble:

Today, **Guru Nanak Dev University**, **Amritsar** feels proud of the 35 academic departments at the university campus and 148 affiliated colleges and 71 associate institutes, most are situated in the rural area. Track record of employment of our students by big business Houses and Multi-National companies has been very satisfactory. Our students of management and engineering arenas are successfully employed by companies in India and abroad. They are all contributing to the credit worthiness of the University by their hard work and diligence.

Whereas, **Majha House** (or Billoo's house as it has been called after the gallantry of Lt SS Gill who died fighting for the country in 1971) is a 40 year home with a history of giving, martyrdom and gallantry. It has been witness to loss but also renewal and regeneration that represents the indomitable spirit of Punjab. B: Broad Objectives and Scope:

- 4. To develop academic programmes and share expertise in training and other academic events through joint organization of events.
- 5. To develop collaborations with different agencies in the world of art and culture, including film and television industry.

Scope

The scope of Majha House and Guru Nanak Dev University collaboration can include (but not restricted to) activities below

- Conducting guest lectures, seminars, and workshops on collaborative basis by inviting the best writers, journalists, academics, performers and artists from across the country to deliver talks at the University for the students and faculty.
- 2. Organize Workshops and Professional trainings in collaboration with the Department of English, School of Architecture, the upcoming Department of Mass Media and Mass Communication, Department of Fine Arts on a host of subjects like Publishing, Creative Writing, Translation, Film Making and Editing, Photography, Film Appreciation, Art Appreciation, Script Writing, Theatre. In case Majha House, Amritsar avails facilities such as Auditoriums, Conference Halls, Committee Rooms and Guest houses at GNDU campus Amritsar in the interest of its students then university shall charge 50 % of the actual reservation fee prevalent for the outside university agencies at the time of booking.
- 3. Conducing student interactions with Industry leaders for better understanding of the business world and requirements.
- 4. On the Job Training / Internship Programs and Campus recruitment.
- 5. Majha House Trustees and Advisors include leaders of TV industry and they can contribute to curate course material and guest lectures

C: Mode of Operation:

Both parties will provide necessary support for effective implementation of the MOU within the institutional Rules and Procedures

- 1. This MOU shall be effective from the date it is signed by both the Parties.
- 2. Within the broad framework of the MOU, Majha Houseand GNDU can develop joint research, academic or, exchanges, development of facilities, etc.
- 3. Any financial commitment including conducting guest lectures, seminars, and workshops etc. for joint activities under this MOU shall be subject to the approval by the competent authority of the respective organizations.
- 4. The activities under this MOU shall be coordinated, monitored and recorded by an Internal Coordination Committee constituted of members nominated by both parties; each organization will appoint an internal coordinator who will organize joint meetings at regular intervals at mutually agreed locations and maintain records of agreements, work plan and progress.
- 5. The Internal Coordination Committee will formulate action plans at its meetings and communicate for information and necessary approvals by the concerned authorities
- 6. The mode and quantum of resource sharing will be decided based on recommendation of the Internal Coordination Committee on the case to case basis, subject to approval of competent authority as required.

D: Obligations of the Parties

1. In accordance with the clause C-4 as above, Dean Students' Welfare, GNDU, Amritsar will be the Internal Coordinator from GNDU Amritsar, whereas, Ms. Preeti Gill, Founder, Majha House or a person nominated by her, will be the Internal Coordinator from Majha House.

Managing Trustee Majha House, Amritsar

- 2 Each party shall nominate Seven members to the Internal Coordination Committee within 15 days of signing the MOU.
- 3 Each Party shall provide all necessary support at its disposal and as allowed by its institutional Rules, for implementing this MOU effectively.

E: Duration and Termination

- 1. This MOU shall remain in force for a period of Four years from the date of signing of this agreement. However, where after, it may be subsequently overtime unless any of the parties seek termination in writing.
- 2. This MOU may be terminated with at least three months' notice given in writing and with the written consent of the Heads of the two organizations.
- 3. Upon termination of this MOU between the participating components, the parties (Majha House& GNDU) will be indemnified from any third-party agreements/ obligation including but not limited to claims, liabilities, losses, damages, and expenses, including reasonable attorney's fees and expenses.

F: Data Sharing and Intellectual Property Rights

- 1. No rights in Industrial and/or Intellectual Property (Including without limitation, letters, patent, registered design, software copyrights, trademark and copyright) owned by the Parties on the date of signature of this MOU and independently developed on their part are hereby granted by the owning Party to the other Party, nor shall any such rights be deemed to be granted except specified by the owning Party in writing.

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Agreement for Academic Cooperation

Between

Guru Nanak Dev University

And

National Institute of Advanced Industrial Science and Technology acting through its

Biomedical Research Institute, Japan



Guru Nanak Dev University (GNDU), Amritsar (India) and the National Institute of Advanced Industrial Science and Technology acting through its Biomedical Research Institute (BMRI-AIST) (Japan) recognize their strengths in research and education in one or more disciplines of science and their mutual interest in engaging themselves in academic cooperation.

Therefore, GNDU and BMRI-AIST (jointly "Institutions") hereby record their intention to establish a programme for academic cooperation in areas of mutual interest, and in accordance with principles set forth in this Agreement ("Agreement"). It is the mutual intent of the two Institutions, where of mutual benefit, to explore the following general forms of co-operation ("the Purpose"):

- a) to exchange information on research and educational programmes,
- to exchange information on teaching, learning material and other literature relevant to their educational and research programmes,
- to jointly organize short-term continuing education programmes on topics
 of mutual interest and to invite each other's researchers to participate
 therein,
- to jointly organize seminars, conferences, or workshops on topics of mutual interest and to invite each other's researchers to participate therein,
- e) to jointly propose and engage in research or training programmes sponsored by funding agencies, and to invite each other's researchers to participate therein,
- f) to exchange, on a reciprocal basis, researchers and students for limited periods of time for purpose of education and /or research, and
- g) to jointly mentor Ph.D. students of GNDU on topics of mutual interest and expertise.

GNDU and BMRI-AIST intend that detailed terms and conditions that guide each activity identified above including as appropriate details concerning financial arrangements, treatment of confidential information, allocation and protection of any rights, and establishment of obligations will be separately agreed upon by the two Institutions by signing an implementing agreement for each activity as such specific cases arise. GNDU and BMRI-AIST agree to respect each other's rights to intellectual property. Further, the intellectual property rights that arise as a result of any collaborative research or activity

under this Agreement will be worked out on a case-to-case basis.

Detail of the implementation of any particular collaborative activities will be developed mutually between the two Institutions as such specific cases arise.

Both Institutions understand that they have no financial commitment to each other, however, will join to apply for external funding wherever possible.

The Institutions intend to co-operate in good faith to achieve the Purpose. This Agreement does not create any legally binding rights or obligations but reflects the intentions of the Institutions to work together in good faith to promote and monitor the agreed Purpose.

This Agreement is not intended to be construed to create or give effect to a joint venture, association, partnership or other business organization or agency arrangement and neither Institution shall have the authority under this Agreement to bind the other without the prior written approval of the other Institution.

Each Institution will appoint one member of its teaching/research personnel to coordinate the programme on its behalf. The coordinator, thus appointed, will periodically review and identify ways to strengthen cooperation between the two Institutions.

In order to promote close and effective collaboration between India and Japan, Department of Biotechnology (DBT), Govt of India and National Institute of Advanced Industrial Science and Technology (AIST) have set up a joint research laboratory, named DAILAB (DBT-AIST International Laboratory for Advanced Biomedicine) at the Biomedical Research Institute (BMRI) in AIST, Tsukuba, Japan in October 2013, which was later renewed and renamed as DAICENTER (DBT-AIST International CENter for Translational & Environmental Research) in September 2017. DAICENTER aims to conduct basic to applied research in the fields of Life Sciences and Biotechnology. The collaborative laboratory is offering unique opportunities for collaborative research, academic cooperation and personnel exchange. With no financial implements, AIST-BMRI welcomes GNDU to become a member of DAICENTER and promote the international collaboration scope of DAICENTER in the field of life science and biotechnology.

The Agreement is effective from March 22, 2018 and will remain valid for five years. It may be continued thereafter by mutual agreement in writing after suitable review and agreement. Either Institution may terminate the Agreement by giving written notice to the other Institution six months in advance. GNDU and BMRI-AIST will ensure that all activities in progress under the terms of an implementing agreement are allowed to complete successfully.

Should there be a dispute relating to any aspect of academic cooperation, Vice Chancellor, GNDU and Director, BMRI-AIST will jointly resolve the dispute in a spirit of independence, mutual respect, and shared responsibility.

For Academia Engagement on Decentralised Sanitation

This agreement made on the 1st day of October 2018 between National Institute of Urban Affairs (NIUA), New Delhi through its Director, located at Core-4B, 1st & 2nd Floor, India Habitat Centre, Lodhi Road, New Delhi – 110003 and Guru Ram Das School of Planning (GRDSP), Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar, through its Vice Chancellor, as part of the Sanitation Capacity Building Platform (SCBP) Project. The project is supported by the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation.

GRDSP will make use of their strength and experience in decentralized sanitation to carry out the activities outlined in the TOR.

It is hereby mutually agreed between NIUA and GRDSP hereto for themselves and their representatives, executors, administrators assign or successors as follows.



TERMS & CONDITIONS OF THE MoU

- The term of this Agreement comes into effect on 1st October, 2018 and will remain in force until 31st March 2019 or till the required deliverables under the Terms of Reference (ToR) (Refer Annex 1) are achieved. Extension of time can be sought only with prior approval and mutual consensus.
- Any amendment to this agreement shall be in writing and by mutual consent through an exchange of correspondence between NIUA and GRDSP.
- Guru Ram Das School of Planning (GRDSP) through its Head of Department and NIUA through its Director will act in line with mutually agreed rules for cooperation and coordination.
- Guru Ram Das School of Planning (GRDSP) will be responsible for the delivery of activities outlined in the ToR (Refer Annex 1).
- NIUA will facilitate activities necessary to achieve required deliverables outlined in the ToR.
- 6. A national academia meet comprising of institutes engaged with SCBP on decentralized sanitation will be held once every three months for peer learning purpose. Nodal faculty from your institute shall be invited to attend it and share your learnings/feedback. The cost for travel and accommodation for academia meet is budgeted as outlined in ToR (Refer Annex 2).
- Guru Ram Das School of Planning (GRDSP) shall submit a report highlighting key learnings from conducting all activities under this agreement.
- All knowledge product prepared under SCBP shall be the joint property of Guru Ram Das School of Planning (GRDSP) and NIUA, and shall have the SCBP and NIUA logo on it along with the logo of Guru Nanak Dev University..

Payment

- 9. I) NIUA shall pay to Guru Ram Das School of Planning(GRDSP) under this MoU a Total amount of INR 415,000 (Four Lakh Fifteen Thousand Rupees) for the implementation of the tasks mentioned in the ToR in accordance with the budget attached as Annexure 2 and this amount is exclusive of service tax (or GST as applicable), which will be paid in addition to this amount.
 - II) However, if NIUA shall bear the costs for providing SCBP partners/experts/resource persons on behalf of Guru Ram Das School of Planning(GRDSP) as outlined in ToR (Refer



Annex 2), it shall be factored in the total payment made by NIUA to Guru Ram Das School of Planning(GRDSP), based on mutual consensus.

III) Payments will be made upon receipt of 'request for payment' form with invoice from Guru Ram Das School of Planning(GRDSP) indicating the tasks completed as per item (V) below. Performa for 'Request for Payment' form is attached with this MoU (Refer Annex 3) IV) The release of payments will be as per the activities and timelines described in (IV) below.

V) The terms and conditions for the release of payments are as follows:

- 50% of total amount on signing of MoU.
- 50% of total amount upon completion of all activities and submission and acceptance by NIUA of the Final Report.

Termination

- 10. I) In the event of cancellation of NIUA's contract agreement with the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, payments will be based on mutual agreement between Guru Ram Das School of Planning(GRDSP) and NIUA reflecting the situation and tasks carried out by Guru Ram Das School of Planning(GRDSP).
 - II) In the event of termination of the MoU for non-submission of report, Guru Ram Das School of Planning (GRDSP) shall be liable to refund to NIUA the amount proportionate to the tasks remaining to be performed, out of the amount received by Guru Ram Das School of Planning (GRDSP) of the advance payment of the total amount.

Arbitration

11. Any differences between Parties concerning the interpretation and/or application of this agreement or matters arising out of or connected with this agreement shall be settled amicably through consultations or negotiations failing which the parties agree to refer the disputes/difference, if any, to an Arbitrator mutually agreed upon and appointed by the parties under the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 or its statutory amendments thereof. The venue of arbitration shall be at Delhi alone.



Liability

- 12. NIUA shall not be liable for any damages or compensation payable at law in respect of or in consequence of any accident or injury to any member of staff or other person in the employ of Guru Ram Das School of Planning (GRDSP) or in relation to the violation of any right of third parties, including but limited to copyrights. By the act of signature of this MoU, Guru Ram Das School of Planning(GRDSP) agrees that NIUA is indemnified and kept indemnified against all such damages and compensation and against all claims, proceedings, costs, charges and expenses whatsoever in respect thereof or in relation thereto. Insurance cover against such liability is Guru Ram Das School of Planning (GRDSP) responsibility.
- 13. Guru Ram Das School of Planning (GRDSP) shall indemnify NIUA against all losses and claims in respect of injuries or damage to any person or material or physical damage to any property or to other (intellectual) rights to third parties whatsoever which may arise out of or in consequence of the execution of the project and against all claims, proceedings, damages costs, charges and expenses whatsoever in respect thereto. Guru Ram Das School of Planning (GRDSP) is responsible for insuring its own liability.

In the spirit of intellectual cooperation, scholarly exchange, and the development of international understanding, GURU NANAK DEV and USF agree to establish a program of exchange and collaboration including work on Entrepreneurship Development, as well as other related matters of mutual interest that may emerge over time.

- Both parties understand that all financial arrangements for specific exchange activities must be mutually agreed upon.
- 5. In addition, the scope of the activities will be subject to funds available at the institutions for the type of collaboration undertaken. Nothing in this Agreement obligates either party to commit or transfer any funds, assets, or other resources in support of projects or activities between the parties.
- 6. Either party may propose to the other specific individual research projects for collaboration. Such proposal may be made at any time and the parties will develop an written agreement for each agreed-upon project. The protection and exploitation of any intellectual property arising out of a research project will be addressed in each individual project agreement early on and on an ongoing basis. With regard to intellectual property, each institution will adhere to the intellectual property laws of its respective nation. Intellectual property developed during the visit of a faculty or student visitor will be governed by the rules of the host institution unless otherwise specified by an alternate agreement. In general, the two institutions shall jointly own jointly developed intellectual property resulting from clearly defined collaborative projects. Whenever one institution receives any information from the partner under a clearly defined non-disclosure agreement, necessary steps will be taken to protect the intellectual property received, to the extent permissible by law.
- 7. Day to day implementation of this Agreement will be coordinated by <u>Professor S S Behl</u>
 GURU NANAK DEV University, India and Dr. Sunil Mithas, MUMA College of Business,
 University of South Florida, USA.
- 9. The parties agree that in the course of implementing this MOU, they will not engage in unlawful discrimination on the grounds of race, gender, sexual orientation, age, religion, social class, national or ethnic origin or disability.

- 10. Amendments to this MOU may be made at any time after consultation and agreement between the two universities. Any such amendment must be in writing and signed by both parties.
- 11. This MOU will remain in force for a period of one year initially, and can be from the Effective Date. The MOU can also be suitably modified, as agreed to in writing by both the parties, to reflect an increased scope, nature of engagement/activities including financial commitments, if any. Prior to the expiration date, the MOU may be reviewed for possible renewal for a further one-year period. In addition, either party may terminate the MOU in advance of its normal expiration by providing the other with ninety (90) days prior written notice. In this case, persons already approved as exchange participants will be allowed to complete their exchange visits under the conditions specified at the time of their invitation to the host institution.
- 12. Neither party may use the name, logo or trademarks of the other party, or of any of such party's employees, agents, or affiliates, in any advertising, promotional or sales literature, or other publicity, public announcement or suggestion of endorsement without the prior written approval of the other party.

The Parties therefore agree on the objective of creating an institutional framework for enriching students in mutually agreed fields of academics, research, training and placements with the following broad objectives and scope:

B: Broad Objectives and Scope:

Objectives

- The collaboration between Guru Nanak Dev University and Nishan-e-Sikhi Charitable
 Trust for creating proper and adequate infrastructure for meeting the requirements of
 civil services aspirants.
- To provide library facilities to the students by procuring more books/ materials etc. if required, relevant books, journals and source material available in soft form, for the students preparing for civil services exams.
- To hire/appoint additional fully trained faculty from within outside the University for effective teaching in the AISCCE, if required.
- AISCCE jointly with Nishan-e-Sikhi Charitable Trust aims at helping students to develop confidence in them through interaction with teachers on diverse kind of themes relevant to their preparation for IAS/PCS/UPSC examinations.
- To develop collaboration with institutions / individuals who could contribute to further growth of the AISCCE.

Scope

The scope of collaboration between Guru Nanak Dev University and Nishan-e-Sikhi Charitable Trust can include (but not restricted to) activities mentioned below to raise funds for creation of a corpus for self-sufficiency, sustainability and future development of GNDU since project is not for profit purpose and the purpose is growth and development of GNDU in line with Public Private Partnership (PPP) as envisaged by Government of India:

- 1. Both the parties will jointly work for creating smart class rooms, fully equipped library, common teachers and students' rooms (Out of funds provided by Nishan-e-Sikhi in the HRDC building on the campus to be given to the AISCCE from new academic session 2019-20, to commence tentatively from August 2019.
- Parties will ensure quality teaching to the civil services aspirants with in premises of AISCCE, covering preliminary, as well as main exams. The successful students in the main exams will also be helped to prepare for the interview.
- 3. The faculty members teaching in the AISCCE will help centre preparing list of books, journals and other relevant sources to be procured in the Library for use of the students.
- For supplementing the source materials for the students a computer lab will be sought to be created in the Centre for use of students.
- 5. Faculty in addition to the currently hired will also sought to be associated from within and outside the University for making Centre of national standards.

C: Mode of Operation:

Both parties will provide necessary support for effective implementation of the MOU within the institutional Rules and Procedures

- 1. This MOU shall be effective from the date it is signed by both the Parties.
- Within the broad framework of the MOU, GNDU and Nishan-e-Sikhi Charitable Trust will work for ensuring quality pre examination teaching to the PCS, IAS/ UPSC aspirants.
- 3. Financial commitment:
 - a) Nishan-e-Sikhi Charitable Trust will provide finances/ will help build infrastructure to the tune of Rs. 25, 00,000/ (twenty five lacs) spread over two years that is academic session of 2019-20 and 2020-21 and university will pay GST as per rules. For the current financial year Trust will provide finances/ will help build infrastructure to the tune of Rs.15, 00,000/, to be given in two installments. Out of this half of the amount is to be spent for developing infrastructure within AISCCE and half for the purchase of books, journals and soft material. The first installment of Rs. 7, 50,000/ will be utilized as follow: Rs.4, 50,000/ for developing infrastructure within AISCCE and Rs. 3, 00,000/ for the purchase of library books, journals, etc. And the second of installment of Rs. 7, 50,000/ will be utilized as follow: Rs.4, 50,000/ for the purchase of library books, journals, etc. and Rs. 3, 00,000/ for developing infrastructure within AISCCE.

- b) The infrastructure related requirements will be worked jointly by Consultant-cum-Coordinator of AISCCE, GNDU and the Coordinator to be appointed by the Nishan-e-Sikhi Charitable Trust. The Trust will provide infrastructure of the value mentioned above and no cash will be transferred to the University for this purpose. The Trust will make purchases and the purchases so made will be given to and recorded in the stock register of the AISCCCE and shall be ownership of GNDU. Money for other purposes will be transferred to the University to be included in relevant budget head of the Centre.
- c) The 10,00.000/ (ten lacs) to be given by the Trust in the next financial year that is 2020-21 in two installments will be utilized as follows: five lacs to go to the AISCCE budget head for the purchase of books and five lacs to the budget head of hiring parttime faculty from within and outside the University.
- d) In return for financial contribution by the Trust and its help for building infrastructure the AISCCE of GNDU will impart teaching (at its own cost) to up to maximum 30 students for UPSC and PCS exams, preliminary as well as main exams, to be selected by the Trust, The students will not pay fee to GNDU and will have free access to AISCCE and main library of GNDU. The students admitted by Trust will board and lodge with them and they accompanied teacher incharge, to be appointed by Nishan-e-Sikhi Charitable Trust (Regd.), Khadoor Sahib, attend University on all working days in their own mode of transport,
- e) The activities under this MOU shall be coordinated, monitored and recorded by an Internal Coordination Committee constituted of members nominated by both parties; each organization will appoint an internal coordinator who will organize joint meetings at regular intervals at mutually agreed locations and maintain records of agreements, work plan and progress.
- f) The Internal Coordination Committee will formulate action plans at its meetings and communicate for information and necessary approvals by the concerned authorities.
- g) The amount of consideration fixed at Rs. 25,00,000/- shall be inclusive of all taxes (namely GST @ 18%).

D: Obligations of the Parties

- In accordance with the clause C-e as above, Prof. (Dr.) Kuldip Singh, Consultant-cum-Coordinator, AISCCE, GNDU, Amritsar will be the Internal Coordinator from GNDU Amritsar, whereas, from Nishan-e-Sikhi Charitable Trust a person to be nominated by it, will be the Internal Coordinator.
- 2 Each party shall nominate two members to the Internal Coordination Committee within 15 days of signing the MOU.
- Each Party shall provide all necessary support at its disposal and as allowed by its institutional Rules, for implementing this MOU effectively.

E: Duration and Termination

- This MOU shall remain in force for a period of two years from the date of signing of this agreement.
- This MOU may be terminated with at least three months prior notice given in writing and with the written consent of the Heads of the two organizations.

F: Data Sharing and Intellectual Property Rights

- The Intellectual Property Rights in respect of joint project will be decided on case-to-case basis by both the parties.
- Sharing of any data generated (either observational or computational) under the aegis of this MOU shall be as per the provisions of the specific projects/programmes.
- Each Party shall duly acknowledge the contribution/involvement of the other Party in a
 given activity in its bulletins/publications/media release/outreach and any other official
 communication.

This MOU is not intended to constitute, create, give effect to, or otherwise recognize a joint venture, partnership, or formal business organization of any kind, and the rights and obligations of the Parties shall be only those expressly set forth herein. Nothing in this MOU shall be construed to grant either Party the right to make commitments of any kind for or on behalf of the other without the other's prior written consent.

H: FORCE MAJEURE

Neither Parties shall be held responsible for non-fulfillment of their respective obligations under this MOU due to the exigency of one or more of the Force Majeure events such as, but not limited to, the acts of God, War, Flood, Earthquake, Strikes, Lockouts, Epidemic, Riots, Civil commotions etc. provided on the occurrence and cessation of any such event the Party affected thereby shall give a notice in writing to the other Party within 30 (Thirty) days of such occurrence or cessation. If the Force Majeure

GOVERNING LAWS AND DISPUTES RESOLUTION

- 1. This MOU shall, in all respects, be governed by and construed in all respects in accordance with the laws of the Republic of India. This MOU is to create a framework for enriching students in mutually agreed fields of research through collaboration in developing and implementing new academic and research programmes and faculty and students exchange. The scope of collaboration between Guru Nanak Dev University and Nishan-e-Sikhi Charitable Trust can to raise funds for creation of a corpus for self sufficiency, sustainability and future development of GNDU since project is not for profit purpose and the purpose is growth and development of GNDU in line with Public Private Partnership (PPP) as envisaged by Government of India
- 2. Hence any question, doubt or dispute arising out of the interpretation of any term or usage herein or on the implementation and functioning of the various understandings forming a part of this MOU shall be resolved by the Executive Heads of the two organizations or their authorized representatives for the purpose mentioned herein by discussions and negotiations based on consensus in the spirit of developing and strengthening the mutual relationships.
- 3. Any unresolved dispute, shall be referred to Vice-Chancellor, GNDU Amritsar, and Chairman Nishan-e-Sikhi Charitable Trust for resolution and if not an independent arbitrator appointed by both the parties with mutual consent in accordance with Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 and rules framed thereof. Arbitration shall be conducted at Amritsar in English. The decision of arbitrators shall be final and binding on both the parties.
- 4. Each clause of this MOU is severable and if one clause is rendered illegal or is severed, it will not render the whole MOU illegal and all clauses except severed clause shall be valid & binding between two parties.

Sant Longowal Institute of Engineering and Technology, Longowal, Sangrur (Punjab) India (hereinafter referred to as "SLIET, Longowal" and the context so admits includes its successors and assignees) and Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar, (Punjab) India to as "GNDU, Amritsar" and the context so admits includes its successors and assignees) agree to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding to facilitate while taking initiatives to start the Teaching and Research Collaboration with the GNDU, Amritsar Now it is hereby agreed as follows:

Article 1. Scope of cooperation

The scope of this MoU covers (Provide the broad list the activities / programmes meant to be included. A suggestive list is provided below which can be pruned / modified)

- 1. GNDU, Amritsar can offer summer / winter internship for the students of SLIET, Longowal.
- Undergraduate Students of GNDU, Amritsar can also opt for laboratory experiments and internship with respective Departments of SLIET, Longowal.
- Possibilities may be explored to modify the course curriculum of various Courses of relevant specialization in consultation with GNDU, Amritsar.
- Possibilities may also be explored to start teaching and R&C collaboration in the area of Food Technology/Processing etc.
- Possibilities may also be explored for UG and PG projects thesis / dissertation etc. with mutual consultation

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Article 2. Mechanism for implementation

For the purpose of implementation of this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU), SLIET, Longowal, will be represented by Dr. A. S. Arora, Dean (Academics), HOD (Food Engineering and Technology) and Prof. Sukhcharn Singh and GNDU, Amritsar will be represented by Dr. D.S.Sogi, Professor (Food Science and Technology).

These representatives may meet as and when necessary to draw plans of action and to review the progress in the implementation of the agreed arrangements as outlined in Article-1.

If necessary, separate subsidiary agreements may be signed for one or more of the activities mentioned in Article-1, for specific details and terms and conditions. All activities under this MoU shall be subject to availability of resources and approval by the competent authorities of the respective organizations.

Article 3. Financial obligations

For each activity outlined in Article-1, the extent of financial commitment by the two organizations will be separately negotiated and agreed upon. Prior to final agreement and the carrying out of any activity arising from this MOU both SLIET, Longowal and GNDU, Amritsar, must obtain the concurrence, in writing, from their respective Finance / Accounts and Audit Sections. GST and other Levies will be applicable as per rules.

Article 4. Duration of MoU

This MoU will come into force on the date of its execution by the authorized signatories of SLIET, Longowal, and GNDU, Amritsar, and shall remain in force for a period of five years and may be renewed upon its expiry with the mutual consent of both the organizations. If this MOU remains dormant for three consecutive years, it will be deemed to have been lapsed.

Either SLIET, Longowal, or GNDU, Amritsar, may terminate the MOU by giving three months' notice, in writing, to the other party. The termination of this MOU shall not affect the implementation of the activities already established under it prior to such termination.

Article 5. Amendments

This MOU may only be amended by mutual consent / agreement evidenced in writing by a duly authorised representative (s) from both the organizations.

Article 6. Intellectual Property

Any intellectual property arising out of the implementation of this MoU shall be jointly owned by both the institutes.

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Article 7. Settlement of Disputes

Any dispute, conflict of interest or problems arising out from the application or interpretation of this MoU shall be resolved by mutual discussion and in good faith by the designated representatives of both the organizations as mentioned in Article-2. Any unresolved matter will be referred to Vice Chancellor, GNDU, Amritsar and Director SLIET, Longowal and an independent arbitrator involved with the mutual consent in accordance with the Arbitration and Conciliation Act 1996 and rules framed thereof. The decision of the arbitrator shall be final and binding on both the parties.

Article 8. Legal status

Nothing in this MoU shall be construed as creating any legal relationship between the parties. This MoU is a statement of intent to foster genuine and mutually beneficial cooperation.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING



RETWEEN

GURU NANAK DEV UNIVERSITY, AMRITSAR

AND

PUNJAB AGRICULTURAL UNIVERSITY, LUDHIANA

This Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) is made between;

(A) Guru Nanak Dev University, GT Road, Amritsar was established on November 24, 1969 to mark the 500th birth anniversary of Sri Guru Nanak Dev Ji. It is both a residential and an affiliating university. The University was declared University with Potential for Excellence by University Grants Commission, New Delhi to establish Centres of Advance Studies in Chemistry, Physics, Environmental Sciences and Comparative Literature. The University is accredited with a CGPA of 3.5 out of 4 with 'A' Grade, highest for any University by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council and Academic Staff College of the University placed at 12th rank by NAAC, Bengaluru.

And

(B) Punjab Agricultural University, Ferozpur Road, Ludhiana was inaugurated by Pt. Jawahar Lal Nehru, Prime Minister of India on July 8, 1963. The University was modelled on the pattern of land grant colleges in US. It has played a key role in increasing food production in Punjab state and ushering in an era of Green Revolution in India. It has made notable contributions in increasing livestock and poultry production in the state. In 1995, was adjudged as Best Agricultural University in India. The PAU is a pioneer state agricultural university (SAU) in India for research, education and extension in India. The university has played a pivotal role in making the country self-sufficient in food grain production and is known as "Mother of Green Revolution". PAU was the first university to get special grant of `100 crores by the Central Government in 2006-07 for Basic and Strategic Research in Agriculture and as

an acknowledgement of its role in eliminating food shortages and alleviating hunger. Ranked 2nd among all Agricultural Universities by MHRD (NIRF) in 2017.

The two institutions agree to the following broad terms of cooperation:

- Both the institutions will support each other's endeavours in delivery of academic programmes and research activities through the following but not limited to:
 - Exchange of scientific and technical information.
 - (ii) Joint supervision of Postgraduate and Ph.D. students.
 - (iii) Undertaking collaborative research activities through participation in nationally and internationally funded project.
 - (iv) Jointly organize events such as seminars, workshops, conferences and training programs.
 - (v) Training of students of both institutions as per the facilities and resources available.
 - (vi) Any other objective as agreed upon in writing by both the institutions to achieve the objective of MoU.
- Both parties acknowledge and understand that all financial arrangements, if any, will be subjected to prior written agreement and availability of funds for each activity/project undertaken.
- 3. The MoU remains in place for a period of five years from the date of signing of the agreement and may be renewed for a further period of five years or such time period as agreed by both the parties in writing.
- No party shall have the right to use the name or logo of another party without the prior 4. approval of that party in writing.
- The terms of this MoU may be modified/amended at any time subject to mutual written 5. agreement. Such modifications/changes shall be effective from the date on which both the parties execute them in writing.
- The MoU may be terminated by either party by giving 3 months written notice. In the 6. event of termination, both the parties shall endure that the interests of students working /projects under this MoU are safe guarded to the extent possible.

Responsibilities of the Parties

Both parties mutually agree to identify various areas of interest and depute faculty/staff as per the requirements with mutual consent. The inviting institution shall meet the travelling expenditure as per norms of host institution, may be applicable. The inviting institution shall make necessary lodging and boarding arrangements for the deputed person. GST and other Levies will be applicable as per rules.

Both the institutions shall identify for accomplishing the above laid down objectives. Each party shall attempt to make such faculty available as and when required.

Both the institutions shall organize regular faculty interactions/meets to promote research interaction and collaboration among their faculty members. These meets may be organized for entire institute or specific to any department or school as per mutual convenience.

Every individual research collaboration will have a separate agreement/terms of contract that addresses issues such as Intellectual Property Right (IPR), funding pattern, disclosure of confidential information etc.

In the event of any dispute or difference arising in the implementation of the MoU, such disputes shall be resolved amicably by mutual discussions by the Directors of both the institutions. All such decisions shall take into account the status of students working/projects under this arrangement and the interest of such students/projects shall be guarded as much as possible. Any unresolved matter will be referred to Vice Chancellor, GNDU, Amritsar and Vice Chancellor, PAU, Ludhiana and an independent arbitrator involved with the mutual consent in accordance with the Arbitration and Conciliation Act 1996 and rules framed thereof. The decision of the arbitrator shall be final and binding on both the parties.


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MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

BETWEEN:

GURU NANAK DEV UNIVERSITY AMRITSAR PUNIAB, INDIA (HEREAFTER REFERRED TO AS GNDU)

WHEREAS:

- A. The parties hereto share a common interest in many academic and educational fields; and
- B. In order to facilitate future institutional cooperation, the parties hereto wish to enter into this Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU").

NOW THEREFORE, the parties hereto agree as follows:

- Objective. The objective of this MOU is to outline the possible ways in which MEMORIAL UNIVERSITY OF NEWFOUNDLAND and GURU NANAK DEV UNIVERSITY, could develop and carry out collaborative activities.
- Scope of Activities. The scope of collaboration on academic and research activities under this MOU may include, but is not limited to the following:
 - a) exchange of faculty members
 - b) undergraduate and graduate student mobility
 - c) exchange of publications, research materials, newsletters, etc.
 - d) joint projects related to research, teaching and faculty development
 - e) development of joint initiatives with partner institutions, including joint or collaborative degree
 - f) opportunities for full-degree fee paying undergraduate/graduate study.

3. Permission is given to Partner Institution to use Memorial University's institutional name and/or institutional logo solely for the purposes of promoting and administering the collaborative activities between the institutions. The partner institution shall comply with Memorial University's brand standards with respect to any such use of the institutional logo, the details of which can be found here: https://www.mun.ca/marcomm/brand/standards/BrandStandards_August_2017_FA.pdf). Versions of Memorial University's logos are located here: https://www.mun.ca/marcomm/brand/logos/memorialslogo.php. Questions or concerns about

the usage and implementation of our official marks and brand standards can be directed to our Marketing and Communications team through email at marcomm@mun.ca.

The partner institute shall also be at liberty to use name and/or logo of Guru Nanak Dev University in the similar manner and for purpose.

- 4. Not Legally Binding. This MOU is not intended to be and is not to be construed as a legally binding agreement. Signing of this MOU does not result in any material, financial or other obligation for either of the parties hereto. By signing this MOU, the parties are signifying their desire for future collaboration. Specific initiatives may be considered and agreed upon, on a case by case basis, including the contributions and obligations of each institution. Each such initiative shall be negotiated between and have the mutual agreement of the institutions, and shall be formalized by a signed appendix to this MOU.
- 5. Term. This MOU is effective for a period of 5(five) years from the date the MOU is signed by both parties. It may be extended or amended upon written agreement of both parties and may be terminated by either party with 6 (six) months' prior written notice to the other party. Any notice of termination should be addressed as follows:

Memorandum of Understanding for Research Collaboration between

Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar (GNDU)

This MOU is between the National Chung Hsing University, Taiwan acting through its College of Agriculture and Natural Resources (CANR, NCHU) and having its office at Taichung, Taiwan (hereinafter after called "CANR, NCHU" WHICH expression shall where the context so admits include its successors and permitted assigns) of the ONE PART.

And

Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar (GNDU) through its Department of Agriculture and Centre for Agriculture Research and Innovation (CARI) including its successors, assignees and legal representatives (thereafter to be known as the Second part)

GNDU and CANR individually referred to herein as a 'party' and collectively as the 'parties'.

A. Preamble

Where, National Chung Hsing University (NCHU), Taiwan is an international higher education institution, NCHU was founded as an agricultural campus but is now a comprehensive university, composed of nine colleges. The university will organize a

Vice Chancellor Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar think tank to manage its general affairs and sustain competitive competence. NCHU also aspires to be more engaged with members of the Taiwan Comprehensive University System, aiming to take the lead in a new era of higher education.

Where, Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar, Punjab, established on November 24, 1969 has a long tradition of pursuing excellence in teaching and research in science, technology, humanities, social sciences, performing arts and sports. 'The University supports excellence and innovation in academic programmes and promotes excellence in research, scholarship and teaching.

Whereas, it is highly desirable to develop multi-disciplinary training and research through involvement and integration of diverse but relevant disciplines through synergy and knowledge sharing, and ensure dissemination of knowledge to all corners of the country;

Both parties felt that a sustained, synergetic and effective collaboration between GNDU and CANR will enhance the strength, and add value to, the efforts of each party;

Therefore, GNDU and CANR (jointly "Institutions") hereby agree to enter into a cooperative relationship for the general purpose of promoting educational, research and cultural programmes for the mutual benefit of both the Institutions in areas of mutual interest, and in accordance with principles set forth in this memorandum of understanding ("MOU"). It is the mutual intent of the two Institutions to explore and promote opportunities to carry out the general forms of co-operation ("the Purpose") in above mentioned areas, which include the following, but not limited:

B. Broad Objectives

- a) to exchange information on academic, research and curriculum matters,
- to exchange, on a reciprocal basis, the faculty, researchers and students for limited periods of time for purpose of education and/ or research - the modalities of which will be worked out on case to case basis,

- to exchange information on teaching, learning material and other literature relevant to their educational and research programmes,
- d) to jointly organize short-term continuing educational programmes, seminars, conferences, workshops or summer/winter schools on topics of mutual interests and to invite each other's faculty and researchers to participate therein,
- to jointly propose and engage in research or training programmes sponsored by funding agencies and to invite each other's faculty and researchers to participate therein,
- f) to jointly mentor Ph.D. students of each other on topics of mutual interest and expertise. To be worked out on case to case bases.

C. Mode of Operation

GNDU and CANR agree to respect each other's rights to intermediately actual property. Further, the intellectual property rights that arise as a result of any obligative research or activity under the MOU will be worked out on case-to-case be sis.

Detail of the implementation of any particular collaborative a civities will be developed mutually between the two institutions as such specific cases arise.

Both Institutions understand that they have no financial commitment to each other, however, will join to apply for external funding wherever posible.

The institutions intend to co-operate in good faith to achieve the Purpose. This MOU does not create any legal binding rights or obligations but refects the intensions of the Institutions to work together in good faith to promote and motor the agreed Purpose.

This MOU is not intended to be construed to create or give effect to a joint venture, association, partnership or other business organization or gency arrangement and neither Institution shall have the authority under this MOU to ind the order without the prior written approval of the other Institution.

D. Obligations of the Parties

Each Institution will appoint one member of its teaching/research personnel to coordinate the MOU on its behalf. The co-ordinator, thus appointed, will periodically review and identify ways to strengthen co-operation between the two Institutions.

Each party shall provide all necessary support at its disposal and as allowed by its institutional Rules, for implementing this MOU effectively.

The Parties shall share knowledge and facilities within the institutional Rules of each Party, to

- a) provide access to libraries, archives, research laboratories and other facilities;
- provide access to facilities and equipments as mutually agreed.
- encourage joint discussions on new developments, formulation of academic and writing of scientific and technical papers and projects;
- share knowledge/ information and publications/magazines/literature as may be essential for the academic pursuit;
- e) provide logistic support/guest house facility for the scientists/experts involved in this MOU at locations of both parties and no financial commitment from either organization shall be assumed unless a formal approval/acceptance to that effect has been accorded through signed documents by both the organizations parties to bear their own cost in meeting with alone.

E. Duration and Termination

- The MOU will remain valid for five years from the date it is signed by the authorized officials of the two Institutions. Thereafter, this MOU may be extended for any period of time as deemed appropriate by both Institutions, subject to the mutual consent of both institutions, any such extension to be agreed on writing.
- Either Institution may terminate the MOU by giving written notice to the other Institution six months in advance. GNDU and CANR will ensure that all activities in progress under the terms of an implementing MOU are allowed to complete successfully.

Termination of this MOU, between the participating parties shall not terminate the agreements entered between the Parties with any third party which the Parties may have entered into in executing the agreements under this MOU. The Parties shall continue to obtain the benefits of such third party agreement. After termination of MOU, neither of the Parties will be responsible for any losses, financial or otherwise, which the other party may suffer and indemnifies each other. Upon termination and expiry of the MOU, Parties are obliged to keep the information confidential, as agree above.

F. Data Sharing and Intellectual Property Rights

- No rights in Industrial and/or Intellectual Property (including without limitation, letters, patent, registered design, software copyrights, trademark and copyright) owned by the Parties on the date of signature of this MOU and independently developed on their part are hereby granted by the owning Party to the other Party, nor shall any such rights be deemed to be granted except specified by the owning Party in writing.
- 2. The Intellectual Property Rights in respect of joint project(s) will he decided on case-to-case basis. Parties will mutually decide on sharing of required information by way of joint publication in journals and seminars or workshops. All publications resulting from the collaborations between the Parties will be mentioned in the scientific reports of either Party.
- Sharing of any data generated (either observational or computational) under the aegis of this MOU shall be as per the provisions of the specific project/programme.
- Each Party shall duly acknowledge the contribution/involvement of the other Party in a given activity in its bulletins/publications/media release/outreach and any other official communication.
- Every member of both Parties in any activity under the aegis of this MOU shall

abide by the prevailing policies of Govt. of India with respect to classified information/data. During the tenure of this MOU including extension if any thereafter, Parties undertake on their behalf and on behalf of their employees or representatives or associates to maintain strict confidentiality and prevent disclosure thereof to any third party, all the information and data exchanged or generated during the operation of MOU.

G. General Provisions

- Neither Party shall assign, or in any manner, transfer its interest or any part 1. thereof in this MOU, except to wholly owned subsidiaries and agreed explicitly to that effect in writing. This MOU shall he binding on and inure to the benefit of the Parties hereto and their respective heirs, personal representatives, successors and assignees.
- 2. This MOU constitutes the entire understanding between the Parties relating to the subject matter hereof and supersedes and cancels any and all previous or representations commitments, MOU's. negotiations, understandings between the Parties with respect to this MOU, and the subject matter hereof, If any of the provisions of this are determined to be invalid under applicable law, they are, to that extent, deemed omitted. The invalidity of any portion of this MOU shall not render any other portion invalid.
- No amendments or modifications or this MOU shall be valid unless they are 3. made in writing by both the Parties or their authorized representatives and specifically stating the same to be an amendment of this MOU. The modifications/changes shall be effective from the date on which they are made or executed unless otherwise agreed to.
- This MOU is not intended to constitute, create, give effect to, or otherwise 4. recognize a joint venture, partnership, or formal business organization of any kind, and the rights and obligations of the Parties shall be only those expressly set forth herein. Nothing in this MOU shall be construed to grant either Party the right to make commitments of any kind for or on behalf of other without the

others prior written consent.

H. Force Majeure

Neither Parties shall be held responsible for non-fulfillment of their respective obligations under this MOU due to the exigency of one or more of the Force Majeure events such as, but not limited to, the acts of God, War, Flood, Earthquake, Strikes, Lockouts, Epidemic and Pandemics, Riots, Civil commotions etc. provided on the occurrence and cessation of any such event the Party affected thereby shall give a notice in writing to the other Party within 30 (Thirty) days of such occurrence or cessation. If the Force Majeure conditions continue beyond (six) months, the Parties shall jointly decide about the future course of action.

I. Governing Laws and Disputes Resolution

This Memorandum of understanding is made and entered into on 11.8.2020 between SciRox, Science Club, Guru Nanak Dev University located at SCF 54, UT Market, Grand trunk road, Off NH1, Amritsar, Punjab (hereinafter referred to as "SciRox, Science Club, GNDU") and Society for Promotion of Science and Technology in India, located at 229, Mansa Devi Complex, Sector-4, 134114, Panchkula, India. (hereinafter referred to as "SPSTI") The MoU is being signed between SciRox, GNDU and Society for Promotion of Science and Technology in India.

Whereas

SciRox is a very fruitful initiative taken by the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor Prof. (Dr.) Jaspal Singh Sandhu, Guru Nanak Dev University (GNDU). SciRox is a student-run club with a purpose to promote various scientific activities among students. In a bid to make science popular, SciRox is constantly working to keep the scientific spirits alive by organizing a number of activities for students under the mentorship of Dr. Bindiya Arora (Department of Physics, GNDU) and Dr. Venus Singh Mithu (Department of Chemistry, GNDU). The club aims to develop scientific temperament, increase collaboration among students and provide a common platform for students' interaction. Students from different departments collaborate for learning and growing together. It aims to promote science among students of GND University main campus, Colleges affiliated to GND University and students of schools affiliated to PSEB, CBSE and ICSE situated in Punjab.

Whereas

The Society for Promotion of Science and Technology in India (SPSTI) is a not-for-profit NGO engaged in popularization and promotion of science and developing scientific temper in the society, children and youth in particular. The SPSTI was set by thirty seven leading scientists, academicians and administrators and registered vide registration number 80/2009, with the District registrar of Firms & Societies, Panchkula, under the Societies Registration Act, 1860 (now under the new Haryana Registration & Regulation of Societies Act, 2012 after repealing of the 1860 Act in Haryana). SPSTI has taken several initiatives and conducted a large number of programs and events on diverse themes and subjects. The SPSTI has also received concession under Sections 12A and 80G (5) of the Income Tax Act, 1961

CONTEXT:

As a part of this MoU, both the parties hereto agree to the following respectively.

SPSTI

- 1) Will co-organize scientific workshops, conferences, exhibitions and eminent lectures in association with
- 2) Will make all the necessary resources (guidance, support, etc.) available to the SciRox, Science Club,
- 3) Will co-organize Summer schools/Open day/Educational tours in association with SciRox, GNDU. GNDU to organize activities/events.
- 4) Will provide support and guidance to the journal Published by SciRox, GNDU.
- 5) Will assist, guide and participate in events organized by SciRox for the promotion of science and technology in jurisdiction of GND University.
- 6) Will seek financial support for SciRox, GNDU to conduct activities for the promotion of science at university, college and schools affiliated to CBSE, ICSE and PSEB situated in Punjab region.
- 7) Will support and co-organize community interaction programs and career awareness programs using Mobile Science Laboratory with SciRox, Science Club, GNDU, and-
- 8) Other forms of cooperation as are mutually agreed from time to time.

SciRox, Science Club, GNDU

- 1) Will acknowledge SPSTI as science outreach partner in all external and internal communications to the
- 2) Will provide student's' support (Undergraduate and Post-Graduate) as interns to teach and mentor the students attending Summer Schools organized by SPSTI in jurisdiction of the GND University.
- 3) Will support media coverage to create awareness about various scientific programs organized collaboratively, by issuing press releases and online videos/blog posts on social media/website of SciRox, Science Club, GNDU.

Mode of Operation:

- 1) This MoU may be amended by mutual agreement of both the parties.
- 2) Both parties understand that all the financial arrangements for specific activities must be mutually
- 3) Any financial commitments for joint activities under this MoU shall be subject to a formal approval/acceptance through signed documents by both the organizations.
- 4) The activities under this MoU will be coordinated, monitored and recorded by an Internal Coordination committee constituted by both the parties; each organization will appoint an internal coordinator who will organize joint meetings at regular interval at mutually agreed locations and maintain records of agreements, work plan and progress.
- 5) The Internal Coordination Committee will formulate action plans at its meetings and communicate for information and necessary approvals by the concerned authorities.
- 6) Each party shall provide all necessary support at its disposal and as allowed by its institutional rules, for implementing this MoU effectively.
- 7) Both, SciRox, Science Club, GNDU and SPSTI understand that this MoU is not intended to create binding or legal obligations on either party.

Duration and Termination:

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MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This Memorandum of Understanding (hereinafter referred to as "MoU") entered into on thisday of oct. 2020 by and between:

National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) Ministry of Road Transport and Highways, Project Implementation Unit, E-9, Dreamcity, Manawala -143115 (Punjab) through its Regional Officer, Chandigarh, which expression shall, unless repugnant to the context or meaning thereof be deemed to mean and include its successors and permitted assigns), of the First party;

AND

The Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar, (hereinafter called as GNDU which the expression shall unless repugnant to the context or meaning thereof be deemed to mean and include its successors and permitted assigns) of the Second Party.

WHEREAS,

Both GNDU and NHAI are desirous of working together with mutual cooperation for dissemination of respective expertise in civil/highway engineering field through the road infrastructure development.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY AGREED BY THE PARTIES AS FOLLOWS:

1. INTENT:

National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) intends to associate the GNDU who shall voluntarily contribute its share of experience for betterment of the highway infrastructure.

2. SCOPE OF THE MoU

The primary scope of MOU inter alia includes the following:

- (i) NHAI shall facilitate the faculty, researchers and students of the Institute to familiarize with the latest trends in the highway/transportation sector with a common objective of sharing the knowledge in their respective domain. This will, in one hand, facilitate to bridge the industry-institution gap and familiarize students with the latest trends in industry and on the other hand the research output could be suitably adopted in practice by NHAI.
- (ii) The Institute shall adopt nearby stretches of NHs as specified in the **Appendix-1** as a voluntary initiative under ambit of Institutional Social Responsibility (ISR). The list of stretches may be modified by deletion/addition by mutual consent of NHAI and GNDU.
- (iii) The adopted stretch may be used as a field of study for faculty, researchers and students.
- (iv) NHAI shall offer internship to 40 number of undergraduate/postgraduate students of the Institute. The duration of internship shall be of 2 months in a year based on experience and field requirement, the same may be reviewed in subsequent years.





(v) NHAI shall pay stipend @ Rs.8000/- (Rupees Eight Thousand only) per month for undergraduate students and @ Rs. 15000/- (Rupees Fifteen Thousand only) per month to Postgraduate students. All other arrangements including stay shall be responsibility of Institute or the concerned student/facility/scholar/researcher. However, depending upon availability, NHAI may extend transportation facility to the interns within the project jurisdiction.

3. Roles and Responsibilities:

The scope of this MOU shall be carried out in a collaborative mode between NHAI and GNDU. The Roles & Responsibilities of NHAI and GNDU in performing the defined objective shall be as follows:

NHAI

- a. NHAI shall provide the list of potential candidate National Highway stretches for adopting by the Technical Institute;
- b. NHAI shall facilitate availability of relevant data required with specific reference to the above stretches through its field office/consultant/concessionaire/contractor engaged in the project;
- NHAI will nominate an officer as a point of contact for all correspondence in carrying out the defined objective;
- d. NHAI shall facilitate the faculty, researchers and students of the Institute to give access to the site of the identified stretch being adopted by the Institute, relevant documents for the purpose of activities to be carried by these intellectuals of the Institute;
- e. NHAI through its field office/Consultant/Concessionaire/Contractor engaged in the project, as per reasonable requirement, will disseminate and familiarize the latest trends and know how in highway/transportation sector in general and the identified project in specific to the authorized faculty, researchers and students of the Institute:
- f. NHAI may suitably adopt the research output and feedback received from the Technical Institute in practice for qualitative improvement as deemed fit at appropriate stage of implementation.
- g. NHAI may support creation of Lab infrastructure in the Institute and can sponsor relevant research project that helps in using alternative resource material and improving quality of roads.
- h. The NH stretch adopted can be co-branded with the associated technical Institute by NHAI.

GNDU

- a. The Institute shall adopt stretch(es) of NHs as specified in the Appendix-1 as a voluntary initiative.
- b. The Technical Institute through its authorized faculty, researchers and students will carry out periodic investigation and give suitable suggestions for improving the efficiency of existing highway asset inter alia covering the following aspects:
 - (i) Improvements in safety provision by removing existing deficiencies;
 - (ii) Improvements in continual maintenance of the stretch using new technologies;
 - (iii) Localized solutions for removal of congestion points thereby increasing the average speed of traffic flow;
 - (iv) Improvements in the riding comfort through cost effective measures based on innovative technologies on practices applicable in the area;





- (v) Viability of new way side amenities for road user based on the existing traffic pattern and user expectations;
- (vi) Potential solutions to old recurring problems based on local experience etc.
- c. The Institute may also associate with the Consultants/NHAI during conceptualization, design and project preparation of new projects and suggest the relevant parameters and innovations based on experience specific to the site climate, topography and resource potential for better socio economic outcome
- d. GNDU will nominate a coordinator as a point of contact for all correspondence in carrying out the defined objective as well as inform, from time to time.

4. EFFECTIVE DATE AND PERIOD OF MOU

This MoU shall come into effect for all its intents and purposes from the immediate effect and shall remain valid for a period of 5 years from the date of signing unless terminated earlier by mutual consent by either party by giving 60 days' notice in writing to the other party.

The Guru Nanak Dev University (hereafter called the University) and Dr. Avinash Kaur (Professor Retd.) signed a Memorandum of Understanding to institute "Prof. I.S. Grover Memorial Lectureship Award" on the following terms and conditions:

- 1. The Lectureship shall be named as "Prof. I.S. Grover Memorial Lectureship Award"
- 2. An endowment of Rs. 5.00 Lac (Rupees Five Lac only) will be deposited in the University account by Prof. Avinash Kaur.
- 3. The Principal amount shall be kept by the Universityin a fixed deposit account(initially for a period of 5 years which may be further extended for such period as may be mutually decided by both the parties). 

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



CENTRE FOR SCIENCE AND ENVIRONMENT (CSE)

ON

ADVISORY, RESEARCH AND KNOWLEDGE SUPPORT FOR SUSTAINABILITY IN THE BUILT ENVIRONMENT

and

Centre for Science and Environment, located at 41, Tughlakabad Institutional Area, New Delhi, 110062 (hereinafter referred to as 'CSE'), legally represented by its Executive Director on the other part.

BACKGROUND

Centre for Sustainable Habitat is established at Guru Nanak Dev University (GNDU), Amritsar (Punjab, India) under Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA) – 02. It aims to propagate the agenda of sustainability in education, living and professional practice. It attempts to demonstrate coexistence of the natural and built environment in a way that reduces our planetary footprint, emissions, resource consumption and waste, and improves quality of life for all. This is done by integrating multi-faceted ecological, social, economic and cultural perspectives together and translating into applied sciences, technology and most importantly behaviour. The Centre specializes in research towards comprehensive understanding of environmental issues facing, but not limited to the country. University's expansive resources provide the opportunity for a practice-oriented and evidence-based research. This research not only augments the academic curricula and training but contributes to the larger scientific community, informs policy, generates platforms for dialogue with society, and shapes an engaging and enabling ethos that resonates in the University Campus and beyond.

Centre for Science and Environment (CSE) is a non-governmental, independent policy research institution based in Delhi that was started in 1981 by the late Anil Agarwal, a leading figure in India's environment movement. For more than three decades now, CSE has helped shape policies and build public awareness to bring change in areas of pollution mitigation and public health security, low carbon development, natural resource management and livelihood security to make growth sustainable and inclusive. CSE's Sustainable Building and Habitat Programme is designed to reduce energy and resource consumption, waste generation and emissions from urban

development. The programme seeks to promote a collaborative system of research, pilot studies and capacity building in issues related to sustainable development of the built environment.

The two institutions agree to jointly promote the cause of sustainable habitats by specialized research, pilot studies, training programmes, dissemination and building awareness among the community.

POINT 1: SPECIFIC PURPOSE OF MoU

The Parties agree to cooperate in the following areas: -

1.1 Knowledge Partnership

CSE will act as the knowledge partner of CSH to help mainstream sustainability in the built environment and attaining sustainable development goals. CSE shall assist CSH for greening of the GNDU campus and beyond by research, training, demonstration, dissemination and promoting sustainability. CSE will provide advisory and knowledge support by handholding with CSH to conduct research, training and pilot studies in line with the identified six research tracks of CSH and helping build capacities if and when required. Considering the ongoing COVID-19 disruption, initially the discussions and meetings will be conducted remotely through online platforms.

1.2 Needs-based Research and Capacity Building

Based on mutual need, both Institutions shall explore additional ways of collaborating to help strengthen the research, training and capacities. Activities may include joint research, workshops, seminars, conferences, and training programmes among other potential areas of cooperation in the field of sustainable and liveable habitats. The details of such arrangements shall be negotiated at the appropriate time on a case-to-case basis and be governed by the relevant approval processes.

POINT 2: RESPONSIBILITIES

Both institutions acknowledge the mutual alignment of their institutional vision, mission and values. Both organizations commit themselves to jointly accomplish the goals of the Capacity Building Project.

- **2.1 Sharing of information:** Both CSH and CSE shall maintain their respective lawful status with the appropriate authorities for the duration of the MoU. Either institutions shall keep the other informed of any change whatsoever occurring in the engagement plan which may affect the timely delivery of services and accomplishment of Project outcomes.
- 2.2 Financial support: CSE will not charge CSH for the technical assistance and knowledge support. In case of any travel arising under this Project, related costs shall be borne by the respective institution making the travel. For any meeting(s)/seminar(s)/workshop(s)/training(s), primary host/organizer shall arrange for the logistics and bear the associated costs as discussed mutually on case-to-case basis.
- 2.3 Focal Person: Both institutions shall each assign a designated focal person (Senior Official from CSH and Senior Official from CSE) to provide support to the Project, whose duties include supporting the visits of either institutions, or who will also arrange training and logistics for the smooth implementation of the Project.

POINT 3: LANGUAGE

All written correspondence and activities relating to the Project shall be transacted in the English Language.

POINT 4: ACCOUNTABILITY AND COMPLIANCE

The said Project shall be implemented in line with relevant policies and law of the Government of India, and shall comply with the institutional guidelines of both Institutions. This MoU is not binding or legal enforceable, does not impose enforceability of obligation upon the institutions and does not grant any rights.

POINT 5: CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION AND COPYRIGHT

- 5.1 Neither Institution shall disclose confidential information of the other Party to any person or third-Party or use of such confidential information for its own purpose at any time without the written consent of the other Party.
- 5.2 Any idea, innovation, training materials, management processes or documentation arising out of this collaboration shall be the intellectual property of both Institutions. Both Institutions may however use such intellectual materials, but with appropriate acknowledgement to the contributions made by either Party.

POINT 6: FORCE MAJEURE

No Institution covered under this MoU shall be liable for any failure to perform its obligation where such failure is a result of Acts of God, which are here defined as force majeure.

POINT 7: DURATION AND TERMINATION

This MoU shall come into effect on the date of signature by both Institutions and shall remain in force for an initial period of two (2) years, unless otherwise terminated by mutual consent, and with 30 days prior written notice to the other Institution.

POINT 8: DISPUTE RESOLUTION

Both Institutions agreed that if there is any dispute of difference between both arising out of the MoU or in the interpretation of any of the provisions thereof, they shall endeavour to meet in an effort to resolve such dispute by discussion, within 30 days of such dispute arising, failing such resolution then the Parties in dispute shall refer at their costs the dispute to a mutually to the senior executive/faculty member of institution.



Memorandum of Understanding Between

Nanak Singh Novelist Memorial Trust, Amritsar

The Guru Nanak Dev University (hereinafter called the University) and the Nanak Singh Memorial Trust (hereinafter called the Trust) has agreed to sign this Memorandum of Understanding to establish a Nanak Singh Centre within the premises of the University library and to institute the annual Nanak Singh Novelist Award and Nanak Singh Memorial Lecture on the following terms and conditions:

- 1. The Trust will assemble a collection associated with the life and works of Nanak Singh Novelist. The collection will include audio-visual material, photographs, manuscripts, dissertations, a full set of available books by Nanak Singh, rare editions of certain books, awards and personal items used by Nanak Singh during his lifetime and other relevant material. The Trust will provide this collection to the University at its own cost.
- 2. The University will provide a suitable location within its library to establish the Nanak Singh Centre. It will make suitable arrangements to protect, conserve and display the collection and make it accessible to faculty, students and members of the general public.
- The University would work with the Trust to set up a digital library dedicated to the works of Nanak Singh
- 4. The annual Award and Lecture programme will be organized concurrently by the University at its premises and in partnership with the Trust.
- An annual Award of Rs. 25,000 will be given for the best novel in Punjabi language published during the previous calendar year. The novel will be selected by an independent jury. The Vice Chancellor of the university or his/her nominee would be the ex-officio chairman of the jury. Other members would be nominated by the Trust in consultation with the University.

This Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) is being entered into on 30th day of December 2020 between Centre for Sustainable Habitat, Guru Nanak Dev University, located at Amritsar, Punjab (hereinafter referred to as 'CSH'), legally represented by its Vice Chancellor on the one part,

And

Cities Forum, located at 71-75 Shelton Street, London, UK(hereinafter referred to as 'CF'), legally represented by its Director on the other part.

BACKGROUND

CENTRE FOR SUSTAINABLE HABITAT is established at Guru Nanak Dev University (GNDU), Amritsar (Punjab, India) under Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA) – 02. It aims to propagate the agenda of sustainability in education, living and professional practice. It attempts to demonstrate coexistence of the natural and built environment in a way that reduces our planetary footprint, emissions, resource consumption and waste, and improves quality of life for all. This is done by integrating multi-faceted ecological, social, economic and cultural perspectives together and translating into applied sciences, technology and most importantly behaviour. The Centre specializes in research towards comprehensive understanding of environmental issues facing, but not limited to the country. University's expansive resources provide the opportunity for a practice-oriented and evidence-based research. This research not only augments the academic curricula and training but contributes to the larger scientific community, informs policy, generates platforms for dialogue with society, and shapes an engaging and enabling ethos that resonates in the University Campus and beyond.

CITIES FORUM is a global organization with a multidisciplinary international group of experts with an experienced in the breadth of topics related to sustainable urban development. CITIES FORUM aims at being catalyst, working with cities, companies and organisations to address and solve their urban and sustainable development challenges more efficiently.

CITIES FORUM works with cities, companies and organisations in achieving their sustainable development goals, facilitating the process of creating more liveable and future proof cities and regions based on a wiser use of technology and global resources, empowering collaboration among cities, companies and society. CITIES FORUM work areas are centered around the following themes

- Strive towards a carbon free future.
- Aim to increase efficiency in resource consumption.
- Build on data, connectivity and the internet of things.
- Processes that benefit the best solutions not the loudest or cheapest actors.
- Strive to provide future-proof solutions for sustainable cities.

POINT 1: SPECIFIC PURPOSE OF MoU

The Parties agree to cooperate in the following areas: -

1.1 Knowledge Partnership

CF will act as the knowledge partner of CSH to help mainstream sustainability in the built environment and attaining sustainable development goals. CF shall assist CSH for greening of the GNDU campus and beyond by research, training, demonstration, dissemination and promoting sustainability. CF will provide advisory and knowledge support by handholding with CSH to conduct research, training, and pilot studies in line with the identified six research tracks of CSH and helping build capacities if and when required. Considering the ongoing COVID-19 disruption, initially the discussions and meetings will be conducted remotely through online platforms.

1.2 Needs-based Research and Capacity Building

Based on mutual need, both Institutions shall explore additional ways of collaborating to help strengthen the research, training and capacities. Activities may include joint research, workshops, seminars, conferences, and training program among other potential areas of cooperation in the field of sustainable and liveable habitats. The details of such arrangements shall be negotiated at the appropriate time on a case-to-case basis and be governed by the relevant approval processes.

POINT 2: RESPONSIBILITIES

Both institutions acknowledge the mutual alignment of their institutional vision, mission and values. Both organizations commit themselves to jointly accomplish the goals of the Capacity Building Project.

- 2.1 Sharing of information: Both CSH and CF shall maintain their respective lawful status with the appropriate authorities for the duration of the MoU. Either institutions shall keep the other informed of any change whatsoever occurring in the engagement plan which may affect the timely delivery of services and accomplishment of Project outcomes.
- 2.2 Financial support: CF will not charge CSH for the technical assistance and knowledge support unless agreed otherwise. In case of any travel arising under any Project, related costs shall be borne by the respective institution making the travel. For any meeting(s)/seminar(s)/workshop(s)/training(s), primary host/organizer shall arrange for the logistics and bear the associated costs as discussed mutually on case-to-case basis.
- 2.3 Focal Person: Both institutions shall each assign a designated focal person(Coordinator, Centre for Sustainable Habitat from CSH and Leader (India Projects), CITIES FORUM from CF) to provide support to the Project, whose duties include supporting the visits of either institutions, or who will also arrange training and logistics for the smooth implementation of the Project.

POINT 3: LANGUAGE

All written correspondence and activities relating to the Project shall be transacted in the English Language.

POINT 4: ACCOUNTABILITY AND COMPLIANCE

Any identified Project under this MOU shall be implemented in line with relevant policies and law of the Government of India, and shall comply with the institutional guidelines of both Institutions. This MoU is not binding or legal enforceable, does not impose enforceability of obligation upon the institutions and does not grant any rights.

POINT 5: CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION AND COPYRIGHT

- 5.1 Neither Institution shall disclose confidential information of the other Party to any person or third-Party or use of such confidential information for its own purpose at any time without the written consent of the other Party.
- 5.2 Any idea, innovation, training materials, management processes or documentation arising out of this collaboration shall be the intellectual property of the Institution that has developed the material. Both Institutions may however use such intellectual materials, but with appropriate acknowledgement to the contributions made by either Party.

POINT 6: FORCE MAJEURE

No Institution covered under this MoU shall be liable for any failure to perform its obligation where such failure is a result of Acts of God, which are here defined as force majeure.

POINT 7: DURATION AND TERMINATION

This MoU shall come into effect on the date of signature by both Institutions and shall remain in force for an initial period of two(2) years, unless otherwise terminated by mutual consent, and with 30 days prior written notice to the other Institution.

POINT 8: DISPUTE RESOLUTION

Both Institutions agreed that if there is any dispute of difference between both arising out of the MoU or in the interpretation of any of the provisions thereof, they shall endeavour to meet in an effort to resolve such dispute by discussion, within 30 days of such dispute arising, failing such resolution then the Parties in dispute shall refer at their costs the dispute to a mutually to the senior executive/faculty agreed Institutions.

- f. GNDU owns and will continue research in the area of enzymes from the microbial strains being transferred to GENCREST, Mumbai.

- o. Procured strains or technology shall not be transferred in its present form for transfer to any third party by Gencrest in future for commercial exploration anytime till this Agreement is in force.

Dispute Resolution & Jurisdiction, If any dispute arises between the Parties hereto during the subsistence of this Agreement or thereafter, in connection with the validity, interpretation, implementation or alleged material breach of any provision of this Agreement, the Parties hereto shall endeavor to settle the dispute amicably failing which the said dispute shall be referred to arbitration to be conducted by a sole arbitrator to be mutually appointed by the Parties. The arbitration proceedings shall be governed by the provisions of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 including its statutory modifications and reenactments thereof. The arbitration shall be held in Amritsar, Punjab, India and English language shall be used in arbitral proceedings. The Arbitrator's award shall be substantiated in writing. The award shall be binding on the Parties.
