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PREFACE

The past tenure was one of unexpected change in every sector across the globe & faced many challenges brought on by the COVID-19 pandemic. No doubt the whole humanity suffered a lot but at the same time some positivity also happened with negativity all round. Though Guru Nanak Dev University also suffered alongwith other institutions of the world and Covid-19 has been a testing time for educational institutions and Guru Nanak Dev University by accepting the challenge emerged as stronger and trendsetter during its innovative initiatives. Inspite of so many odd challenges, during this year Guru Nanak Dev University attained many achievements. The University's growth has been astonishing in terms of its research & academic infrastructure, departments, new courses, syllabi & programmes and among recognized institutions.

During this tenure, under the able guidance of Vice Chancellor, Prof. Dr. Jaspal Singh Sandhu the university not only fought the COVID-19 pandemic challenges, but also organized a large number of offline and online international and national conferences, seminars, symposiums and other academic functions successfully to enrich the academic world. Due to Covid-19 the teachers of the university engaged the students through online/offline classes so that their studies might not suffer. The examinations for the final year students of all the subjects were conducted online as well as offline well in time which submitted timely declaration of the results. The admission process too was conducted online, with an increased number of student intakes for most of the courses as compared to previous year.

This year, Guru Nanak Dev University celebrated its 51st Foundation Day on November 24, 2020, but due to COVID-19 pandemic and as per the instructions of the Government, this mega event was celebrated online. Mr. Navdeep Singh Suri, IFS (Retd.), Former Ambassador to Egypt and UAE, apart from being a GNDU alumnus, and Dr. Jogishwar Singh, IAS (Retd.), ex-Managing Director at Edmond de Rothschild, Geneva, Switzerland delivered their academic lectures. Online International lecture Series dedicated to the 400th Parkash Purb of Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji was also started in this tenure.

Then Punjab Chief Minister Captain Amarinder Singh digitally launched online programmes/ courses started for the Punjabi diaspora settled across the globe. The University initiated admissions for UGC entitled/approved Online Courses for Punjabi Diaspora under newly established Directorate of Online Studies. These courses are started by keeping in view the demand of Punjabi Diaspora settled outside Punjab especially in foreign countries. UGC had granted permission to start courses to 37 Universities out of the 981 Universities of the country and the Guru Nanak Dev University is the only State Public University in the Punjab to have been given this honour by UGC.

Guru Nanak Dev University signed various MoUs with prestigious institutions during this tenure. The University signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the National



Highway Authority of India (NHAI), New Delhi for conducting innovative research on different aspects of highway design, safety and beautification. The University has instituted three prestigious awards to honor outstanding researchers in the field of Life Sciences. The Department of Botanical and Environmental Sciences has signed an MoU for three prestigious academic awards for scientists and researchers working in the fields of plant and environmental sciences. The university signed another historic MoU with the Sports Authority of India, Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports, Govt. of India, and New Delhi to set up residential Sports Academy under Khelo India Scheme in Guru Nanak Dev University in two sports disciplines: Fencing (Men & Women) and Archery (Men & Women). The Centre for Agriculture Research and Innovation and the Department of Agriculture of the University jointly signed an MoU with the College of Agriculture and Natural Resources, National Chung Hsing University (NCHU), Taiwan. NCHU. The University and the Nanak Singh Memorial Trust signed a Memorandum of Understanding to establish a Nanak Singh Centre within the premises of the Bhai Gurdas Library of the University and to institute the annual Nanak Singh Novelist Award and Nanak Singh Memorial Lecture. The Guru Nanak Dev University and the Consortium for Educational Communication (CEC), inter-university centre of the UGC signed a MoU for undertaking various activities aimed at addressing the needs of higher education and appropriate use of technology to increase the access of educational content for both undergraduate and postgraduate education. The University has signed a MoU with the Punjab Police to set up an institutional mechanism for interaction between the two organisations for a period of 5 years. University also signed MoU with Sri Guru Ram Das University of Health Sciences (SGRDUHS). Recognising the mutual benefits to be gained through a cooperative programme promoting scholarly activities and international understanding, the University inked MoUs with two different organisations to enhance research and promote entrepreneurial culture. The first MoU was signed with Aarhus University in Denmark and CTIF Global Capsule (CGC), developing research activities at the international level, for collaboration in academics, research and faculty development. The second MoU was inked with signed a MoU with 'Indigram Labs Foundation' to operationalize Technology- based Entrepreneurship Development Programme (TEDP) to facilitate linkage opportunities for innovations and start-ups. Our University is the first Indian university to join the Cities Forum London, the leading collaborative network of world cities that share a belief in the importance of culture for creating thriving metropolitan environments. In this regard, Centre for Sustainable Habitat, GNDU (CSH) signed a MoU with Cities Forum; London to conduct need based collaborative research and training in different fields of sustainable habitat. The Centre for Sustainable Habitat of the University signed a MoU with Centre of Science and Environment, New Delhi (CSE) to share knowledge, and conduct need based collaborative research and capacity building to address various issues and challenges occurring in the built environment of cities and villages. To promote science and scientific temperament among students of the Punjab region, SciRox-Science Club of the University



signed a Memorandum of Understanding with Society for Promotion of Science and Technology in India (SPSTI).

Among high ranking & ratings, this year Guru Nanak Dev University improved its position in the National Institute Ranking Frame (NIRF) - 2020 Rankings which were released by the Hon'ble Minister of Human Resource Development Shri Ramesh Pokhriyal 'Nishank'. As per the new ranking, Guru Nanak Dev University was placed 51st among all the central, public and private universities in India. This University now ranks 18th among the State funded universities of India. Participating in the QS IGAUGE Rating System, it has been rated in Diamond category in the field of 'research, faculty quality and infrastructure'. The University's high h-Index of 113 is the result of high quality research publications by the highly qualified faculty using state-of-the-art facilities. Regular updations of course curricula to lead high quality education and high employability of its programmes have earned the university Gold rating in 'Employability' criteria of agency. GNDU is also committed to its social responsibilities and hence keeps on organising various training events and awareness campaigns regularly which helped it to bag Gold rating. Overall the university is positioned in the Gold category for all the parameters adopted by the QS IGAUGE Rating System. Guru Nanak Dev University has been placed amongst top 9% universities of the world & among the top 10 state public universities of India in the Centre for World University Ranking (CWUR) - a leading evaluation agency in the world of higher education, which has been engaged in grading the top ranking universities world-wide on the basis of stringent objective parameters since 2012. The ranking list contains a total number of twenty thousand universities from all over the world, thereby, making CWUR list the largest academic ranking of the global universities.In "The Week-Hansa Research Survey-2020", the University happens to be the only university of Punjab to have bagged a position in the Top-10 Public State Multidisciplinary universities with the ranking position of 7. As far as North India is concerned the total universities which were taken into consideration i.e. Central, State and Private Universities, Guru Nanak Dev University stands at 8th position. Among the State Public universities in North India, it stands at the top position immediately after Panjab University, Chandigarh which is an inter-state corporate and funded by Government of India. The University adjudged as the only State Government University in North India to bag top position amongst higher education institutes for "India Today Ranking 2020". No higher education institute of Jammu, Kashmir, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Rajasthan or Chandigarh could attain any position even among the first 35 positions in the State Public Universities imparting education in arts, science and technology disciplines. Overall, GNDU is ranked 20th among all central, public and private Universities in the country. However, it has retained its position at 11thplace among the State Universities of India in 2020. High quality research has improved the H-index of the university from 64 to 115 with top 10 percent highly cited papers in Scopus.



The University has also decided to start conferring the degrees of Doctor of Science (D.Sc.), Doctor of Literature (D.Litt.) and Doctors of Laws (LL.D.). It is worth mentioning here that D.Sc., D.Litt. and L.L.D. are the highest research degrees a university can award. There were many other remarkable achievements of the University during this year. Five scientists of Guru Nanak Dev University have been listed in World ranking of top 2% scientists in an independent study conducted by the scholars of Stanford University. In this study the scientists of Stanford University created a database of more than 100,000 top scientists of the world and made rankings on the basis of standardized citation indicators such as citations, H-index, co-authorship and a composite indicator. Two Shooters i.e. Divyanshu Singh Panwar & Ashwrya Partap Singh of Guru Nanak Dev University bagged medals in the ISSF World Cup 2021 at Karni Singh Shooting Range, New Delhi during this time period.

The sacred forest established this year in the university was dedicated to the 550th Prakash Purab of Sri Guru Nanak Dev ji. 28 percent shady trees, 24 percent fruit trees, 24 percent flower trees and 24 percent medicinal plants are being sown in an area of two acres for this sacred forest. The University compiled a handbook on "Plant Diversity of GNDU Botanical Garden". A campaign to plant 2500 different varieties of saplings was also launched at the University Campus. With grants received this year from MHRD, activities relating to establishing the Centre for Interfaith Studies at University campus also got a boost.

In this tenure, about 740 students of the University and its campuses have been placed in the various multinational companies on high salary packages. The University is one of the best choices for employer organisations because of the high academic standards and various academic reforms initiatives taken by the university. A large number of companies have confirmed their participation in the near future to recruit the students of the university through placements drives.

Keeping in view the health of the Faculty, Non-teaching staff and Students of the university in the current COVID-19 pandemic, the University has taken a novel initiative of setting up its own immunization centre with the vaccines very graciously provided by the office of Civil Surgeon, Amritsar.

Guru Nanak Dev University, with its commitment to excellence, has its roadmap ready for continuing as one of the best universities in the country. All these achievements have been possible with the innovative guidance of Vice Chancellor Prof. Jaspal Singh Sandhu, faculty members, students, researchers and administrative staff of our university.



ABOUT SRI AMRITSAR

Sri Amritsar was founded by Sri Guru Ramdass ji, the fourth Guru of the Sikhs in about 1574 A.D. Before the city was founded, the area was covered with thick forests and had several lakes. To start the city the Guru invited 52 traders from different sectors belongings to nearby places like Patti and Kasur to settle here. These families started the first 32



shops in the city which still stand in the street called Batisi Hatta (32 shops). The Guru himself shifted to live among them in the city which came to be called Ramdaspur and has been eulogised in the Guru Granth Sahib.

Sri Amritsar, known for rich cultural heritage of four centuries, is living symbol of historical and religious traditions of Sikhs tangibly expressed through the divinely blessed shrines. Historically speaking, the fourth Guru, Guru Ram Das Ji built the *Sarovar* and laid the foundation of Amritsar, which became a sacred place for the pilgrimage of the community. The fifth Guru, Guru Arjan Dev Ji built Sri Harimandir Sahib in the centre of the *Sarovar*. Maharaja Ranjit Singh captured the city in 1805 and his first important act was to gild the whole structure of Sri Harimandir Sahib with gold. The city has been the center of activities for various historical events and freedom struggle in the last four centuries.

This city in northwestern India and the administrative headquarters of Amritsar district in the state of Punjab. The city lies about 25 km east of the border with Pakistan and is a major commercial, cultural, and transportation centre. It is also the centre of Sikhism and the site of the Sikh's principal place of worship.

The early name of the city was Chak Guru. Before its establishment, the area under the city was a part of the vast area covered under Indus valley Civilization during the early period of history. A city of historic walls and impressive gateways, Amritsar gained importance under the reign of Maharaja Ranjit Singh, one of the most resplendent figures in Sikh history. The city lies on the Grand Trunk road, Asia's one of the oldest and longest major roads connecting Eastern & Western parts of Indian sub-continent, built by King Sher Shah Suri in year 1539.

The city of Amritsar a dazzling showcase of composite culture and secular heritage .It has a proud past a glorious present and a promising future .This most important city of Majha has rightly been called the mukut-mani (Jewel of the crown) of the Punjab. Amritsar is like a diamond with many facets. The essential spirit of the city is found not only in its gurudwaras & temples, mosques & churches, takias & khankahs but also in its theatres & galleries, parks & gardens, archives & libraries, art & architecture, museums & memorials, havelis & forts,



fairs & festivals, vibrant folk dances & scintillating taans, narrow lanes & winding alleys, parlours& boutiques, clubs & pubs, traditional bustling markets & lip-smacking cuisine eatable like traditional Papad -Wadian, Soya-wadian and Aampapar. In addition, the city is famous for its woolens, carpets and blankets, kites, juttis, cut-glass work, bangles and embroidered stuff.

In Amritsar, Sri Harimandir Sahib is not only a central religious place of the Sikhs, but also a symbol of human brotherhood and equality. Everybody, irrespective of cast, creed or race can seek spiritual solace and religious fulfilment without any hindrance. It also represents the distinct identity, glory and heritage of the Sikhs. To pen-down the philosophy, ideology, the inner and outer beauty, as well as the historical legacy of Sri Harimandir Sahib is a momentous task. It is a matter of experience rather than a description. In Sri Harimandir Sahib Parikarma, Akal Takht literally means Eternal Throne. The Akal Takht is situated on the other end of the causeway connected to Sri Harmandir Sahib. It's foundation was laid by Guru Hargobind Sahib. The building of the Akal Takht opposite the Sri Harmandir Sahib has a special meaning. While the Sri Harimandir stands for spiritual guidance the Akal Takht symbolizes the dispensing of justice and temporal activity. The Akal Takht is the oldest of the Five Takhts. Amritsar is a center of the raag-based rendering of Shabad (Bani of Sri Guru Granth Sahib). The musical instruments are available around Town Hall and Jallianwala Bagh. The city boasts of maximum production of Musical instruments.

After partition, Amritsar has become the gateway of India by land route from Central Asia, Afghanistan, Pakistan and other countries on the western side. With its glorious heritage, Amritsar is proudly holding its status of an internationally known city not only historically but also in context of social welfare, philanthropic activity and higher learning. Guru Nanak Dev University located here carries a pleasant mélange of all that is worth.

Amritsar's international airport, Sri Guru Ramdass Ji International Airport, has more than 400 domestic and international flights during the week with daily connections to Chandigarh, Goa, Delhi, Mumbai, Pune, Bangalore, Srinagar and Jammu etc. Amritsar is connected by rail to almost every major city in India. Amritsar railway station is the main terminus. The Samjhauta Express and Bus runs from Delhi through Amritsar to Lahore in Pakistan. Sri Darbar Sahib - Sri Harmandir Sahib, Ram Tirath, Jallianwala Bag, Durgiana Temple, Wagha Border, Partition Museum, War Museum, Gobindgarh Fort, summer place of Maharaja Ranjit Singh, Pul Mouran, Khalsa College, Heritage Street, *ChaaliKhooh*, Heritage Village, Preet Nagar, and other religious places make Amritsar a popular tourist destination in world.

ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY

With the glorious history of past fifty one years, Guru Nanak Dev University was established at Amritsar on November 24, 1969 to mark the Birth Quincentenary of Sri Guru Nanak Dev Ji, the apostle of universal brotherhood, truthfulness, non-violence, compassion, tolerance, harmony, humanity, strict observance of moral & ethical values in daily life,



who is also revered as the founder of Sikhism. It won't be an exaggeration to state that His teachings and preaching & His own personal life are perfect examples to be emulated by the entire mankind even after about four and half a centuries and will remain so eternally.

Ever since its foundation the endeavour of the university has always been to meet the objectives enshrined in the Guru Nanak Dev University Act 1969, which emphasized that the new University would make provision for imparting education and promoting research in the humanities, learned professions, sciences, especially of applied nature and technology. Studies and research on the life and teachings of Guru Nanak Dev ji, in addition to working towards the promotion of Punjabi language and spreading education among educationally backward classes and communities are the other commitments.

In consonance with these expectations, the university in its eventful history of 51 years has taken long strides in spreading the message of Guru Nanak Dev ji and promoting education in such fields as Science, Arts, Management, Information Technology, Industrial Technology, Environment, Planning, Architecture, Hospitality, Agriculture, Mass Media. To fulfill its commitment, the tuition fee charged from the students of the departments of Guru Nanak Studies and the School of Punjabi Studies has been waived.

Guru Nanak Dev University is a pioneer State University with A++ status given to it by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC). It has been conferred with 'University with Potential for Excellence' and 'Category-I' status by the UGC, New Delhi.

The University achieved so many high level rankings at national and international levels and recently, the University has emerged as the only multi-specialty university in Punjab and its neighboring states that has obtained position in the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) 2021. It has up-scaled its ranking to 13th position in 2021 compared to 14th position in 2020 among the multi-specialty state universities of India. No other multi-Specialty State University of northern region, except University of Kashmir, has figured in first 55 positions in the country. Overall, it has stood at 53rd position among all the universities of the country. Among all the higher education institutions of India, the university has improved its overall ranking from 88 in 2020 to 85 in 2021. Contesting for the first time in the engineering



discipline, it is ranked at 8th position among the multi-specialty universities of the country. State-of-the-art infrastructure, dedicated teaching-learning practices, curriculum enrichment, high employability, quality publications in highly cited national and international research journals are the key concerns to popularise GNDU's engineering education not only in India but across the world. High quality research in engineering and other disciplines has improved the H-index of the university from 64 to 115 with top 10 percent highly cited papers in Scopus. The University selected as one of the most innovative universities among the World's Universities with Real Impact (WURI) for 2021 Rankings. Contesting for innovative programmes in the 'social responsibility, ethics, and integrity' category', it is awarded the 41st rank in Ethical Values. Overall, the university is placed at 101-200 among the World's Universities with Real Impact.

With the motto of the university as engraved on its emblem Guru's wisdom illumines all, the university has been leaving no stone unturned to meet the aspirations and expectations of the society. Spread over area of 500 acres towards the west of the city, Guru Nanak Dev University presents a picture of modern architecture. Traditional red brick geometrical blocks represent its regard for time-honoured values and commitment to scientific advancement. The University today boasts of 44 teaching departments at the Campus and 153 affiliated colleges, 17 Constituent & University Colleges and 49 Associate Institutes, many of which are located in the rural areas. The university has always strived hard to make the benefits of Higher Education accessible to the rural masses.

In the recent time, the University has established Department of Agriculture in collaboration with Cornell University, USA; Department of Mass Communication & Journalism; Department of Tourism & Hospitality and Department of Physiotherapy. The University has also started various new courses like Bachelor degree in Mass Communication, B.Sc. Agriculture (Hons.), B.Com. (Hons.), M.Sc.(Sports Nutrition), M.Sc. (Exercise and Sports Physiology), M.A. (Sports Psychology), M.Tech.(Construction Technlogy and Management) M.Sc.(Applied Chemistry Pharmaceuticals.) etc. Recently, Rehabilitation Council of India, Ministry of Education, and New Delhi have approved B.Ed. Special Education (Multiple Disabilities) to Department of Education, Guru Nanak Dev University from the session 2021-22.

In consonance with this policy, a few colleges were set up in rural areas like Chungh, Mithra, Verka, NarotJaimal Singh, Patti under the Punjab Govt. /UGC scheme. New professional courses were introduced in the constituent colleges of the University. The newly constructed Sri Guru Granth Sahib Bhawan reflects the Sikh architecture. In this Centre, research work related to the studies of Sri Guru Granth Sahib is systematically undertaken. The construction of buildings of Sports Hostel and University Business School and extension of Architecture Department and health centre is already completed. The Building of University Institute of Technology will also start functioning from this session.

More than twenty thousand students, an overwhelming majority of them being women, are enrolled in various Departments at University Campus and Constituent Colleges. On-line admission, On-line counseling, On-line reevaluation, introduction of Credit Based Continuous



Evaluation Grading System etc are a few hallmarks of the university. All the results have been computerized and OMR (Optical Magnetic Recognition) system is being used to bring in more efficiency and transparency. This is the first University in the region to have computerized its examination and registration system. The students now have an all time access to their results through SMS service.

Academically also, the university has carved a niche for itself in the field of Higher Education in the country. Our University is recognized as one of the leading institutions in North India in the domain of Science and Technology. Many coveted projects from the apex bodies like the DST, CSIR, BARC and other organizations worth crores of rupees have been awarded to our faculty members. One of the four Nodal Calibration Centres established by Bhabha Atomic Research Centre is set up at our campus. The Centre of Emerging Life Sciences equipped with the state-of-the-art scientific instruments worth crores of rupees, well-maintained Botanical Garden, Deptt of Sports Medicine & Physiotherapy are a few of the jewels in the crown of the university. To more strengthen the university infrastructure and to prepare students for employments, computer lab with the help of TCS is also established. Further, the UGC has granted the University the Centre with Potential for Excellence in Life Sciences and Centre for Advanced Study in Chemistry.

In the field of culture and sports also, the achievements of the university are noteworthy. The university has been national Champion for 10 times & the winner of the North-Zone-Inter-Varsity Cultural Championship for 13 times. The winning of the coveted Maulana Abul Kalam Azad Trophy, the highest sports award for a university in the country, for a record number of 23 times, speaks volumes about its supremacy in the field of sports. An Astro Turf for hockey, a swimming pool of international standards, a velodrome, a Gymnasium hall, shooting range & many other state-of-the art sports facilities are the prized possessions of the university. The Lifelong Learning Department of the university is successfully catering to the female folk of the region to make them self-dependent by offering various skill development programmes. During Covid-19, the department makes masks & chemistry department made sanitizer. University is committed to sustainable development as envisaged by Vice Chancellor with 100% reuse of treated wastewater, extensive tree plantation, electric buses for students and staff, rooftop solar harvesting are a few of initiatives. University is planning to install digital water monitoring at the Sewage Treatment Plant so as to optimize the water reuse.

The Track record of employment of our students by big business Houses and Multi-National Companies has been very satisfactory. Our students of engineering, management and commerce field are employed by companies in India and abroad. They are all contributing to the creditworthiness of the University by their hard work and diligence. In the last year alone, almost all our Engineering and Management students were recruited by various companies through campus placements. It goes without saying that all these achievements would not have been achieved, but for the heart and soul put in by the students, faculty members, and administration of the university. Undoubtedly, the university remains committed to achieve the lofty goals, for which it was founded after the name of Sri Guru Nanak Dev Ji.

Vice Chancellor Prof. Jaspal Singh Sandhu presided over the online session while Prof. Karanjeet Singh Kahlon, Registrar welcomed the guest speakers and audience. Prof. Sarabjot Singh Behl, Dean Academic Affairs presented a vote of thanks.

Mr. Navdeep Singh Suri said that Sri Guru Nanak Dev ji always advocated tolerance and gave the message to keep balance between freedom of religion and freedom of expression as leaders. We need to educate people and make them follow. He said that during the last few years, as per my experience, UAE is becoming a more tolerant country and giving liberties to so many things. While quoting the example of Amritsar City, he said that this city witnessed five tragedies during the last century and still tolerates & welcomes everyone. He said that during Jallianwal Bagh *Saka*, his grandfather S. Nanak Singh, an eminent novelist wrote in his poetry about the collective celebration of Janmashtami by Sikh, Hindu and Muslims together the same is even true today. He said that we need to introspect ourself instead of finding faults in others as Guru Nanak Dev ji said.

While blaming social media as cause for intolerance, he said that everybody should understand their responsibility to spread any message on social media keeping in view the ethics of humanity. He said that social media should be used for spreading positivity among all for the benefit of mankind. It is specially expected from students of this University to follow social media ethics which is the need of the hour.

While speaking on 'Teachings of Sri Guru Nanak Dev ji and its Relevance', Mr. Jogisher Singh said that the teachings of Guru Nanak Dev ji are Universal as people of all religions respect and follow Guru ji universally. Guru ji never criticised any religion but he was against hypocrisy and false show off.



He said that as per teachings of Guru Nanak Dev ji, politics should be based on ethics but the same is far away. He said that to follow the teachings of Guru Nanak Dev ji to match the conduct of saying and doing is what is desired even more today. He said that whatever is happening these days is giving the wrong impression of our country and the secular word is trashing its image.

He said that the young generation is getting away from religion due to substandard thought of preachers and the need of the hour is to address the questions raised by young generations and spread the real teachings of Guru Nanak Dev ji by shedding ego and hypocrisy more young generation will be associated. While touching our environment he expressed his concern over degradation of our ecology, he said that the concept of 'Balhari Kudrat Waseya' and 'Pawan Guru Pani Pita Mata Dharat Mahat' is needed to be analysed. He said that the balance between nature could only be maintained by following the teachings of Guru Nanak Dev ji. He said that today we are facing problems relating to inequality of gender and female foeticide. The solution of this problem is also lying in the teachings of Guru ji.

OFFICE OF CONTROLLER OF EXAMINATIONS

The Examination system operates in seven districts of Punjab state which include Amritsar, TaranTaran, Jalandhar, Kapurthala, Gurdaspur, and Pathankot &S.B.S NAGAR. It covers GNDU Campus, 2 Regional Campuses, 16 Constituent/UniversityColleges, 153 Affiliated Colleges and 53 Associate Colleges under Capacity Enhancement Programme. It is dealing with Choice Based Credit System, Semester System and Annual System of the University.

Different wings under the office of the Controller of Examination are actively involved in registration of the students admitted in current academic session, conduct of fair and timely examinations (as per the academic calendar of the University), issue of roll numbers and examination centers (online) for private students, appoint examiners for setting of question papers and evaluation for theory courses, timely declaration of results, issue of marks statements, approval for award of degree to the qualified candidates during convocation every year. In addition, formulation and adherence to guidelines for examination system and amendments from time to time are taken care of.

Besides routine Examination Work, Office of Controller of Examinations is also actively involved in printing of question papers for Major Exams for various classes of the University Departments, Regional Campuses and Constituent Colleges. It also provides assistance to conduct various National/State level Entrance tests by the University.

The Computer Centre is managing the Online web portal "punjab college admissions.org" for regular admissions in colleges and for private students along with other applications for "online Absentee"" and "Online practical award entry". The computer centremanages Student database, design and development of programs for exams related activities, return system for colleges, student photo database management, data/result processing and declaration, and uploading of result, D.M.C. and gazettes on university website, printing of DMC/DEGREES and post result notification declaration & printing of different kinds of examinations i.e., C.B.E.S., Semester & Annual. "Punjab college admissions.org" for regular admissions in colleges and for private students along with other applications for "online Absentee" and "Online practical award entry". The computer centremanages Student database, design and development of programs for exams related activities, return system for colleges, student photo database management, data/result processing and declaration, and uploading of result, D.M.C. and gazettes on university website, printing of DMC/DEGREES and post result



notification declaration & printing of different kinds of examinations i.e., C.B.E.S., Semester & Annual.

It was also involved in the following activities:

- Assisted conduct branch with online application for practical module and assigning practical duties to teachers.
- Assisted Secrecy branch with online application for assigning teacher's duties &evaluation processing module.
- Assisted various branches in procuring hardware and software technology.
- > Governance initiatives linked with examination related modules.
- ➤ Computer Awareness training to newly appointed staff in examination branches.

Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for Examination system and Evaluation:

- ➤ Digi locker-NAD: University is now live onDigilocker platform. Required Degree data along with photographs of students is being uploaded on the portal. This will help the students, verifiers to view and verify data online.
- ➤ "Online Web Portal (punjabcollegeadmissions.org)" for regular admissions in colleges. The new system is fully web-enabled having Service Oriented Architecture. It is providing interactive validation of data entry by users and user oriented self-service capabilities as per rules and regulations related to admissions. Automatic Assignment of registration number, roll numbers and automation of different pre-examination processes.
- ➤ Online web application for regular admissions in university and regional campuses under CBES system. It will Facilitates in making post admission related
 - Process simple, as all the required information about the students is available online, whenever and wherever required.
- ➤ Migration Certificate, Duplicate DMC / Degree, Particular Correction Processis computerized. It helped students to avoid long queues and delays in getting migration certificate.
- ➤ Online Transcript System (e-Transcript). Students will access the online portal after verification through OTP on mobile.
- ➤ The student will proceed to fill the form and to upload the scanned copies of the documents.
 - The student can track status of his/her application online.
 - The fee payment can be done online through different payments modes available.
 - Online application to keep track of evaluation in different centers. Various kind of online reports are generated and payments are also processed through this module.



- The data about college's faculty and other achievements is available to university on single portal. It will help in better communication with teachers regarding assigning duties for exams and other academic purposes
- ➤ Video surveillance across the examination centers in different colleges to keep check on copying in examination.
- ➤ Video Conferencing facility was also set up in all Evaluations Centres for monitoring and surveillance in addition to following:
 - Distribution of answer sheets of various subjects to different places.
 - SMS facility launched to facilitate teachers from different colleges to get information regarding duty assigned and location of evaluation centres on their mobile.
 - Problem solving process has been improved. Guidelines are issued regularly by Controller Office and routine meetings are held through video conferencing between Professor Incharge (Examinations) and principals, co-coordinators of centers and superintendents of various evaluation centres to bring more efficiency, discipline and timely evaluations of answer books.
 - Various subjects are re-allocated during evaluation at various evaluation centres depending upon the availability of examiners to speed up the evaluation work.
 - Evaluation work is continuously monitored to overcome any delay in result declaration.
 - Timely opening and closing of Evaluation Centres established in various cities.
- To achieve E-governance, more applications and informational links have been added to the website and portal. To tackle the heavy usage Band width, web space has been increased & server resources have been upgraded.
- > Synchronization with the OMR system and unique codification of different courses and subject files.
- Fast processing and timely declaration of results has been achieved and number of withheld results has been minimized.
- ➤ Different online applications running successfully for absentee award entry, practical award entry and re-evaluation are upgraded for new features and facilities to speed up the result processing and declaration process.
- ➤ E-governance in Examination system has been achieved towards communications with various campus departments, RCs, UCs, affiliated colleges & associate institutes.



MAJOR REFORMS INITIATED UNDER CBES SYSTEM

- ➤ Only one mid-term examination of 20% weightage may be held, while the major end semester examination may be given 80% weightage.
- ➤ There will be no practical examination during mid-term. For final practical examinations, the external examiners from nearby places may be appointed. The evaluation of the examination shall be done both by external and internal examiners jointly.
- ➤ For at least 50 % papers of credit-based courses offered in different programs across the disciplines, the question papers will be set by external examiners appointed by the competent authority.
- ➤ In all the courses, the answer- sheets will be assessed by internal examiners through table marking.
- ➤ The answer-sheets may not be shown to the students after examinations. The students may be asked to go for re-evaluation of their answer-sheets, if they have any doubt.
- ➤ The project reports of master degree course will be evaluated by internal examiners, where the evaluation as only "satisfactory/unsatisfactory "is required. However, the master degree thesis with marks will be evaluated by external examiners.
- The percentage of marks will be calculated by multiplying CGPA with 10.

In each master's programme, the pursuing of independent research in final year and submission of dissertation is a distinguished feature. The dissertation is defended by the candidate before a committee of experts. Also each student of master's programme delivers a seminar on contemporary theme under the guidance of a teacher. The research activities of the Department focus on synthetic organic chemistry, supra molecular chemistry, structural inorganic chemistry, drug design, material science, electrochemistry, chemistry of surfactant, chemistry of oils and fats, theoretical chemistry, thermodynamics and analytical chemistry. ELECTRONICS TECHNOLOGY

About the Department

The Department of Electronics Technology was started in July 1983 with a vision to impart quality knowledge in the field of core Electronics as well as different facets of communication such as Microwave, Optical, Wireless, Data Communication, Digital Signal Processing and Image Processing so as to nurture the excellence in the students and enhance their capability



to meet the ever growing challenges in the field of electronics and communication engineering. The department has established itself as nodal centre for contemporary research in the area of Optical Communication, Microwave Materials, Wireless and Data Communication, Nanomaterial applications in Electronics, VLSI and Molecular Electronics etc. The department boasts of well-developed research facility for research in the field of optical communication. The department is contributing towards research in the field of fiber non-linearity control methods, gain flatness of optical fiber amplifiers, development of novel methods for optical switching and optical coupling. The current research is towards implementation of underwater optical communication and in visible light spectrum for applications such as secured military communication and radiation free communication in hospitals. Microwave ferrites and dielectric ceramics find applications in practical systems like radars, microwave absorbers, wireless communication systems, mobile base stations, satellite uplinks & broadcasting systems. Radar absorbing paints made from ferrites can be used to coat military aircraft for stealth operation. The department has state of the art facility to fabricate and characterize these materials especially at microwave frequencies in GHz range for such applications. The Carbon based molecular electronic components are being considered as alternative to conventional Silicon based electronic components. Atomistic modelling has been at the forefront of computational investigation of nanomaterials and has revealed a wealth of information on structure and properties of individual structural elements such as Nanowires, Nano films, Nano ribbons using Graphene, Fullerene, Carbon Nano Tube, Organic and Inorganic molecules as well as the characteristics of the interfacial regions and modification of the material properties at the nanoscale. The department feels proud to possess a dynamic and energetic faculty having a recognized research experience in their niche areas.

Subsequently in 1990, these five major disciplines were separated as independent departments. This Department takes up



fundamental and applied aspects of Molecular Biology and Biochemistry in its teaching and research programs. It admits students to the variousprograms leading to the awards of B.Sc., M.Sc. and Ph.D. degrees. The current number of seats are 40 in B.Sc., 50 in M.Sc. and the number of students admitted in Ph.D. varies from year to year. Admissions are made on the basis of entrance test. The students are continuously evaluated based on their performances under credit based evaluation and grading system.

The thrust areas of the Department are Protein Biochemistry, Structural Biology, Malarial Research, Microbial Genetics, Reproductive Biology and Molecular Biology of infectious diseases. The faculty in the department is well trained with experience in foreign laboratories and the department has a good infrastructure.

SOCIOLOGY

About the Department

The Department of Sociology was established in 1976 with a small faculty of one Reader and a Lecturer. The shortage of faculty was compensated by the visits of the well-known and senior faculty members from other universities. This helped the Department to grow on a solid footing. The Department tried to conserve its research and intellectual base and took upon itself the responsibility of publishing its own journal,



namely *Guru Nanak Journal of Sociology* in 1980. The journal has helped the Department to establish its own academic network in the country. The second stage of the development of the Department was between 1986 and 1995. The faculty strength reached seven and diverse areas such as; Population Studies, Urban Studies, Sociology of Entrepreneurship and Sociology of Movements were the new areas of thrust. The Department has the distinction of organizing 5th and 15th Conferences of the North West Indian Sociological Association, 27th Conference of the Indian Sociological Association and one International Conference on Habitat Agenda. Faculty members of the Department have published 52 books and 390 research papers. The UGC identified the Department for a grant in the area of Sociology of Environment in 1995. The UGC also recognized it under the Special Assistance Programme (SAP) and the department has entered DRS level III and got a grant of Rs. 82 lakhs for five years (2014-19). During the past few years a shift in the thrust areas of the Department has taken place.

DEPARTMENT OF ENGINEERING AND TECHNOLOGY

The Department of Engineering and Technology was established in year 2002 with full-time 4-year B.Tech. (Electronics and Communication Engineering), B.Tech. (Computer Science and Engineering) and MCA (FYIC) degree programmes. In 2013, M. Tech., (Computer Science and Engineering) and M.Tech. (Electronics and Communication Engineering) courses were also started in the department. Further in 2021, two new programmes i.e. 3-year BCA and 4-year B.Tech. (Electronics and Computer Engineering) have been introduced. The



department is catering to the needs of the students hailing from various parts of the country especially the backward and border areas of Punjab.

The department imparts high quality education in Engineering and Technology to produce competent technical manpower to meet the ever growing demand of the global industrial sector and nurtures young minds to grow and excel in the technical world. Students are motivated to participate in the various activities like mock tests, group discussions, and seminars, workshops to improve their soft skills and enrich their personality. The syllabi of the various courses are regularly updated to keep pace with the latest development in the industry. The performance of the students is continuously evaluated according to Credit-Based Evaluation and Grading System.

It has highly qualified faculty members to educate the students theoretically and practically as per the industrial requirement. The faculty regularly attends various International/National Conferences/Symposia and Workshops to keep themselves updated with the emerging technological trends. The faculty of the Department undertakes an active interest in various research areas like Software Engineering, Computer Networks, Optimization Methods and Parallel Computing, Image Processing, Nano-Technology, Optical Communication and Networks etc.. Each member of the department bears a continuous responsibility to articulate, reinforce and reflect those values that support our highest aspiration

Infrastructure

The department has well stocked air conditioned library having around 9,000 books, various Newspapers, Magazines and many other e- Journals for ready reference to the students. Also, the department is well-equipped with the advanced laboratories and research softwares such as NetLogo, MATLAB, OptiSystem, LabVIEW, Scilab and CST-Studio. The department provides state-of-the-art computing facilities and has about 150 Intel 5th Generation computers having i5 processor, with latest software platforms like Windows 7/10, LINUX, UNIX etc. All the computers in the various labs /offices in the Department are connected via campus wide Local Area Network and WiFi facility is also available. The department provides Internet connectivity through 20Mbps leased line catering to the need of entire Campus. The department has 8 ICT enabled classrooms and 2 Seminar halls for lectures and other co-curricular activities.

During the course, the students are given theoretical and hands-on training in Programming Techniques, Database Management System, Operating Systems and other Application Software. Database Lab with latest SQL Server and supporting application software like MS Access, SQL Server, Oracle 10g & 11g are used for software development. Programming Lab is used for programming with latest IDE installed in it front-end tools like C/C++, Java, VB.Net Developer 2015. Also, the department has well-furnished laboratories of Electronic Devices and Circuits, Communication Systems, Digital Electronics, Microcontroller, Microprocessors Microwave Engineering, Industrial Electronics etc.



The various laboratories of the department are as follows:

Programming Lab I:

The Programming Lab-I is exclusively dedicated for teaching the basic programming techniques and its implementation to the students of B. Tech first year (CSE). The lab has 40 terminals with tool like C, C++, and Microsoft Office etc.

Programming Lab II:

The Programming Lab II is dedicated for teaching advanced programming techniques and its implementation to the students of B. Tech (CSE) second and third year. The lab has 25 terminals with Microsoft Visual Studio, Net Beans and other web development tools.

Database Lab:

The Database lab is dedicated for teaching various database management systems and its implementation to the students of B. Tech (CSE) second and third year. The lab has 25 terminals with Oracle, MySQL and other front end development tools like PHP and Microsoft Visual Studio.

Internet Lab:

The Internet lab is common for all the students of the campus. It has 25 latest Computers with high speed leased line internet connectivity. All the students are free to use the facility for academic and research purposes.

Electronic Devices and Circuits Lab:

This lab emphasis on practical aspect of basic electronics and its applications like various rectifier circuits, amplifiers circuits for e.g. Class A, Class B, Class C, Class AB, Push Pull, and transistor configuration such as common base, common emitter and also FET based circuits.

Communication System Lab:

It imparts knowledge to the students on the concept of Analog and Digital communications through trainer Kit like AM, FM, PM pulse, ASK, FSK, PSK Modulator and Demodulator.

Digital Electronic Lab:

This lab equips students with basic knowledge of digital electronics circuit such as various Digital Gates, Flip Flops, Registers, Counters, Multiplexers and De-Multiplexers, Timers, Encoder and Decode.

Analog Integrated Circuits Lab:

In this lab students design the operational amplifiers and IC 555, 565, 566 based circuit for analyzing theirs the characteristics like gain, input impedance, output impudence, frequency, locking range, capture range measurements etc.



Microprocessor, Micro controller & Digital Signal Processing Lab:

In this lab students learn about the programming concept of 8085, 8086 &Microcontrollor from basic to various interfacing cards because these systems are building blocks for all the intelligent systems. Digital Signal processing lab helps the students to understand the concepts of various operations on different types of data, voice and video signals i.e. manipulation, processing and visualization.

Microwave Lab:

This lab encourages the students to work towards the design and analysis of microwave circuits, and components such as antennas, phase shifters, attenuators, VSWR meter, directional coupler, klystron tube, filters etc. for RF, microwave, millimeter wave applications.

Electronic Measuring Instrument Lab:

This Lab helps students to study various instruments like Shearing Bridge, Wheat-Stone Bridge, Anderson Bridge, Wein Bridge, Kelvin Double Bridge, CRO, Function Generator, L.V Power Supply for Kelvin Bridge etc.



The Directorate of Research deals with matters relating to research activities in the University. It Includes, postgraduate research leading to M.Sc., M.Phil and Ph.D. degrees; submission of new research projects for extramural funding and development of national and international research collaborations. 

As per the UGC notification F. No. 1-8-2017 (CPP-II) "Categorization of Universities (Only) for Grant of Graded Autonomy Regulations, 2018" dated 12th Feb, 2018, Guru Nanak Dev University has been categorized as 'Category-I University'. Guru Nanak Dev University, being Category-I University, has been given the privilege to run Open & Distance Programme(s) without seeking the permissions from UGC as per below given notification:

4.10 "University may offer courses in the open and distance learning mode, without approval of the commission, provided it satisfies all the conditions laid down under UGC (Open and Distance Learning) and amendments from time to time."

All the courses under Category-I autonomy provisions are approved by UGC vide letter no. F. No. 74-2/2018 (DEB-I) dated 18/10/2018 and under this provision, with the permissions from Academic Council, Senate & Syndicate, Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar has established the Directorate of Open and Distance Learning in the main campus of GNDU, Amritsar. As per the provisions, new programmes under ODL mode have been introduced in the University, its Regional Campuses and its Colleges (Both University and Constituent) from Session 2018-19. Presently, the Directorate is offering 13 courses (Diploma in Computer Applications (DCA), B. Com., B.C.A., B. Lib., PG Diploma in Applied Nutrition (PGDAN), PG Diploma in Computer Applications (PGDCA), PG Diploma in Sports Psychology (PGDSP), M.B.A., M.C.A., M. Com., M.A. (English), M.A. (Punjabi), in areas of Arts, Humanities, Business Management, Commerce, Computer Science and Sports Sciences. In session, 2020-21 directorates has started one new PG programme M.Com. Directorate started its academic activity from session 2018-19 and in this session 2020-21 student count has increased to 700.





Availability of Self Learning materials (SLMs) is the backbone of open and distance learning mode of education. Directorate has worked extensively in this area and presently having the SLMs for almost for all subjects/courses. In the last two years, total 178 SLMs has been developed for different subjects for courses offered under ODL mode.

During the ongoing COVID 19 pandemic following practices has been developed and followed by Directorate to support the learner at their door steps

- Conduct of PCP classes in online mode
- Submission of the Internal Assignments in Online Mode.
- Submission of all documents in online mode.
- Online Grievances Redressal System.
- Sending of hard copy of study materials to home/office address of learner

Provision to provide Online Support / Counseling with dedicated Mobile Landline No.Some Highlights/Milestones achieved by the Directorate during the Session 2020-21. I ntroduction of one new PG Course M.Com To better facilitate the candidates, the Directorate has successfully conducted the Personal Contact Programme (PCP) classes in online mode during the Covid-19 pandemic.

Centre for Internal Quality Assurance (CIQA) (dedicated to programmes being offered under ODL mode) was established and Directorate has successfully submitted the CIQA report to Distance Education Bureau, University Grants Commission, New Delhi.In terms of infrastructure development, directorate has allocated the dedicated floor in old education block. Established as Academic Staff College in the year 1988, rechristened as Human Resource Development Centre by the UGC w.e.f. Keeping in view the heterogeneity of the participants for an Orientation Programme, the curriculum is designed to cover current burning social, political, economical, ethical issues like Gender Sensitization, Women Empowerment, Moral Values, Female Foeticide, Drug Addiction, Changing Educational scenario etc. in addition to the other diverse disciplines. Apart from erudite scholars, academicians, experts from the other walks of life, like renowned social workers, public administrators, bureaucrats, playwrights, etc. are brought face to face with the participants. Much emphasis is laid on honing the pedagogical skills of the young faculty members. In consonance with the rapid advancements in the field of information technology, the participants are imparted training in the optimum use of the ICT & other latest gadgets in the classroom teaching. So far as Refresher Courses are concerned, a Coordinator is appointed to look after the entire academic aspect of the course. The main motive of these Refresher Courses is to update the learned participants with the latest advancements in their respective discipline. All these courses including the Short Term Courses are intended to augment the existing knowledge of the learned teaching faculty/Research Scholars, in addition to enhance their pedagogical skills to raise the level of teaching in the institutes of higher education.

The academic administrators like Principals of the Colleges, Heads of the Departments are also brought together in the form of One-Day Meet, where the current issues pertaining to the Higher Education are discussed threadbare with the leading academicians. The HRDC has also ventured into organizing Short Term Courses for the Non-Teaching Employees, who, needless to say, act as a backbone of an Institute of higher learning.



All these courses are conducted with the prior approval of the University Grants Commission, New Delhi and are fully financed by it. Due to the pandemic of COVID-19 all courses were undertaken in online mode as per the UGC guidelines. In addition to the Faculty Induction Programmes, Refresher Courses, Short Term Courses and workshops; webinars were also undertaken in online mode.



CENTRE FOR BASIC AND TRANSLATIONAL RESEARCH IN HEALTH SCIENCES

The centre for basic and translational research in health sciences (CBTRHS) is established in the University in 2019 under Component 4.0 of RUSA 2.0 scheme with a budgetary provision of Rs. 10 Crore with major aim to provide necessary platform to translate fundamental research and ideas into meaningful practices in the area of health sciences. The establishment of the centre for "Basic and Translational Research in Health Sciences" is providing necessary platform to translate fundamental research and ideas into meaningful practices in the area of health sciences. The centre is also bringing together leading investigators of Guru Nanak Dev University in different key areas in health science. It acts as a catalyst to support health science research by providing resources to investigators, staff, scholars, trainees, and other stakeholders. The Centre is also in process of developing a centralized facility in Emerging Life Science building to provide a centralized resource dedicated to facilitating biomedical research, promote multidisciplinary basic & translational research, and foster long term collaboration between clinicians & basic science researchers.

The major objectives of this Centre are:-

- To be a pioneer in improving clinical care and health by developing innovative strategies for Prevention, early diagnosis and treatment of disease.
- To find problem based solutions in the area of health sciences using modern technologies and multi dimensional approach.
- Address key challenges in the area of diagnostics, drug discovery, drug delivery and regulatory compliance.
- Developing innovative, cost effective technologies to solve complex problems in the area of health sciences.
- To educate, mentor and train young investigators.
- Knowledge generation and IPR protection.

Different activities undertaking in last one Year:

Since the last year, Centre has developed a centralized facility in Emerging Life Science building to provide resources dedicated to facilitating biomedical research, promote multidisciplinary basic & translational research, and foster long term collaboration between clinicians & basic science researchers. The basic infrastructure facilities have been built to cater the research needs of Ph.D. scholars from different departments of GNDU. The instrumentation is such that research scholars can have multifaceted approach to achieve their desired objectives. Besides provision of basic instruments like hot air oven, BOD incubator,




orbital shaker, refrigerator, deep freezer required at initial sample preparation and storage phases, sophisticated instrumentation (Multimode ELISA plate reader, Ultratome etc.) for further sample processing and analysis is also available.

Centre has appointed two post doctorate fellows (PDFs) to do the advance research in following thrust areas as approved under RUSA DPR.

- Genetic disorders, Life Style disorders and infectious diseases.
- Drug discovery and development (Natural and synthetic approach).
- Development of drug formulations, herbal formulations and their validation.

In addition, advance research is going on in fifteen research projects sanctioned under this Centre to faculty members of ten different departments of the University (Botany, Biotechnology, Chemistry, Human Genetics, Microbiology, Molecular Biology & Biochemistry, MYAS-GNDU, Pharmaceutical Sciences, Drug & Pollution Testing Lab and Psychology) with grant in aid of Rs. 15 lakhs each (Total 2.23Cr). - Partnering with these national and international institutions is surely going to bring new knowledge, technology and opportunities to agriculture and in turn will catalyse the economy of the state.



CENTRE FOR SUSTAINABLE HABITAT

The Centre for Sustainable Habitat is established in the University in late 2018 under Rashtriya Uchchattar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA) 2.0 Component 4 with a budgetary provision of Rs. 10 Crore to propagate the agenda of sustainability in education, living and professional l practice. It attempts to demonstrate coexistence of the natural and built environment in a way that reduces our planetary footprint, emissions, resource consumption and waste, and improves quality of life for all. This is done by integrating multi-faceted ecological, social, economic and cultural perspectives together and translating into applied sciences, technology and most importantly behaviour. The Centre specializes in research towards comprehensive understanding of environmental issues facing, but not limited to, the country. The Centre has come up in line with the Sustainable Development Goals purposed by United Nations for Quality Education, Clean Water and Sanitation, Affordable and Green Energy, Sustainable Cities and Communities and Climate Actions. The Centre's research and conduct interests are formed by four interconnected pillars i.e. Sustainable Urbanism, Resilient Natural Systems, Green Enovation Systems and Community for Sustainability. For the same, the Centre has identified six tracks wiz Sustainable Habitat, Transportation Planning, Water Management, Sanitation and Septage, Waste Management and Green Energy. Inter-disciplinary teaching, research and training in the above mentioned tracks will addressed the key challenges of sustainable habitat, environment and ecology, social economic characteristics to help in formulating workable, achievable and rational planning and management policies and strategies at the local and regional levels. The Centre's resources provide ample opportunities for hands-on learning through research and training programmes. The Centre intends to introduce Certificate/Diploma/Degree/Doctoral Degree/Post-Doctoral, Faculty Development and outreach programmes in the times to come. The state-of-art centralized design, transport, water and air and noise pollution labs are in the process of establishment for the conduct of the Centre Core Committee has been constituted by the University to prepare action plans for various activities of the Centre. Also, a Steering Committee comprising of experts from a research and professional institutes is constituted to advise on different matters concerning the Centre. A Project Review Committee comprising of experts from academic, research and professional training institute is constituted by the University to review the research conducted under the projects of the Centre. The Centre has initiated possible collaborations for research and capacity enhancement with the National and International organizations. In this endeavour the Centre has awarded 11 research projects to the Faculty of the University addressing the water, sanitation, environmental pollution, and energy challenges faced by the urban and rural settlements of Punjab. The research projects aim at analysing and identifying the impacts of these challenges on the health and liveability conditions of the inhabitants of the settlements. Each project is awarded at the grant of Rupees 15 Lakh for a period of two years. Three Post-Doctoral Fellows are recruited to conduct research on aspects related to the mandate of the Centre. The Center has signed MoU's with Centre for Science and Environment, New Delhi; Cities Forum, London; National Highway Authority of India, New Delhi to undertake collaborative research and capacity building training programmes.

This was needed to steer the research activities in the winning direction to strengthen the research output and carve an enviable niche in the research society. In pursuit of its edifying goal, CDAR has been providing veritable assistance to scholars at different points of research. In providing impetus to research activities and creating a research culture, the following specific activities were undertaken by centre:

- 1. **Database availability:** Data remains the integral part of research and the foundation on which the entire research structure is built. Realising the indispensability of data, CDAR has made available the comprehensive and most accessed database for researchers in filed of social sciences, i.e. ACE Equity. The accessibility to database has been made available to the entire research community with assistance in generating query, retrieval of information and downloading. In the wake of the pandemic induced lockdowns, to ensure the smooth conduct of research, the remote access of ace equity called ace solver was also procured from the suppliers. CDAR has also procured authoritative approvals for provision of another useful database called PROWESS which is accepted to be available for access shortly.
- 2. **Creating programs for research:** Having successfully developed different programs for analysis, the Centre stands committed to assist the research efforts and overcome impediments on the road to research goals. The development of specific, query driven programs is a continuous exercise and few programs are currently being worked upon. On their successful implementation and use by the researcher they will be mentioned in the department's contributions. These relate to resource allocation in companies, readability of issue documents of IPO companies, risk disclosure etc. to name a few.
- 3. **Assistance to researchers:** CDAR is dedicating itself to the service and assistance of researchers from university and outside. The Centre provides assistance pertaining to various facets of research raging from accessing the literature, data collection, and data cleaning and most importantly in analysing the data in the best and methodologically sound manner. Following research scholars were successfully guided by the centre.

- 4. **Developing a culture of Open Source Software:** The indispensability of statistical software cannot be overemphasised in current competitive times dominated by information overload. In the face of very highly priced data analysis software and the drain on financial resources especially in pandemic times exorbitant prices deter the research work. Hence, Centre has shouldered the responsibility of sensitising the researchers about the efficacy and eminence of open source software, providing familiarity to these open source software promoting the use of statistical software. Creating awareness about this software, underlying ethical considerations, sharing links for accessing this software and making the users familiar to this software has all been initiated by CDAR. The centre is trying to create a culture of making open source software a part of research analysis and has been promoting use of software like R, R studio, R Commander, Jamovi, Gretl, Bluesky, Jasp etc.
- 5. Offering value added courses: Responding to the dynamic needs of the industry and accreditation agencies Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar has been contemplating the idea of launching audit courses for value addition and providing the necessary skills to the youth to be prepared for the challenges of contemporary dynamic times. In this context, CDAR is working on the details of designing an audit course in data analytics to chisel the analytical abilities of interested students. An Inter-disciplinary course in the open source software R was launched during the session but failure to garner minimum required registrations, the course could not be started. The Centre will continue to work on the pedagogical and curriculum-based details and offer value driven, audit or ID courses to students in present times when data analytics offers loads of opportunities.
- 6. Queries of students and researchers: CDAR has committed itself to assisting researchers and provide solutions to the minor and major hiccups faced in their research journey. CDAR has made its resources and assistance available for helping the researchers tread the research path with a positive and winning attitude. Students and researchers have been reaching out to the centre with their queries and clarifications and CDAR has been helping the researchers conduct meaningful research and contribute to strengthening the research metrics of the university, region and country overall.
- 7. **Assistance in conduct of activities in university:** As a Centre for analysis and programming CDAR has been able to contribute in the smooth working of the university. CDAR prepared a program for The Department for Life Long Learning whereby the entire activities from maintaining the list of registered candidates to the final printing of certificates was successfully done. This held more significance in pandemic struck times where accessing professional services and physical movements were restricted. CDAR has been contributing in the effective working of the Electricity Department of university wherecustomised program has been developed for day to day



operations and regular activities like bill generation, calculation of rentals and updation as and when the rates change. This year also the Centre worked for the extensive updation of the software in line with the changes in the systems and rentals.

CDAR spearheaded the counselling process (both online and offline) for all UG and PG courses in the Faculty of Economics and Business. This included generating systems for conduct, creating lists, ensuring correct course allotment, generating fee slips and enabling payments through all modes. In light of the Covid protocols the job was arduous but with the diligence and cooperation of the entire CDAR team and the university authorities, the counselling process was a huge success. CDAR also contributed in the admission and counselling of the courses in the Faculty of Engineering and seats were successfully filled amidst the challenges of lockdown, Corona and the stringent protocols.

Workshop in collaboration with STATCRAFT: In continuing its services to the research fraternity, CDAR conducted a one-day workshop on the theme 'Data Analysis in R Using STATCRAFT' in collaboration with STATCRAFT on February 27, 2021 to create awareness about the R software, different analysis using R and implementing STATCRAFT codes in the R environment. The audience was apprised of the various analytical tools and their usage in R and utilising the benefits through STATCRAFT.

The Centre for Data Analytics and Research remains committed to the edifying exercise of strengthening the research profile of the university, region and nation. The Centre is aiming to provide comprehensive research related services to the researchers of all disciplines, varied research experience, different geographical locations are attempted to be conditioned and prepared for effective and influential research. Through trainings, counselling, data analysis and data availability CDAR is keeping its relevance intact in order to keep research relevant and rewarding.

University Library was established in March 1970. In 1979, it was shifted to the present building of five storeyed, inverted pyramid shaped magnificent building, directly visible from the main gate of the University on the Grand Trunk Road. It is centrally located with teaching departments all around. University Library has been named after the great Sikh Scholar Bhai Gurdas and is popularly known as Bhai Gurdas Library. Bhai Gurdas had a rare privilege of taking dictation from the fifth Sikh Guru, Guru Arjan Dev Ji for the compilation of the holy scripture of the Sikhs, the Adi Granth.

The library remains open on all days of the year except on two National Holidays i.e. 26th January, and 15th August.

For the academic year 2020 - 2021 library has subscribed 164 printed research journals (58 Foreign Journals and 106 Indian journals). Library has also received 150 journals as gratis from various government departments, educational institutions and organizations. "IEEE ASPP+POP" Online database has been subscribed by the library. Through this database university is getting access to 190 IEEE online journals + 5 lacs articles of various Conference Proceedings related to Electronics Technology Department, Computer Science Department & Computer Engineering Department. Bibliographic online databases "SCOPUS" & "SciFinder" have also been subscribed by the library. 2300 E-journals of various publishers such as Elsevier, Wiley & Royal Society of Chemistry have been subscribed by the library. Online access to 7032 Journals, Bibliographic Databases and some other databases are available through E-Shodh Sindhu. In addition to this 368 backsets of Journals were also processed.

Rare Books & Manuscripts/Theses/Dissertations section

In the academic session (2020-21) 75 Food Science & Technology reports were processed by the section.

DELNET



University library is a member of DELNET (Developing Library Network, New Delhi). It helps the faculty members and researchers to procure those books, articles and documents from other educational institutions which are not available in our library.

Computer Section

The library has its own computer section. All the library operations such as housekeeping, bibliographical services, cataloguing, preparation of database of books with complete bibliographical details and serial control are carried out by computer section. RFID based system with LMS has been installed in University Library. Now Teachers, Research Scholars and Students can use this system for issue and return of the same independently. For this purpose, RFID tagging of all books is being done at a rapid speed in order to make access to the books for circulation. Students, research scholars and faculty members are constantly kept aware of the latest information/books/journals/e-journals through e-mail by this section.

This section also provides access to anti plagiarism software namely 'Ouriginal' through INFLIBNET Centre.

E-books

E-books have been purchased for different departments along with e-journals which were already available. Now students can access E books from anywhere inside campus. Number of e-books is 8678 approx.

Website

University library has its own web page. The address of this website is http://library.gndu.ac.in.The library web page can also be accessed from Guru Nanak Dev University website www.gndu.ac.in. This website contains useful information about library services.

OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue)

University library has prepared database of books in English, Hindi & Punjabi Languages. As soon as new books are purchased and processed, their bibliographic description is added to OPAC. Web OPAC is also available at http://library.gndu.ac.in.

Digital Lab.

Soft copies of M.Phil dissertations, Ph.D theses, books, census reports and gazetteers are available in this section. 13 CDs of books have been added during this year. Electronic journals can be accessed from this section and students are trained how to access e-journals and e-databases. Wifi Facilities is also available in personal reading hall from 5.00 pm to 9.00 am all the days.



CENTRE FOR IT SOLUTIONS

The "Centre for IT Solutions" is established with the vision for uplifting the computerization of various processes by providing IT related services like Software Development, Consultancy Services and Website Designing & Management etc. to enhance the efficiency and transparency in the University. The Centre is providing these services to various departments of University as well as outside of University. The Centre has three computer laboratories equipped with desirable configuration of hardware and software. The staff of Centre is primarily involved in Software Development and Maintenance to cater the IT related requirements of the University. The centre has also started two job oriented courses PGDCA and DCA to spread professional education in the border area belt of region from the session 2019-20. The staff of centre is fully equipped to teach these courses. The students are also given practical exposure of software development.

The technical expertise of centre is utilized during online centralized state level admissions to various Law courses in different Universities/Institutes/Colleges throughout the state. The centre also provides its technical services for recruitment of staff in schools and colleges of Punjab. The database of Inter Disciplinary Courses for various departments of the University campus is being prepared and managed by the centre in every semester which facilitates the students to fill their choices online for ID-courses using online software application. The centre imparts computer training to the employees of the University. The laboratories of centre are also used for computer proficiency test for recruitment as well as promotion of employees. The staff of centre has played an important role in redesigning and development of University website. The centre also maintains the official website of University on regular basis.

The infrastructure support available in the centre is provided for conducting practical classes and practical examinations of students from different departments. The online tests are also conducted in the laboratories of centre for placement of students. The internet facility is available in computer laboratories, rooms of officers and office of centre. The help desk facility is established in one of the computer laboratories for helping the students to fill their application/examination forms through online process. The results of entrance tests during admission process in the university campus and its regional campuses are also compiled in the centre.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Guru Nanak Dev University accredited by NAAC with 'A' grade was established on November 24, 1969 to mark the 500th birth Anniversary of Sri Guru Nanak DevJi. It is both a residential and affiliating university. Guru Nanak Dev University has made phenomenal progress in the field of sports in the Inter-University, National and International competitions. The Department of Physical Education (Allied Teaching) was set up in 1970. The Department started organizing Inter-College tournaments from 1970 itself and sent teams for the Inter-Varsity tournaments for the first time in 1971. From the very beginning, Sports Committees for men and women were formed to guide and coordinate the sports activities and to organize games and sports in the affiliated colleges to raise the university teams for Inter-University and other tournaments. On the basis of the performance in the Inter-College tournaments, various universities teams are selected for participation in the Inter-University competitions which are organized by the Association of Indian Universities, New Delhi. Each year, the Department of Physical Education (Allied Teaching) organizes 120 Guru Nanak Dev University Inter-college (Men and Women) tournaments and sends 95universities (M&W) teams for participation in North Zone / All India Inter-University (M&W) Championships. In order to attain excellence in sports, coaching camps for selected men and women teams are organized at a Hill Station during summer vacation for imparting physical fitness and conditioning training. Liberal facilities are provided to the players who participate in the Inter-University tournaments as members of Guru Nanak Dev University teams in terms of free board and lodging during coaching camps and cash prize money to those players who win the positions in Inter-University competitions. Today, in the field of sports, Guru Nanak Dev University is rated as the Top University amongst 609 universities in the country. The unparalleled achievement of Guru Nanak Dev University in sports is much due to its sportsmen and sportswomen of the colleges as well as a mechanism of 'right type of training' 'right type of selection' and 'right type of administration' which remained the key factors in achieving high standards in sports at Inter-University, National and International levels.

SPORTS FACILITIES AND INFRASTRUCTURE AVAILBLE AT UNIVERSITY CAMPUS.

An Area of 30 acres of land has already been developed into various grounds / playfields for development of sports.

FACILITIES & INCENTIVES:

- 1. **Sports Hostel for Boys & Girls:** The University has separate Sports hostels for Boys and Girls within university campus with capacity of 150 and 100 members respectively.. The outstanding athletes are accommodated free of cost in these hostels. The new separate Sports Hostels for Boys and Girls is under progress in the University Campus.
- 2. **Hockey Stadium:** The Hockey Astro Turf at the university campus is available for the players with sitting capacity along with flood lighting facility.
- 3. Swimming Pool of International Standard has already been put to used for competitions / practice.
- 4. Indoor Multipurpose Gymnasiumequipped with Maple wood flooring, wall paneling, sound proofing and false ceiling is available for the players. It has been put to use for various inter-college/inter-university competitions.



- 5. Velodrome: The velodrome at the university campus is ready for use. The Velodrome grooms the budding cyclists of this area and to project them in the inter-university, national and international competitions.
- 6. Shooting Rangein the campus is equipped with 38 target facilities so that the shooters of this university can groom their skill and field them for the inter-university, national and international level competitions. All India Inter-University Shooting as well as National level Championships have been organized in the range very successfully.
- 7. One grassy track (400m);
- 8. Two Cricket pitches;
- 9. Two grassy Hockey grounds;
- 10. Two Football grounds;
- 11. Two cemented with flood light Basketball courts;
- 12. Two cinder Volleyball courts;
- 13. One cemented and one grassy Tennis court;
- 14. One platform for Wrestling, Weight Lifting, Power Lifting and Boxing.

Prize Distribution Function: Guru Nanak Dev University awarded the cash prizes to the position holders of Inter-University Championships and International Championships for the worth about Rs. 1.5 crore.

Physical conditioning unit with various fitness stations has been set-up at the Students' Centre for attaining physical fitness for the players in their intended games.

Incentives:

The outstanding players / athletes are awarded Roll of honour, prizes and other concessions. The University awarded cash prize of rs.30,000/- for Ist position holders, rs.25,000/- for 2nd and rs. 20,000/- for 3rd position holders in Inter-University Championships for International Positions, cash prize is Rs. 1,00,000/- for Ist Position Holder, Rs. 75,000/- for 2nd Position Holder, Rs. 50,000/- for 3rd Position Holder, Rs. 30,000/- for Fourth Position and Rs. 20,000/- for participation.

Concession : In case of students who have participated in the Inter-University and/or in the National Tournaments as members of University or State Team, the requirement of marks for purpose of admission to M.A. and other Post-Graduate Courses is reduced by 5%.

Campus Sports Department situated in student centre, is working under Dean Student's Welfare, GNDU Amritsar. In order to develop the interest of campus students in sports, Campus Sports Department provides facilities for indoor games like Table Tennis, Chess, and Carom etc. Apart from this recently inaugurated an ultra modern Gym "The Golden Jubilee Fitness Centre" equipped with the modern machines. The teachers, students, employees and their wards are entitled to use at nominal charges.

Sports equipments and other necessary items are provided to the students throughout the year. Four Badminton courts are available near the student's centre which remains open day and night. Other playfields like Basketball, Volleyball, Handball, Tennis, Football and International Standard Swimming Pool, Indoor Multipurpose Gymnasium, International Standard Shooting Range, International Standard Hockey Turf and International Standard Velodrome are available to the campus students throughout the year.

Each year, Campus Sports Department organizes Inter-department competitions in different games viz. Table Tennis, Chess, Carom, Basketball, Volleyball, Handball, Tennis, Football, Kabaddi, Cricket, Swimming, Arm Wrestling, Best Physique, Tug of War and Hockey games. Annual Sports Meet is also organized and sports persons are honored with cash prize and mementos. The students both boys and girls from different departments participate in these competitions. The position holder team's upto third positions are awarded with Mementoes, Overall Trophies and Merit Certificates.

The campus students also take part in GNDU Inter-college sports competitions/North Zone/All India Inter-University/National and Inter-National Championships. The campus sports persons who secure first positions in All India Inter-university or National Championships are entitled to 100% fee & funds refund, financial Assistant and honored with Blazer and University Color. Similarly, Second or Third position holders in All India Inter-university or National Championships are awarded with refund of 100% fees & funds, financial Assistance and Track Suits. The players who participate in All India Inter-university championships are awarded with refund of 50% of tuition fee & funds with financial Assistance to campus students.

STUDENT HOSTEL-1 SAHIBZADA ZORAWAR SINGH BOY'S HOSTEL

Under the Covid-19, Pandemic guidlines issues by University authorities as per Govt. of the Boys' Hostel No.1 has provided accommodation to about 354 students of 40 Departments (approximately). The mess-halls are furnished with quality furniture. The Kitchen areas are spacious, airy and there is power backup of inverters in the mess area. Water cooling machines, deep freezers and chest coolers are part of the kitchen area. The two canteens are being run in the hostel by two contractors and the services are available to the residents from 6.00 a.m. to 11.00 p.m. to privde quality food products. Bath rooms and toilets of each block in the hostel are recently renovated as pr the quality standards. Futher, geysers are installed in block of bathrooms. Two common rooms of the hostel are well-equipped with 42" LCD screens and 42" LED screens. There are provisions for indoor games like table tennis and carom-board. Arrangements are there for out-door games like badminton and volley ball as well. The hostel has a reading room having seating capacity of 100 students and remains open round the clock. The hostel premises are internet ready through Wi-Fi technology. Special care is taken for maintaining sanitary and hygiene conditions in and around the buildings within the hostel premises. The hostel is given an aesthetics look through proper landscaping.



SAHIBZADA ZORAWAR SINGH BOY'S HOSTEL-2

Sahibzada Zorawar Singh Boys Hostel was started in October 2000 with a capacity to accommodate 198 students in 65 rooms. To meet the requirement of additional accommodation, a new block of 68 rooms was constructed in 2003. A new block has been constructed in Sahibzada Zorawar Singh Boys Hostel in the year 2010. This block consists of 128 rooms to be allotted to research scholars.

MESS:

There are two messes in the hostel run by separate contractors and are managed by mess committees of the students under the supervision of the Hostel Warden. The mess halls are furnished with furniture, and are equipped with desert coolers, water cooler along with water filters. Ban marry hot case are provided in the messes to serve hot food to the residents. Chimneys are installed in the mess kitchens to exhaust out the smoke and maintain the temperature of the kitchen to workable conditions.

CANTEEN:

The canteen is being run in the hostel by a contractor. Canteen offers snacks, tea, coffee, juice, milk products etc at fixed prices are served in the canteens and remains open from 8:00 am to 10:00 pm.

Common Room Facilities

Hostel has two well-equipped common rooms with LCD television and Dish T.V facility. Common Room facilities are available to the students from 07:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m. Eleven leading newspapers in English, Hindi & Punjabi and eight magazines and periodicals are subscribed the benefit of the students.

Reading Room:

Hostel has one Reading Hall with adequate furniture for the hostel residents. Reading Room facilities are available to the residents from 07:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m.

Wi-Fi Facility:

The residents have access to the internet through Wi-Fi in all the rooms at each floor in all three blocks.

Indoor and Outdoor Games:

The hostel has provision for outdoor and indoor games like Volleyball, Badminton, Chess, Table Tennis and Carom-board.

Lawns:

There are beautiful lawns around the three blocks of the hostel. Ten lawn benches have been placed at various places in the lawns.

OUTDOOR GYM

The outdoor gym is available for students in the hostel

Solar Gysers:

There are 3 working Solar Geysers in the hostel.

Repair and Maintenance Services:

The hostel has instant repair and maintenance services for electricity, furniture and water supply.



SAHIBZADA ZORAWAR SINGH BOY'S HOSTEL BOY'S HOSTEL - 3

The Boy's Hostel-3 started in 2016 with provision of accommodation for 134 students in 44 roomsand is spread over four storey interconnected blocks. The rooms are offered on sharing basis. Each room is well lit and ventilated and has an attached balcony/verandah to it. The hostel has provision of geysers in all the bathrooms and water coolers along with water purifiers on each floor. The hostel premise is beautified by spacious green lawn interspersed with seasonal flower beds and trees. Lawns and squares inside the hostel are properly landscaped by trees, shrubs and colourful seasonal flowers to add to the aesthetics of the hostel.

The hostel is well equipped with the modern facility of Wi-Fi system. CCTV cameras have also been installed at the hostel entry gate as well as at the entrance of each floor.

The hostel has a spacious mess run by contractor. The hostel warden and the students' mess committee supervise the food preparation to ensure quality food and better services to the students. The dining hall is equipped with desert coolers, water cooler along with water filters and fly/insect killer for health, sanitary & hygieneprospectus. The kitchen and dining areaare spacious, airy and there is power backup from inverter. Bain-marie and electric chimney have been installed in hostel mess. The cook and other mess staff follow good habits of hygiene.

The hostel has the facility of common room as well as reading room. The hostel common room provides necessary facilities such as L.E.D. (42") with Dish TV, newspapers, magazines and indoor gameslike Carom board, Chess, Table Tennisetc. One A. C. Reading Hall having seating capacity of about 100 students.

The other activities during the given period are as follows:

- 1-7-2020 to 30-06-2021:
- CCTV cameras have been installed at the entrance of all the gates at each floor of the hostel premises.
- Air conditioners have been installed in the reading room.



MATA NANAKI GIRLS HOSTEL NO. 1

Mata Nanaki Girls Hostel-1 established in 1973 provides accommodation to students studying in different departments at the university campus. There are 174 rooms having intake capacity of 460 girls. The accommodation offered includes two bedded, four bedded and five bedded rooms. The hostel is well-equipped with facilities like internet with wi-fi, common room with T.V., medical room, Photostat-cum-utility shop, PCO-cum-stationary store, fully AC reading hall, mess, canteen, laundry service etc. The hostel has lush green lawns with benches for sitting.

To ensure the safety and security of the residents, the hostel entrance and boundaries are under 24 hrs. CCTV surveillance. In addition to this, the hostel is manned by female attendants and night guards. Every effort is made to make the stay of residents comfortable, enjoyable and fruitful.

- Activities in Hostel: Festivals of Lohri, Janamashtmi, Guru Nanak Devji birthday and Prabhatpheriwere celebrated in the hostel and attended by the residents with great enthusiasm in normal circumstances.
- Innovations and Best Practices:- An Air conditioned reading room with a seating capacity of 60 students was made functioned in hostel premises. An open air gymnasium with latest machine was also installed.



MATA NANAKI GIRLS' HOSTEL-2

Mata Nanaki Girls Hostel-2 established in 1973 provides accommodation to students studying in different departments at the university campus. There are 225 rooms having intake capacity of 622 girls. The accommodation offered includes two seated, three seated, four seated and five seated rooms. The hostel is well-equipped with facilities like utility shop, Photostat, PCO-cum-stationary store, reading hall, mess, canteen, etc. The hostel blocks have geysers and water coolers with filters. Wi-Fi facility is also available for the residents. For security purposes, the boundaries and entrance to the hostel are under CCTV surveillance in addition to being manned by female attendants, male security guards at the entrance and women night guards. The residents are provided with mess facility which is run on contract basis and provided clean and nutritious food to students according to a pre-decided menu. 'Bain Marie' has been also provided to students in mess for their self services. The dining hall of the mess is equipped with water cooler and fly/insect killers. In addition, there is a separate canteen which offers a variety of snacks, beverages, fast food and others items of choice. The hostel has also well furnished common room with facilities like L.E.D TV with Dish connection.. The common room provides necessary facilities such as various newspapers, magazines and some indoor games for the overall developments of the residents. A separate reading room is also available to the residents for studying. The Facility of Open Gym is also available for hostel residents.

The hostel has a well furnished guest room for its visitors. A Medical room with Paramedical service is available in the hostel with a well qualified female nurse on duty during night.

- 1. **Activities in the Calendar year 2020:-** Due to Lockdown in year 2020-21 and following the guidance of Punjab Govt., we have maintained social distancing; therefore no cultural activities like Lohri, Prabhat Pheri and Gurpurab were organized in the Hostel premises.
- 2. **Innovations and Best Practices:-** There is a formation of Mess committee comprising of 10 student residing of the hostel who discuss the issue faced by students in the mess and they worked on the food quality of the mess.
- 3. **Achievement in the Calendar year 2020:-** The hostel premise will always remain ragging free to provide conductive atmosphere to the residents.
- 4. **Plans for next year:** The facility of Air conditioners is going to provide for the students in mess, common room, and guest room and computer lab. To carry forward the legacy of peaceful, clean and healthy residents facility, the hostel is committed to work in this direction so that our residents feels comfort and homely environment.



MATA NANAKI GIRLS HOSTEL No-III

Mata Nanaki Girls Hostel III started in January 2014 with provision of accommodation for 761 Students in 255 well lit and ventilated rooms spread over six storey high interconnected blocks. Each block has separate lift with back up facility of generator. This hostel is allotted only to the students who are in the second or higher year of their respective courses on sharing basis. The hostel has provision of geysers in all the bathrooms and water coolers along with water purifiers in each block. The mess of the hostel is being run on contract basis and provides clean nutritious food to the students according to a pre decided menu. The dining hall of the mess is equipped with water coolers along with water purifiers and fly/ insect killers. The hostel has the facility of common room as well as reading room. The hostel common room provides necessary facilities such as L.E.D. with Dish TV, newspapers, magazines and many indoor games. The hostel premises have spacious green lawns with seasonal flower beds and trees surrounding the main building. The facility of common open gym is also available for hostel residents.

A common medical room is available in the hostel with a nurse, attendant and security Guards on duty at night. To ensure the safety and security of the residents, the hostel boundaries and entrance are under 24 hours CCTV surveillance. The hostel is equipped with wifi connectivity. The hostel has common provisional store and shops providing stationary and other utility items and photocopying facility, tailoring facility, washing and ironing of clothes facility within the premises. To promote hygiene among the residents, facility of Sanitary napkin vending machine with Incinerator has been provided in the hostel. There are different Student's Committees (Mess, Canteen & Block) for discussing various hostel issues so that their problems can be resolved in time.

Like previous years, this year also the hostel residents actively participated in various activities & festivals such as Lohri and various Gurupurab Celebrations. All the efforts are being made to give a homely feeling to the residents.



MATA NANAKI GIRLS HOSTEL NO.-IV

Mata Nanaki Girls Hostel No. - IV has currently six blocks namely 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 & 6 Blocks. Blocks 1, 2 & 3 have 288 single seated rooms while 4, 5 & 6 Block have 179 rooms on sharing basis providing accommodation for 741 students in total. Mostly all the Ph.D., M. Phil. and final year students of Post Graduate courses are being provided accommodation in this hostel.

The hostel is well-equipped with all basic facilities such as Wi-Fi, medical facility, Open Gym facility and Photocopy-cum-Stationary shops etc. The mess of the hostel provides clean nutritious food to students according to pre-decided menu and are also equipped with water coolers along with water purifiers, fire extinguishers and fly/insect killers. The mess of the hostel purchased two Ban Maries and food is served in ban Maries to ensure timely and efficient serving to the residents. The hostel common-room provides necessary facilities such as television, newspapers, magazines and some indoor & outdoor games. A separate reading room is also available for the hostel residents. The hostel has a well furnished Guest Room for its visitors. CCTV cameras have also been installed all around the hostel boundary keeping in view the security of the girl students. A scooter stand is also available outside the hostel. Sanitary Napkin Vending Machine along with Incinerator machine is installed in the hostel for the benefit of the residents.

The session 2020 being the year of pandemic the main focus of hostel was on cleanliness and sanitation of the premises. The students and staff were advised to follow Covid Protocols.

IV. Plans for next year

The Hostel is committed towards providing best hostel facilities to its residents and in this direction the hostel aimed to provide neat & clean environment, hygienic food, security arrangements and homely environment to the students.



UNIVERSITY HEALTH CENTRE

The University Health Centre was established in 1973 as a primary health care facility. The mission of the Health Centre is to enhance the health and wellness of University students, faculty and staff by providing access to quality health services and ensuring their well being. Health Centre provides clinical (supporting health and well being through care for acute and ongoing diseases and injuries) as well as ancillary services like laboratory, radiology and pharmacy services to the University community apart from supporting educational and research activities as well.

The University Health Centre provides services for Medical, Dental as well as Ayurvedic O.P.D. There is also a specialized sports dentistry clinic which provides mouth guards to the sports persons for prevention of dental injuries. Attached to the Health Centre is a well equipped Physiotherapy Centre having trained physiotherapist. These facilities remain open Monday to Saturday and even on gazzetted/declared holidays. Emergency services including ambulance services are available 24x7. The doctors at Health Centre provide primary health care. For services not covered at Health Centre, referral services to Government and Multispecialty hospitals for specialized treatment/hospitalization are available. Twenty Nine hospitals are on empanelment with the University at CGHS rates.

Other in house facilities available at Health Centre are:

Fully computerized digital Electrocardiograph (ECG)

Digital X-ray

Bone mineral density scan (DEXA Scan)

Mammography

Dental X-ray (RVG)

Orthopantomogram

Vacuum thermoforming machine (for making mouth guards)

A Medical Board has been constituted at the Health Centre (with two outside experts) for issuing chronic complicated disease certificates to eligible University patients. In addition a Medical Committee is also constituted to assess the working of Health Centre and recommend programs for the benefit of University patients.

In order to manage any casualty among girl students, Health Centre has set up a medical room in the Girls' Hostel and a staff nurse is available at the hostel from 8 pm to 8 am daily including on Sundays & holidays. The medical officers of Health Centre regularly inspect the messes and Canteens in Boys & Girls Hostels. The mess & canteens workers are periodically examined and screened for any communicable diseases.



The University Health Centre has set up a sample collection unit in collaboration with NABL accredited laboratory for providing quality lab facilities at special subsidised rates. Ultrasonography facility has been provided to the university patients at discounted/CGHS rates in collaboration with three leading diagnostic centres of the city.

Keeping in view the unprecedented COVID-19 time, an isolation room has been set up at Health Centre to separate and restrict movement of persons who are not ill but believed to have been exposed to the infection for the purpose of preventing the transmission of the disease. A few students of the University had availed of this facility in co-ordination with District Health Authority and successfully completed their quarantine period. Furthermore, recognising the community transfer of COVID-19, the University had made arrangements for sample collection for rt-PCR tests at the Health Centre. Being committed to the health of the faculty, staff and students of Guru Nanak Dev University and following the procedure and guidelines issued by the Punjab Government a vaccination drive against COVID-19 was started on 01-04-2021 and is still continuing at University Health Centre, 2158 doses of Covishield and Covaxin have been administered to people aged 18 years and above till 30 June 2021.

The infrastructure of Health Centre has also been strengthened. The computerization of registration of faculty, staff & students has initiated and the process to fully computerise the pharmacy is underway. A bigger and more patient friendly ambulance has also been purchased.

Landscape Officer : Mr. Gurwinder Singh M. Sc.

Commemorating Guru Nanak Dev's birth quincentenary celebrations Guru Nanak Dev University Amritsar was established on 24th November 1969. Hence a high powered committee was constituted with S. Bishan Singh Samundari the then founder Vice Chancellor Guru Nanak Dev University, Dr. M. S. Randhawa the then Vice Chancellor Punjab Agricultural University Ludhiana, the then Vice Chancellor Punjab university Chandigarh, Chief Architect U.T. Chandigarh, Architect PAU Ludhiana and some prominent personalities in the subject for planning, designing and development of the new campus of university. Accordingly the department of Landscaping was also established for the proper planning and development of landscaping through selection and collection of different types of plants in trees, shrubs, climbers, indoor plants, ground covers and grasses then their plantation and maintenance for beautiful campus Landscaping. The committee did extensive survey of the campus then intensive planning selected the promising and beautiful plants and planted them to make the campus of Guru Nanak Dev University evergreen, colorful, fragrant and pleasant. This department had been looked after by Mr. H. S. Dhindsa as the founder Landscape Officer (Dec. 1971 – July 1978) who was followed by Mr. G. S. Pannu from August 1978 to April 30th 2009 his superannuation.

The department of Landscaping has been activated by Prof. (Dr.) Jaspal Singh Sandhu the worthy Vice Chancellor after a big gap when he joined Guru Nanak Dev University Amritsar (16th August 2017). He picked up Dr. J. S. Bilga from Central University of Punjab Bathinda as Consultant Horticulture. Now Dr. Bilga is assisted by 5 head Malis, a small number of 19 Malis and 35 workers for a vast campus of 500 acres of Guru Nanak Dev University including 25 acres of Botanical Garden. Mrs. Mandeep Kaur is working as Data Entry Operator.

Department of Landscaping is assigned the responsibilities of planning, plantation, transplanting and maintenance of gardening all over the campus including, nursery production, hoeing, irrigation, pruning, training & trimming, replacement of plants, fertilization and plant protection along with over all greening and cleaning of lawns. Under educative agenda this department is organizing Flower shows and seminars twice a year in the subject for the awareness of students and residents.

Regular appointment of Landscape Officer:

Prof. Dr. Jaspal Singh Sandhu Vice Chancellor being a gardening lover and dedicated environmentalist deeply felt the need of a regular Landscape Officer for the continuous up keep of the department approved the regular of appointment of Landscape Officer. Hence Mr. Gurwinder Singh possessing



M. Sc. In the subject of Landscaping and Floriculture from PAU Ludhiana was selected through proper meritorious procedure. Mr. Gurwinder Singh joined as Landscape Officer on 22nd December 2020 (FN).

During the reporting year 2020 - 21 the department of Landscaping has performed the following activities:

New Landscaping and plantation works:

- New planning and development of Landscaping around the following departments have been done during the current year:
- Different species of ground covers with three varaties of palms i.e. Phoenix palm (*Phoenix roebelenii*), Traveler palm (*Ravenella madagascarensis*) and Bismarkia palm (*Bismarkia nobilis*) have been planted around Bhai Gurdas Library for its beautiful look.
- UIT building,
- HRDC building,
- Tourism and Hospitality department,
- Department of Agriculture,
- Department of Mass Communication shall be done for their beauty and environment.
- Department of Education
- Area between Punjab and Sind Bank and University shopping centre.

• Revenue plantations:

In continuation with the previous plantation of Shisham trees (the state tree of Punjab) around UIT block, it has been added to the more areas behind B and C type houses as a source of revenue for the years to come.

• Plantation of fragrant plants:

As our campus is known for the best tree and green cover along with large number of seasonal flowers this year we have started the collection and plantation of fragrant plants. Accordingly Rat- ki- rani (*Cestrum nocturnum*), jasmines (*Jasminum sambac*), mehndi (*Lawsonia inermis*), gardenia (Gardenia *jasminoides*), harshingar (*Nyctanthus arbortristus*) and murraya (*Murraya paniculata*) have been planted at various sites to make the campus fragrant.

Pollution check barriers:

Buffer plantation has been done with different species of trees, shrubs and three varaties of Bamboos i.e. *Dendrocalamus strictus, Bamboosa multiplex* and *Phyllostachys aurea* (brought from CSIR - IHBT Palampur, HP) inside the boundary wall starting from Ram Tirath gate to



HRDC through UIT as a green barrier to check total pollution including dust, smoke and noise.

• Gap filling in Citrus orchard:

- Citrus orchard was developed under the guidance of Citrus Council of Punjab during the year 1907. With the passage of time many plants had died accordingly 480 plants of Kinnow and Daisy were procured from PAU Fruit Research Station Jalowal, Jalandhar and planted in the citrus orchard.
- Bougain villeas around Sports complex and boundary wall of Botanical garden from university house to Administrative block.
- Beautification of university campus with different varieties of seasonal flowers procured from different sources as PAU Ludhiana, Mr. Avtar Singh of Beauscape Farms Ludhiana (Big supply of winter flower seeds free of cost) and local nurseries.
- Landscaping around Bhai Gurdas Library with the plantation of different variaties of ground covers as this area does not have full sunlight due to which flowering plants can't be grown easily.
- Enrichment of flora in the Botanical Garden continued with additional species in medicinal, fruits and other plants continued.
- Different varieties of Lilly (*Amaryllis belladonna*) have been planted in the lawns of Senate hall, Rose Park, nursery and construction wing.
- In continuity with the plantation of different species of fragrant shrubs and trees for sweet fragrance added at prominent places.
- Golden Jubilee Rose Park, a dream project conceived by the worthy Vice Chancellor Prof. (Dr.) Jaspal Singh Sandhu developed during the Golden Jubilee year with 50 named varieties of Roses matching with Golden Jubilee celebrations of the university is being maintained properly.
- The 49th Sacred Jungle developed in the campus the university with the co-operation of Baba Sewa Singh, Kar Sewa Sri Khadoor Sahib with 1800 plants is being looked after by this department.

Mechanization of landscaping department:

- An efficient grass cutting machine called Brush cutter have been added to the department for grass cutting in and around various sites which is cannot be done by shrub master.
- Grafting and budding tools for budding of roses is also added to the nursery.



Awareness agenda:

To get the residents in general and the students in particular awared about the importance of green and beautiful environment and growing of different plants for their surrounding Guru Nanak Dev University organized two Flower shows:

- ➤ Due to the Covid-19 this year Bhai Vir Singh Flower Show and Seminar could not be continued in the chain of these awareness and educational activities.
- ➤ However Spring Flower show and Rangoli was organized from 17th to 19th March 2021 where large number of educational institutes and individuals participated with full enthusiasm. This Flower show and Rangoli was inaugurated by Prof. Dr. Jaspal Singh Sandhu Vice Chancellor and prizes were distributed jointly by Prof. Dr. Avinash Kaur Nagpal Prof. Botanical Sciences and Dr. J. S. Bilga.
- ➤ This year Seminar could not be organized due to Covid 19 guidelines.

Botanical Garden:

Botanical Garden of Guru Nanak Dev University had been put under the supervision of Consultant Horticulture (2017). Department of Landscaping during the year 2018 have taken the following activities:

- New varieties of RET species, ferns, aromatic plants, medicinal plants, spices and fruit plants from different sources including many nurseries.
- To make the Botanical Garden more colorful and pleasant different varieties of seasonal flowers have been planted at different locations.
- Mulching of plants was continued for the conservation of soil and water both along with suppressing weeds and gradual addition of organic matter to the plants besides protecting the plants from extreme summer as well as winter.

Continuation of Rejuvenation of campus:

Due to poor quality of soil in the campus of Guru Nanak Dev University the growth of trees had been retarded even trees started drying up from top. Hence rejuvenation of campus soil has been continued. Accordingly large quantities of leaves shed were ploughed in the soil that made the soil fertile, aerated and improved its absorption of water. Due to this technique all the lawns have been completely regrassed and the tree tops which were drying up before have been rejuvenated resulting good growth and flowering of plants.

Maintenance works:

- ❖ Tree plantation along road starting from Boys Hostel 3 to UIT than HRDC
- Number of shrubs, ground covers, chrysanthemum and seasonal flowers are being propagated in this nursery.



- To make the campus more attractive, hanging baskets hanged throughout the campus with different varieties of plants added during 2018 have been enriched with more varieties.
- Cutting of grass and wild growth all over the campus.
- ❖ Training, pruning and trimming of plants.
- ❖ Hoeing, weeding and staking of plants whenever required.,
- Protection of plants from weather, insects, pests and disease.
- Collection of broken, dry and dead twigs.
- General cleaning of lawns & removal of dead and broken plant parts.

Next year programmes:

Following projects are earmarked for the next year 2021-22:

- ❖ Area adjoining Department of Agriculture.
- ❖ Addition of climbing roses in different areas.
- ❖ Further mechanization of landscaping department.
- ❖ Awareness and Educational agenda i.e. Flower show and Seminar.
- ❖ Additional plantation of fragrant plants to continue in the campus.
- Inventory of total plants in the campus shall be prepared systematically and proper labeling of plants in collaboration of department of Botanical and Environmental Sciences shall be done to make the campus flora educative.



NODAL OFFICERS

NATIONAL YOUTH PARLIAMENT SCHEME (NYPS)

Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs has been implementing the Youth Parliament programme since 1966 in Schools under the Directorate of Education, Government of NCT of Delhi and NDMC, Kendriya Vidyalaya, Jawahar Navodaya Vidyalayas, and Universities/ Colleges. At special function on the occasion to commemorate 70th Anniversary of adoption of the Constitution of India, - "Samvidhan Diwas", organized in the Central Hall of Parliament, the Hon'ble President Shri Ram Nath Kovind launched the Web-Portal of "National Youth Parliament Scheme".

Aims of the NYPS

- All recognized educational institutions of the country are eligible to participate in this programme.
- The registration for participation will be done by the education institutions through the webportal.
- E-training modules, videos, photographs, and scripts are available on the portal for online self-learning of the participants.
- After successful registration, the educational institutions will be able to conduct youth Parliament Sittings in their respective institutions.
- Each student taking part in the sitting will get a Digital 'Certificate of Participation' and each Teacher-In- charge and Head of Institution will get a 'Certificate of Appreciation' through the web portal.
- The programme envisages Kishore Sabha for the students of Class IX to Class XII and Tarun Sabha for the students of the Under Graduate/ Post Graduate level.
- To ensure effective implementation of the scheme, the participating institutions may invite an MP/ex- MP/ MLA/ Ex-MLA/ MLC/ Ex-MLC or a Person of eminence as the Chief Guest who would oversee the performance of the Youth Parliament sitting of the institution.
- The institutions shall upload the reports and photos/ videos of Youth Parliament conducted by them on the web portal for scrutiny and verification by the Ministry.
- If reports and photos/ videos of Youth Parliament are found to be in order after scrutiny and verification, participating students will get digital "Certificate of Participation" and teachers-in- charge / head of institutions will get digital "Certificate of Appreciation" for the programme.

Activities

In Guru Nanak Dev University the scheme was opted in year 2020 and I was assigned the duty of Nodal officer on 20 February 2020. So there is no past record for this scheme available to me. Since February 2020 due to the Covid-19 no offline physical activity was done in regard to the scheme.

- Online lecture on the working of Indian Parliament was delivered by Dr Malkiat Singh, Professor, Department of Political Science, Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar on 03 October 2020.
- Another Online lecture on recent Trends in the composition of Indian Parliament was delivered by Mr. Devender Singh, Associate Professor and Registrar, Khalsa College Amritsar on 23 January 2021.
- Now with the start of Offline mode of Teaching students are being encouraged to participate in the Scheme related future activities physically.



NATIONAL ACADEMIC DEPOSITORY

Indian Higher Education system is a large and growing system with approximately 60 school boards, 416 state universities, 124 deemed universities, 54 central universities and 364 private universities. Apart from these. there are 107 other institutions IISc/IITs/IIMs/NITs/IISERs/IIITs/NITIE and 12 other centrally funded institutions. These institutions issue academic awards to students including degrees, diplomas and certificates along with mark sheets and evaluation reports. Apart from these, institutions under various Ministries/Departments and other skill based institutions also dispense certificates, diplomas and advanced diploma. Those who are entering into employment or pursuing higher studies require a credible, authentic and convenient mechanism for access, retrieval and validation of such academic awards. Retrieval of old academic records maintained in paper form is cumbersome. Academic records maintained in paper form are susceptible to hazards such as spoilage and forgery. Students often face difficulties in obtaining copies of their certificates/mark-sheets whenever they are lost or destroyed.

Maintaining academic awards in an electronic depository would provide benefit to educational institutions, students and employers by enabling online access of academic awards which will eliminate the need for persons to approach educational institutions for obtaining transcripts of such awards or marks-sheets for verification. It would also eliminate fraudulent practices such as forging of certificates and mark-sheets, by facilitating online verifications thereof.

The National Academic Depository aims at ensuring a credible and convenient mechanism for online lodging, verification and authentication of the academic awards issued by various educational institutions. The vision of National Academic Depository (NAD) is born out of an initiative to provide an online store house of all academic awards. National Academic Depository (NAD) is a 24X7 online store house of all academic awards viz.certificates, diplomas, degrees, mark-sheets etc. duly digitised and lodged by academic institutions / boards / eligibility assessment bodies. NAD not only ensures easy access to and retrieval of an academic award but also validates and guarantees its authenticity and safe storage.

Digi Locker is a provider of NAD services and aims at 'Digital Empowerment' of citizen by providing access to authentic digital documents to citizen's digital document wallet. Maintaining academic awards in an electronic depository would provide benefit to educational institutions, students and employers by enabling online access of academic awards which will eliminate the need for persons to approach educational institutions for obtaining transcripts of such awards for verification. It would also eliminate fraudulent practices such as forging of awards, by facilitating online verification thereof and maintains the authenticity, integrity and confidentiality of the award. It aspires to make the vision of Digital Academic awards for every Indian a reality.



STUDENT UGC-GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL CELL

As per the University Grants Commission, New Delhi, Guru Nanak Dev University has established an "Online Students Grievance Redressal Cell". The Student's Grievance Cell desires to promote and maintain a conducive and unprejudiced educational environment. The objectives of Students Grievance Cell include the following:

- To support, those students who have been deprived of the services offered by the University, for which he/she is entitled.
- To make officials of the university responsive, accountable and courteous in dealing with the Students.
- To ensure effective solution to the student's grievances with an impartial and fair approach.

The Cell enables a student to express feelings by initiating and pursuing the grievance procedure in accordance with the rules and regulations. 'Student's Grievance Cell' enquires and analyses the nature and pattern of the grievances in a strictly confidential manner. Emphasis on procedural fairness has been given with a view to "the right to be heard and right to be treated without bias".

Functions:-

- Redressal of Students' Grievances to solve their academic and administrative problems.
- To co-ordinate between students and Departments / Sections to redress the grievances.
- To guide ways and means to the students to redress their problems.

In order to attend to the students' complaints, a grievance redressal cell has been set up in the university. It offers immediate and effective redressal to the problems reported by the students and work towards providing a safe and secure atmosphere for the holistic growth of the students. For this, a Nodal Officer has been appointed to monitor and respond to students' grievances. Students from the Guru Nanak Dev University can lodge complaints through "Online Students Grievance Redressal Portal" at https://www.ugc.ac.in/grievance, related to admission process, non-transparent or any unfair evaluation practices, provision of student amenities, alleged discrimination of students, etc. On receipt of complaints from aggrieved students Nodal Officer of Grievances Redressal Cell also monitor and respond to students grievances lodged on to its portal.

- To encourage students and employees of the university to come forward for the help of differently abled people for making them independent.




