



RULES FOR PROMOTION TO ASSISTANT PROFESSOR FROM STAGE 1 TO STAGE 2

For promotion to Assistant Professor from stage 1 to stage 2 i.e. with AGP Rs. 6000/- to AGP Rs. 7,000/- Minimum Academic Performance Requirements and Screening/ Selection Criteria laid down by the UGC are as follows:-

Service Requirement:-

Assistant Professor in Stage 1 and completed four years of service with Ph.D. or five years of service who are with M.Phil./PG Degree in Professional Courses such as LLM, M.Tech., M.V.Sc., M.D. or six years of service who are without Ph.D./M.Phil/PG Degree in Professional Courses.

Minimum Academic Performance Requirements and Screening/Selection Criteria:-

- (i) Minimum API scores using PBAS scoring proforma developed by the concerned university as per the norms provided in Table II(A)/II(B) of Appendix III.
- (ii) One Orientation and one Refresher/Research Methodology Course of 2/3 weeks duration.
- (iii) Screening cum Verification process for recommending promotion.

RULES FOR PROMOTION TO ASSISTANT PROFESSOR FROM STAGE 2 TO STAGE 3

For promotion to Assistant Professor from stage 2 to stage 3 i.e. Lecturer Senior Scale with AGP Rs. 7000/- to AGP Rs. 8000/- requirements laid down by the UGC are as follows:-

- 6.4.6. Assistant Professor who has completed five years of service in the second grade (stage 2) shall be eligible, subject to meeting the API based PBAS requirements laid down by these Regulations, to move up to next higher grade (stage 3).
- 6.3.4. CAS promotion from a lower grade to higher grade of Assistant Professor shall be conducted by a "Screening Cum Evaluation Committee" adhering to the criteria laid down as API score in PBAS in the Tables of Appendix III.

(i) Minimum API Scores using the PBAS scoring proforma developed by the concerned university as per the norms provided in Table II(A)/II(B) of Appendix III.

(ii) One course/ programme from among the categories of refresher courses, methodology workshops, Training, Teaching-Learning-Evaluation Technology Programmes, Soft Skills development Programmes and Faculty Development Programmes of 2/3 week duration.

(iii) Screening cum Verification process for recommending promotion.

Under CAS

Rules of Promotion as Associate Professor from stage-III to stage-IV

For promotion to Associate Professor from stage-III to stage-IV i.e. with AGP Rs.9000/-, Minimum Academic Performance Requirements and Screening/Selection Criteria laid down by the UGC are as follows:-

- 6.0.6 The process of selection of Associate Professor shall involve inviting the bio-data with duly filled performance Based Appraisal System (PBAS) proforma developed by the respective universities based on the API criteria provided in this Regulation and template separately provided. Without prejudice, to the requirements provided for selection of Associate Professor under this regulation, the prescription of Research Publications for promotion from the post of Assistant Professor to Associate Professor in Colleges shall be as follows:
 - (a) XXX
 - (b) XXX
 - (c) XXX

Provided that in so far as teachers in universities are concerned, 3 publications shall be required to be submitted for all the three categories mentioned above for consideration of promotion from Assistant Professor to Associate Professor.

Provided further that such publications shall be provided to the subject experts for assessment before the interview and the evaluation score of the publications provided by the experts shall be factored into the weightage scores while finalizing the outcome of selection by the Selection Committee.

- 6.1.0 While the API:
 - (a) Tables I and III of Appendix III are applicable to the selection of Professors/Associate Professors/Assistant Professors in universities and colleges.
- 6.2.0 The minimum norms of Selection Committees and Selection Procedures as well as API score requirements for the above cadres, either through direct recruitment or through Career Advancement Schemes Regulations, shall be similar. However, since teachers recruited directly can be from different backgrounds and institutions, Table II(c) of Appendix III provides norms for direct recruitment of teachers to different cadres, while Tables II (a) and Table II (b) provide for CAS promotions of teachers in universities and colleges respectively, which accommodate these differences.
- 6.4.7 Assistant Professors completing three years of teaching in third grade (Stage 3) shall be eligible, subject to the qualifying conditions and the API based PBAS requirements prescribed by these Regulations, to move to the next higher grade (Stage-IV) and to be designated as Associate Professor.

- (i) Minimum API scores using the PBAS scoring proforma developed by the concerned University as per the norms provided in Table II (A)/II(B) of Appendix III.
- (ii) At least three publications in the entire period as Assistant Professor (12 Years).
- (iii) One course/program from among the categories of methodology workshops, training, teaching-learning-evaluation technology programmes, soft skills development programmes and faculty development programmes of minimum one week duration.
- (iv) A selection committee process as stipulated in this regulations and in Tables II(A) and II(B) of Appendix III.

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Under CAS

Rules of Promotion as Professor from stage-IVto stage-V

For promotion to Professor from stage 4 to stage 5 i.e. with AGP Rs.9000/- to AGP Rs. 10,000/- Minimum Academic Performance Requirements and Screening/ Selection Criteria laid down by the UGC are as follows:-

6.0.7 The process of selection of Professor shall involve inviting the bio-data with duly filled performance Based Appraisal System (PBAS) proforma developed by the respective universities based on the API criteria based PBAS set out in this Regulation and reprints of five major publications of the candidates.

Provided that such publications submitted by the candidate shall have been published subsequent to the period from which the teacher was placed in the Assistant Professor stage-II.

Provided further that such publication shall be provided to the subject experts for assessment before the interview and the evaluation of the publications by the experts shall be factored into the weightage scores while finalizing the outcome of selection.

- Associate Professor completing three years of service in stage 4 and possessing a Ph.D. Degree in the relevant discipline shall be eligible to be appointed and designated as Professor and be placed in the next higher grade (stage 5), subject to (a) satisfying the required credit points as per API based PBAS methodology provided in Table I-III of Appendix IV stipulated in these Regulations, and (b) an assessment by a duly constituted selection committee as suggested for the direct recruitment of Professor. *Provided* that no teacher, other than those with a Ph.D., shall be promoted or appointed as Professor.
 - (i) Minimum yearly/cumulative API scores using the PBAS scoring proforma developed by the concerned university as per the norms provided in Table II(A)/II(B) of Appendix III. Teachers may combine two assessment periods (in stages 2 and 3 to achieve minimum API scores, if required.
 - (ii) A minimum of **five publications** since the per lod that the teacher is placed in Stage 3.
 - (iii) A selection committee process as stipulated in the regulation and in Tables II(A) and II(B) of Appendix III.

Associate Professor with three years of completed service in Stage 4.

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Guidelines for appointment to the post of Assistant Professor in the University/ College

University Grants Commission in its notification "UGC Regulation on Minimum Qualifications for Appointment of Teachers and Other Academic Staff in Universities and Colleges and Measures for the Maintenance of Standards in Higher Education" of 2010 has given a broad structure to be followed for shortlisting/ appointment of candidates to the post of Assistant Professor under the University System (in University and colleges) in Appendix III Table II-C as under:

c) Interview Performance (20%)

Interview before Selection Committee: maximum 20 marks

All the application received shall be scrutinized by a Screening Committee and a list of all the candidates fulfilling the minimum eligibility qualifications shall be prepared and points be awarded to all such candidates shall be calculated on the basis of the above criteria.

- After allocation of points to all the eligible candidates, the Screening Committee will draw a
 list of all candidates indicating the points scored by them in descending order i.e. starting
 from the candidate getting the highest points(Minus the category b(II) and c).
- In case of tie in the points of two or more candidates, the candidates having the higher/ highest marks at the Master's level shall be ranked above the other (s).
- 3. For each first vacancy 6 candidates will be called for interview and assessment of Domain Knowledge according to Merit and 3 candidates for every additional vacancy. In case the required number of application are not received then the minimum number of applicants to be invited for interview shall be decided by the Vice- Chancellor.
- The Points awarded to the candidates during the process of screening of applications shall be used for selection process and in interview by the Selection Committee.
- The Period taken by candidates to acquire Ph.D shall not be considered as teaching/research experience to be claimed for shortlisting /appointment.
- 6. The University shall display the criteria for shortlisting/screening of applications on its website.
- 7. In case of any dispute with regard to screening of applications, the decision of the University shall be final.

Standard Operating Procedure to be followed for appointment of Assistant Professors on regular/contract basis at the University Campus and its Regional Campuses

- 1.Online applications on the prescribed format shall be invited from the eligible candidates for various posts of Assistant Professors through an open advertisement to be published in the newspapers as well as posted on the University website (www.gndu.ac.in/Advertisement).
- 2.The applicants will be required to fill up the Score Card Proforma duly approved by the Syndicate, available at www.gndu.ac.in/Advertisement.
- 3. After receipt of applications, scrutiny of applications shall be done by the Board of Control of the concerned department to check the documents as well as eligibility of the applicants.
- 4. The Board of Control will verify the marks claimed by the applicant in the Score Card and prepare a merit list based on the Score Card.
- 5. Board of Control shall also send recommendation to invite 6 candidates for each first vacancy and 3 candidates for every additional vacancy (as approved by the Syndicate) for the interview from the merit list.
- 6. The assessment of the domain knowledge of the shortlisted applicants (for 20 marks) will be done by subject experts in a simulated class room set up.
- 7. The constitution of the Selection Committee shall be as per UGC Regulations 2010 under Clause 5.0.0 and sub clause 5.1.1 for appointments on regular basis and Clause 13.0 & sub clause 13.1 for appointments on contract basis. At least four members, including two outside subject experts shall constitute the quorum.
- 8. The final Selection of the candidates will be made by the Selection Committee considering the following parameters:
 - a) Academic Record and Research Performance 50 marks

b) Teaching Experience - 10 marks

c) Assessment of domain knowledge - 20 marks

d) Interview - 20 marks

- The applicants will be required to fill up the Score Card Proforma duly approved by the Syndicate, available at www.gndu.ac.in/Advertisement.
- After receipt of applications, scrutiny of applications shall be done by the Board of Control of the concerned department to check the documents as well as eligibility of the applicants.
- The Board of Control will verify the marks claimed by the applicant in the Score Card and prepare a merit list based on the Score Card.
- 5. Board of Control shall also send recommendation to invite 6 candidates for each first vacancy and 3 candidates for every additional vacancy (as approved by the Syndicate) for the interview from the merit list.
- 6. For each first vacancy 6 candidates will be called for interview and assessment of Domain Knowledge according to Merit and 3 candidates for every additional vacancy. In case the required number of applications are not received then the minimum number of applicants to be invited for interview shall be decided by the Vice- Chancellor.

UNIVERSITY GRANTS COMMISSION ON MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS FOR APPOINTMENT OF TEACHERS AND OTHER ACADEMIC STAFF IN UNIVERSITIES AND COLLEGES AND MEASURES FOR THE MAINTENANCE OF STANDARDS IN HIGHER EDUCATION) (3RD AMENDMENT), REGULATIONS, 2016.

No.F.1-2/2016 (PS/Amendment).—In exercise of the powers conferred under clause (e) and (g) of sub-section (1) of Section 26 of University Grants Commission Act, 1956 (3 of 1956), the University Grants Commission hereby frames the following Regulations to amend the University Grants Commission on minimum qualifications for appointment of teachers and other academic staff in universities and colleges and measures for the maintenance of standards in higher education, Regulations, 2010, namely:

2. Short title, application and commencement:

- 2.1 These Regulations may be called the University Grants Commission on minimum qualifications for appointment of teachers and other academic staff in universities and colleges and measures for the maintenance of standards in higher education (3rd Amendment), Regulations, 2016.
- 2.2 They shall apply to every University established or incorporated by or under a Central Act, Provincial Act or a State Act, every institution including a constituent or an affiliated college recognized by the Commission, in consultation with the university concerned under Clause (f) of Section 2 of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956 and every institution deemed to be a university under Section 3 of the said Act.
- 2.3 They shall come into force with immediate effect.
- 3. In the University Grants Commission on minimum qualifications for appointment of teachers and other academic staff in universities and colleges and measures for the maintenance of standards in higher Education. Regulations, 2010 (Principal Regulation 2010) the following amendments are made: -

Existing provisions of the following clauses of the Principal UGC Regulations 2010

3.0.0. Recruitment and Qualifications

3.1.0 The direct recruitment to the posts of Assistant Professors, Associate Professors and Professors in the Universities and Colleges shall be on the basis of merit through all India advertisement and selections by the duly constituted Selection Committees as per the provisions made under these Regulations to be incorporated under the Statutes/Ordinances of the concerned university. The composition of such committees should be as prescribed by the UGC in these Regulations.

3.2.0 The minimum qualifications required for the post of Assistant Professors, Associate Professors, Professors, Principals, Assistant Directors of Physical Education and Sports, Deputy Directors of Physical Education and Sports, Directors of Physical Education and Sports, Directors of Physical Education and Sports, Assistant Librarians, Deputy Librarians, Librarians will be those as prescribed by the UGC in these Regulations.

3.3.0 The minimum requirements of a good academic record, 55% marks (or an equivalent grade in a point scale wherever grading system is followed) at the master's level and qualifying in the National Eligibility Test (NET), or an accredited test (State Level Eligibility Test - SLET/SET), shall remain for the appointment of Assistant Professors.

3.3.1. NET/SLET/SET shall remain the minimum eligibility condition for recruitment and appointment of Assistant Professors in Universities / Colleges / Institutions:

Provided however, that candidates, who are or have been awarded a Ph. D. Degree in accordance with the University Grants Commission (Minimum Standards and Procedure for Award of Ph.D. Degree) Regulations, 2009, shall be exempted from the requirement of the minimum eligibility condition of NET/SLET/SET for recruitment and appointment of Assistant Professor or equivalent positions in Universities / Colleges / Institutions.

Amendments made in the following clauses of Principal UGC Regulations 2010

3.0.0. Recruitment and Qualifications

3.1.0 The direct recruitment to the posts of Assistant Professors. Associate Professors and Professors in the Universities and Colleges shall be on the basis of ment through all India advertisement and selections by the duly constituted Selection Committees as per the provisions made under these Regulations to be incorporated under the Statutes/Ordinances of the concerned university. The composition of such committees should be as prescribed by the UGC in these Regulations.

3.2.0 The minimum qualifications required for the post of Assistant Professors, Associate Professors, Professors, Principals, Assistant Directors of Physical Education and Sports, Deputy Directors of Physical Education and Sports, Directors of Physical Education and Sports, Assistant Librarians, Deputy Librarians, Librarians will be those as prescribed by the UGC in these Regulations.

3.3.1. NET/SLET/SET shall remain the minimum eligibility condition for recruitment and appointment of Assistant Professors in Universities/Colleges/Institutions

Provided however, that candidates, who are or have been awarded a Ph. D. Degree in accordance with the University Grants Commission (Minimum Standards and Procedure for Award of Ph.D. Degree) Regulations, 2009 or the subsequent Regulations if notified by the UGC, shall be exempted from the requirement of the minimum eligibility condition of NET/SLET/SET for recruitment and appointment of Assistant Professor or equivalent positions in Universities / Colleges / Institutions.

Further, the award of degrees to candidates registered for the M.Phil/Ph.D programme prior to July 11, 2009, shall be governed by the provisions of the then existing Ordinances/ By laws/ Regulations of the Institution awarding the degrees and the Ph.D candidates shall be exempted from the requirement of the minimum eligibility condition of "NET/SLET/SET for recruitment and appointment of Assistant Professor or equivalent positions in Universities / Colleges / Institutions subject to the fulfillment of the following conditions: -

- (a) Ph.D. degree of the candidate awarded in regular mode only;
- (b) Evaluation of the Ph.D. thesis by at least two external examiners;
- (c) Candidate had published two research papers out of which at least one in a refereed journal from out of his/her Ph.D. work;
- (d) The candidate had presented two papers in seminars/conferences from out of his/her Ph.D. work;
- (e) Open Ph.D. viva-voce of the candidate had been conducted.
- (a) to (e) as above are to be certified by the Vice-

- 3.3.2 NET/SLET/SET shall not be required for such Masters Degree Programmes in disciplines for which NET/SLET/SET accredited test is not conducted.
- 3.4.0 A minimum of 55% marks (or an equivalent grade in a point scale wherever grading system is followed) will be required at the Master's level for those recruited as teachers at any level from industries and research institutions and at the entry level of Assistant Professors, Assistant Librarians, Assistant Directors of Physical Education and Sports.
- 3.4.1 A relaxation of 5% may be provided at the graduate and master's level for the Scheduled

Caste/Scheduled Tribe /Differently-abled (Physically and visually differently-abled)

categories for the purpose of eligibility and for assessing good academic record during direct recruitment to teaching positions. All universities / colleges will set up verifiable systems for the API related information required in these tables within THREE months of notification of these regulations. They will have to be documented and collated annually by the Internal Quality Assessment cells (IQACs) of the universities / colleges for follow up by the universities / college authorities. In order to facilitate this process, all teachers shall submit the duly filled-in Performance Based Appraisal System (PBAS) proforma to the IQAC annually

However, in order to remedy the difficulties of collecting retrospective information and to facilitate the implementation of these regulations from 31-12-2008 in the CAS Promotion, the API based PBAS will be

progressively and prospectively rolled out.

Accordingly, the PBAS based on the API scores of categories I and II as mentioned in these tables is to be implemented for one year, initially based on the existing systems in universities / colleges for one year 3. only with the minimum average scores as depicted in Table II (a) and II (b) in rows I to III. This annualized API scores can then be compounded progressively as and when the teacher becomes eligible for CAS promotion to the next cadre. Thus, if a teacher is considered for CAS promotion in 2010, one year API scores for 2009-10 alone will be required for assessment. In case of a teacher being considered for CAS promotion in 2011, two years average of API scores for these categories will be required for assessment and so on leading progressively for the complete assessment period.

As shown in Table II, the aggregate minimum API score required (given in row III) can be earned from any of the two broad categories, subject to the minimum prescribed in each category. This will provide for 4 due weightage to teachers who contribute additionally through any of the components given in Categories

I and II also for the differing nature of contributions possible in different institutional settings

For Category III (research and academic contributions), maintenance of past record is done on a normal basis by teachers and hence no difficulty is envisaged in applying the API scores for this category for the 5 entire assessment period. In this category, an aggregate minimum score is required for promotion over each stage. Alternatively, a teacher should acquire the required minimum aggregate score over two previous stages, taken together. In the case of promotion to Professor, the publication requirement shall be met over the two previous stages.

Candidates should offer themselves for assessment for promotion, if they fulfill the minimum API scores 6. indicated in Tables I and II, by submitting an application and the required proforma. They can do so three months before the due date if they consider themselves eligible. Candidates who do not consider

themselves eligible, can also apply at a later date.

If however, on final assessment, candidates do not either fulfill the minimum criteria under Rows III and IV 7 of Tables II(A) and II (B) or obtain less than 50% in the expert assessment, they will be reassessed only after a minimum period of one year.

(a) If a candidate applies for promotion on completion of the minimum eligibility period and is successful, 8. the date of promotion will be deemed to be the minimum period of eligibility.

(b) If however, the candidate finds that she / he fulfills the eligibility conditions at a late date and applies on that date and is successful, her / his promotion will be deemed to be from that date of application

(c) If the candidate does not succeed in the first assessment, but succeeds in an eventual assessment, her / his promotion will be deemed to be from the later date.
